W HEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the Governor dazette diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time

reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do heroby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE ALEXANDRA PUBLIC Семетвву.

CEMETERY.

A LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charge, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tembstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate in the form of Schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for internents to be given at the office of the trustees on the day previous, between Ten o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m.

4. Orders for interments to be given at the office of the trustees on the day previous, between Ten o'clock a.m. and Four o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but persons requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the trustees or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person, in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other ovidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Hours of interment from Ten a.m. till Five p.m., except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owner. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.

9. Any person wantouly destroying, defacing, doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is by the statute guilty of a misdemeanor.

10. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules.
