NOTICE TO INTENDING CANDIDATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY UNDER THE "SHIRES STATUTE" AND "BOROUGH STATUTE."

AN Examination of candidates for Certificates of Competency as Engineers and Surveyors of land and of works will be held at the Offices of Crown Lands and Survey, La Trobe street west, at Ten o'clock on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the 8th, 9th, and 10th days of November next.

Candidates are requested to be in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day.

All intending candidates must forward to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, at the Offices of Roads and Bridges, 145 Collins street east, notice in writing of such intention on or before the 20th day of October next, giving address and *name in full*, and at the same time enclosing articles of indenture and any certificates they may possess from a *properly constituted body of examiners*.

No person will be admitted for examination unless he has previously given notice in writing.

Candidates are requested to provide themselves with drawing instruments and scale.

The Board issue two classes of certificate, A and B, both of which qualify for an appointment, but a first-class certificate (A) is evidence that the grantee has passed with credit.

Successful candidates will be required to pay to the secretary the sum of one guinea on issue of certificate, to be paid by him into the consolidated revenue.

THE CITY OF BALLAARAT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be and be called such town or city accordingly: Provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that from and after every such proclamation the borough so proclaimed a town or city as aforesaid shall take and bear the name of the "Town of" (mentioning the name assigned to such town) or "City of" (mentioning the name assigned to such city); the

council of such borough and the members of the said council shall take and bear the name of the council and councillors respectively of such town or city; the mayor and clerk of the said borough shall thenceforth respectively be called the mayor and clerk of the said town or city respectively; and the burgesses of such borough shall thenceforward be known and called the burgesses of such town or citizens of such city; the wards (if any) of the said borough existing at the time of such proclamation shall be and be called wards of the said town or city; and the borough fund of the borough shall be called the town fund or city fund of the said town or city; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly; provided that all acts and things done or had and all penalties and forfeitures actually incurred or imposed, and all sums of money due or payable under this (or any other Act whatsoever) at the time of the proclamation of such town or city shall be of the same force and effect and be recovered and paid and go in like manner to all intents and purposes as if such proclamation had not taken place: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Ballaarat for the preceding year was not less than Twenty thousand pounds; And whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date herewith it was determined to proclaim the said Borough to be a City: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim the Borough of Ballaarat to be a City within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and to be designated by the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say,

THE CITY OF BALLAARAT.

COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time

re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed: and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE CARISHBOOK FARMERS' COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 31, parish of Carishbrook; thence by the existing common bearing west about one hundred and fourteen chains, and south about twenty-eight chains, to the north boundary of the Maryborough gold-field common; thence by that common bearing west about sixty chains, to the Four-mile Creek; thence by that creek downwards to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 31 aforesaid; thence to the said angle of that allotment; and thence by the west boundary thereof, bearing south to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(69. V. 20698.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, this fifth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

ALEXANDRA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ALEXANDRA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charge, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, and for the sole use of such person and his or their representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate in the form of Schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.
4. Orders for interments to be given at the office of the trustees on the day previous, between Ten o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but persons requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the trustees or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Hours of interment from Ten a.m. till Five p.m., except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owner. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.
9. Any person wantonly destroying, defacing, doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is by the statute guilty of a misdemeanor.
10. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had, gratuitously, on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to be

come bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government, in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
