## BODY OF A CHILD FOUND IN ELIZABETH STREET, RICHMOND.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

# TRANSFER OF EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE TO THE UNIVERSITY.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations, viz.:-

Subject to the regulations hereinafter specified the examination for Matriculation in the University of Melbourne, and the examination therein in Geometry and Trigonometry and in Geology hereinafter mentioned shall be the examination for admission to the ordinary and professional branches of the Service, and the Examiners of the University at such examinations shall be Members of the Board of Examiners within the meaning of the Act No. 160.

Candidates for admission to the ordinary division of the Civil Service must at one and the same examination pass in four at least of the subjects prescribed for the Matriculation Examination of the University, of which subjects English and Arithmetic must be two.

Candidates for admission to the professional division or into those Departments of the ordinary division which require special qualifications must pass the examination herebefore required for candidates for admission to the ordinary division, and in addition thereto, but not necessarily at the same time, must also pass the following examination:-

For the Departments of Lands and Survey and Public Works, the examinations in Geometry and Trigonometry and in Geology prescribed by the University for the 1st and 2nd year respectively of the course for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, and in Geometrical and Free-hand Drawing.

For the Department of the Law Officers of the Crown, as at present, viz.:-

### SEAMEN PROHIBITED FROM CARRYING ABOUT THEM, ON SHORE, KNIVES OR OTHER OFFENSIVE WEAPONS.

THE practice of late adopted by seamen of carrying about their persons, when on shore, sheath knives, being dangerous to the lives of the inhabitants, and in direct contravention of *The Police Offences Statute* (28 Vic. No. 265, sec. 5, cl. 23), which attaches a penalty of Twenty pounds on every person who may be found carrying any firearm, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or place: Commanders and officers of vessels are requested to warn seamen accordingly, and to use their utmost endeavors to prevent their crews from appearing on shore so armed, and thereby incurring the penalty imposed by the above-recited Act.

## DISTRIBUTION OF PLANTS, ETC., FROM THE MELBOURNE BOTANIC GARDENS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined regulations in reference to the distribution of plants, cuttings, and seeds from the Botanic Gardens of Melbourne (in lieu of the regulations of 29th September 1862), viz.:-

1. Government departments may be supplied with any plants, cuttings, seeds (fruit trees excepted), as far as such can be made conveniently available without undue abstraction of labor from the general establishment.

2. For the gardens or reserves of public institutions, plants, cuttings, and seeds shall be supplied as far as they are conveniently available, but exclusive of avenue trees or fruit trees.

3. Donors to the Botanic Garden, may, on their special request, be supplied in a proportion not exceeding the approximate value of their contribution, with plants, cuttings, seeds, or cut flowers, but cannot obtain plants of the ordinary kinds of florists' flowers, or pines, avenue and fruit trees, from the garden.

4. Cut flowers may be supplied for benevolent or artistic purposes, or for public festivals to a moderate extent.

5. Plants needed in a fresh state may, when available, be supplied for medicinal purposes.

6. Plants or seeds of any species promising to be of extensive utility to the colony, may, when available, be distributed in small quantities to private gardens, without restrictions, provided such plants or seeds are not readily available in the trade.

7. Plants, seeds, or cuttings may be interchanged with public or private gardens in the colony or elsewhere.

## TIMOR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE TIMOR PUBLIC CEMETERY.

A. I. charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the secretary to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given to the secretary on the day previous thereto between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five p.m., and the name, age, and late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor or other officer appointed by the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The funeral procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the interment.

7. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. from the 1st of September to the 30th April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument, or tablet, proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the said Statute to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

11. Wooden fences allowed; subject to the approval of the trustees, and which, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

12. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty in behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, will be kept at the office, and may be inspected there; and registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against according to law.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
