The tower is an open-framed structure of timber, 73 feet in height from the base to the top of the lantern, and is painted in alternate bands of red and white.

The light is elevated about 155 feet from the sea-level, and may be seen in clear weather at a distance of 19 nautic miles, allowing 15 feet for the height of the observer's eye.

It is a revolving white light, of the second order dioptric, attaining its greatest brilliancy once a minute, and will be seen all round from seaward between the magnetic bearings of N. ½ W. and E. by N. ½ N.
