## DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough hereinafter mentioned as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine, that is to say:-

## ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation, published in the *Government Gazette*, may, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs; and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and from time to time in like manner may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an additional Port and Harbor Regulation and to be observed accordingly:-

## RULE No. 34A.

Until further notice, no vessel, lighter, or boat shall anchor within a line drawn from the western extremity of the Railway Pier, Williamstown, to the outer extremity of the Government Patent Slip Jetty. Lighters employed in the conveyance of cargo or ballast to or from ships moored alongside the Railway Pier shall proceed direct to the ship, and immediately the work is completed shall remove to outside of the limits above named.

This rule does not apply to vessels moored alongside the Railway Pier.

## COMMON INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed: and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

The portion of the Glenlyon, Holecombe, and Wombat Farmers' Common lying within the shire of Glenlyon which was severed from the portion thereof within the Franklin and Yandoit Road District, proclaimed a separate common pursuant to Order of the 31st day of July 1865, and increased by Order of the 23rd day of September 1867, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised

within the two areas the respective boundaries of which are hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the intersection of the Wallaby Creek by the south boundary of the parish of Glenlyon; thence by that creek upwards to the north boundary of allotment 5 of section 18, parish of Wombat; thence by that allotment and allotment 6 bearing east eleven chains fifty links, more or less, and south eighty chains forty-eight links; thence by a line bearing east one hundred and thirty chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing north one hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to Kangaroo Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the south boundary of the parish of Glenlyon aforesaid; and thence by that boundary bearing west two miles, more or less, to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 2300 acres.

Commencing at the intersection of the Loddon river by the east boundary of the parish of Glenlyon; thence by that boundary bearing north two miles and a half, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 6 of section 1A, parish of Burke; thence by a road bearing east seventy-two chains; thence by a road bearing north twenty chains to the south-west angle of allotment 8 of section 1B; thence by allotments 8 and 7 bearing east seventy-one chains; thence by a road and a line bearing south two hundred and twenty-seven chains, more or less, to the southern side of a road; thence by that road bearing easterly ten chains, more or less, to the west boundary of lands licensed under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*; thence by those lands to the south-west angle of the land licensed to John Mitchell; thence by a line bearing south to the Loddon river aforesaid; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 4300 acres.—(70.Y.17597.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1860* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—

No. 358, § 15, 16) it is amongst other things enacted that if any shire and any borough shall adjoin each other and form, together with any highway, creek, or stream, which shall be the common boundary, one continuous area, or if any borough shall be surrounded by any such shire and such common boundary and form with such shire such continuous area, and if an annual or general election or first appointment of councillors shall have taken place in and for such shire under the Act numbered one hundred and seventy-six hereby repealed or this Act, and in and for such borough under *The Municipal Corporations Act* 1863, or under the *Boroughs Statute*, and if the council of such shire and the council of such borough shall by petitions under their several common seals pray the Governor that such shire and such borough with such area may be formed into one shire under this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor to constitute the same with such area one shire, by such name as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to such shire, and such shires shall be a united shire to all intents and purposes. In every case in which any borough shall have been united with any shire the Governor may direct that all the powers relating to matters not herein otherwise provided for shall be vested in the council of the united shire, and all such powers shall thereupon be read and take effect accordingly; and it is also enacted that upon every union of shires or of a shire and borough, or of road districts into a shire, if in the case of such first-mentioned union either or any of the several shires so united shall be a single shire, and in the case of the union of a shire and borough if such shire shall before then have been by the Governor divided into ridings or such borough shall before then have been divided into wards, and in the case of the union of road districts into a shire if any of such road districts shall before then have been divided into subdivisions such division shall be void, and (unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the Governor) each of the several shires so united which shall be a single shire and each riding of any such shire previously having been a united shire and in the case of the union of a shire and borough or road districts into a shire such borough and every such road district shall become and be by the name theretofore borne by the same respectively a riding of the shire formed by such first-mentioned union:

the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to constitute such district or any portion thereof a borough, by such name as in and by such Order in Council shall be assigned to the same; and it is also enacted that in every such Order in Council whereby any borough shall be constituted the name and boundaries of the borough shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a borough within the meaning of this Act; but no such borough shall be constituted so as to comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the constitution thereof: And whereas notice of the petition praying the Governor to constitute a borough in the district known by the name of Koroit, in the shire of Belfast, has been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-third section of the said Act, and no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district, has been presented to the Governor praying His Excellency not to grant the prayer of the above-mentioned petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the part of the colony of Victoria, wherein the petitioners are inhabitant householders, to be a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and doth hereby set forth the name and the boundaries of such borough in manner following that is to say:—

the net annual value of all rateable property under the jurisdiction of such shire or borough respectively; provided also that the powers conferred upon the Governor by this section shall be exercised upon the petition of the ratepayers of the shire, borough, or district affected thereby, in the same manner as is hereinafter provided in the case of the constitution of shires; and it is also enacted that upon every union of shires, or of a shire and borough, or of road districts into a shire, if in the case of such first-mentioned union either or any of the several shires so united shall be a single shire, and in the case of the union of a shire and borough if such shire shall before then have been by the Governor divided into ridings or such borough shall before then have been divided into wards, and in the case of the union of road districts into a shire if any of such road districts shall before then have been divided into subdivisions, such division shall be void, and (unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the Governor) each of the several shires so united which shall be a single shire, and each riding of any such shire previously having been a united shire, and in the case of the union of a shire and borough or road districts into a shire such borough and every such road district shall become and be by the name theretofore borne by the same respectively a riding of the shire formed by such first-mentioned union: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-first day of July 1854, the Epping Road District was constituted; and by another Proclamation bearing date the eleventh day of April 1864 the boundaries thereof were altered and defined, and the same district was by Order in Council made on the eleventh day of December 1865 divided into three separate electoral subdivisions: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the first day of September 1862, the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District was constituted; and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of August 1863 the boundaries thereof were altered and defined, and the same district was by Order in Council made on the nineteenth day of April 1869 divided into three separate electoral subdivisions: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of December 1857, the Woodstock Road District was constituted: And whereas the yearly income of rates derivable to the shire hereby constituted by union are not less than One thousand pounds sterling based upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable property under the jurisdiction of such shire: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon petitions of the ratepayers of the said respective Road Districts affected thereby in the same manner as is provided in the tenth section of the said Act, and notices of such petitions have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counterpetitions have been presented to the Governor praying him not to grant the prayer of the petitions above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order unite the three road districts respectively designated the Epping Road District, the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District, and the Woodstock Road District, into a Shire, and doth hereby constitute the same to be a Shire within the meaning of the said Act, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of such Shire in manner following, that is to say:—

\* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 180,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1'70 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths in August 1870 exceeded those in the same month of any of the previous ten years. They also exceeded by 59 an average extending over the whole period.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 65'8 on the 25th, and the lowest was 35'01 on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (48'9°) was 8° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23'1°) took place on the 22nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 61'0° to a minimum of 37'9°. The least range (10'1°) was on the 14th, viz.:—from a maximum of 56'9° to a minimum of 46'8°. The mean daily range was 16'82°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'793 inches) was nearly a quarter of an inch below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the total mortality. Children who had not attained their fifth year contributed 41 per cent. to the mortality against 35 per cent. in August 1869, 43 per cent. in August 1868, 39 per cent. in August 1867, 44 per cent. in August 1866, 40 per cent. in August 1865, 34 per cent. in August 1864, 33 per cent. in August 1863, 43 per cent. in August 1862, 49 per cent. in August 1861, and 49 per cent. in August 1860.

Eleven persons over 75 years of age died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 76, a male aged 80, and a male aged 84 of bronchitis, a female aged 76, a female aged 80, a male aged 82, and a female aged 86 of old age, a male aged 79 of diarrhoea, a male aged 79, and a male aged 82 of heart disease.

Thirteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A male aged 33 died of injuries to the head caused by a horse falling on him; a plasterer aged 43 of a fall from a drey; a gardener aged 50 of a kick from a horse; a seaman aged 18 of sunstroke; a farmer aged 33 of accidental poisoning with morphia; a schoolboy aged 9 of drowning in the Saltwater River; and a clerk aged 27 of drowning in Hobson's Bay; a female aged 4 months was suffocated by bed-clothes; a female infant aged only a few minutes was murdered; a reporter aged 39 poisoned himself with arsenic whilst in a state of insanity through drink; a woodcarter aged 54 drowned himself whilst in the same condition; a fisherman aged 30, and a laborer aged 33 were hanged judicially.

Sixty-five deaths, or nearly 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Industrial Schools, and 3 in the Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 127, of which 65, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 62, or 49 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 86 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three years, 8 were between three and four years, and 2 were between four and five years.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 181, of which 101, or 56 per cent., were males, and 80, or 44 per cent., were females; 3 were between five and ten, 4 between ten and fifteen, 6 between fifteen and twenty, 7 between twenty and twenty-five, 18 between twenty-five and thirty, 25 between thirty and thirty-five, 14 between thirty-five and forty, 23 between forty and forty-five, 14 between forty-five and fifty, 14 between fifty and fifty-five, 15 between fifty-five and sixty, 9 between sixty and sixty-five, 9 between sixty-five and seventy, 4 between seventy and seventy-five, 4 between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 eighty and upwards.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them on application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.
