ADDITIONAL RULE OF THE PILOT BOARD.

64. Victorian Pilots are not to pilot ships of war of either France or Prussia in Victorian waters, except within three (3) miles of the shore; or do more than pilot such ships into or out of Victorian ports or roadsteads when they are not at the time engaged in any hostile operations, but such ships of war in distress may always be piloted out of immediate danger.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Alteration in color of Port Albert Light.

REFERRING to a Notice to Mariners dated the 1st of September 1869, published in the *Government Gazette*, No. 141, page 1864 of 1869, it is hereby notified, that on and after the first day of April next, the red shades will be removed and a white light shown from the lighthouse instead.

The light will, as heretofore, be fixed and flashing, showing a bright flash every three minutes at an average range of eleven miles. There will be a steady white light for the space of one minute and forty seconds, which will be suddenly eclipsed for twelve seconds and be again eclipsed for thirty-four seconds, when the steady light will re-appear.

Within three miles of the light the eclipses will be scarcely observable, a continued fixed light being at that distance visible between the intervals of the bright flashes.

SIR.—I have the honor to bring to the knowledge of Your Excellency, that Captain J. Farquhar, of the British barque *Loch Awe*, reported to me the discovery of a hitherto unknown reef or rock in the Great North-east Channel of Torres Straits, from the fact of his having seen lying stranded thereon, on his passage through same, the North German schooner *Honolulu*, in an abandoned state, on 20th July last; in corroboration of which I beg to enclose a copy of an extract of the *Loch Awe's* log book.

From want of time, said master was prevented from taking the bearings or to gain a more correct knowledge of said reef.

Extract from the Log of the barque "*Loch Awe*," of London, J. Farquhar, master, from Newcastle, N. S. W., towards Batavia, via Torres Straits, July 1870.

"Wednesday, 20th. At 1 p.m. passed the North German three-masted schooner *Honolulu*, which sailed from Newcastle, coal laden (destination unknown), on Monday, June 27th, stranded on an unknown rock or reef in the fairway of the Great North-east Channel of Torres Straits. Position of wreck, taken by cross-bearings when passing, was east north-east from Saddle Island, and north-east $\frac{1}{2}$ north from the Ninepin Rock. Wreck was lying with her head to the southward, with port bulwarks under water, jibs still up and flying to pieces, topsail lowered down, foresail and topgallantsail apparently the same as when ship struck, mainsail had been unbent, mizzen sail partly lowered down and blowing to pieces, the greater portion of star-board bulwarks and stanchions torn off, and deck and house had been rummaged evidently by the natives although none were seen near the wreck. No boats or any signs of the crew or any of them were seen near the wreck or on shore, although a strict lookout was kept upon the shore; but no signals of distress was visible from any of the islands passed on the following day.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable **JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY**, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and **BARON BOTTSFORD**, of Botesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

CLEAN DISTRICT UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portion of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be a Clean District within the meaning of the said Act.

This Order is to take effect from and after the tenth day of October in the present year.

BOUNDARIES OF A CLEAN DISTRICT IN THE WEST WIMMERA DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point at which the boundary line between the Colonies of Victoria and South Australia joins the River Murray; thence south along such boundary line to the point where it meets the south-western extremity of the Doorodong Creek run; thence along the southern boundary of the Doorodong Creek run; thence along the western boundary of the Roseneath run; thence along the western and southern boundaries of the Nangeela run; thence along the western boundary of the Retreat run; thence along the course of the Glenelg River downwards to its junction to the Wannon River; thence up the north bank of the Wannon River to the south-eastern boundary of the Winninburn run; thence along the western and northern and eastern boundaries of the Murrudal run to the Wannon River; thence along the northern bank of that river to the southern extremity of the Moralla run; thence along the eastern boundary of that run; thence along the eastern boundary of the Hyde Park run; thence along the southern and eastern bound-

aries of the Glendinning run to the Glenelg River; thence along the north bank of the Glenelg River to the south-west point of the Brim Spring run; thence along the western and northern boundaries of that run; thence southerly along the boundary of Rose Brook run; thence north-easterly along the boundaries of that run to the boundary of Ledcourt and Newington run, thence easterly along the southern boundary of that run; thence along the southern boundary of the Glenwyllyn run; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the said run; thence along the southern boundaries of the Bolan-gum, Tottington, and Rams Bottom runs; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned run to the south-western boundary of the Strathfillan run; thence along the southern boundary of the Strathfillan run to where it meets the boundary of the Moyreisk run; thence along the south-western and southern boundaries of that run to the Avoca River; thence down that river to the southern boundary of Bael-bael Station; thence easterly to the southern boundary of Reedy Lake station; thence easterly along the southern boundary of that station; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of the Reedy Lake station to the eastern boundary of the Murrabit station; and along the north-eastern boundaries of that station to the Murray; thence down that river to the South Australian border the starting point: Provided always, that when the course of the Avoca River as above described intersects any station, such station shall be wholly and not in part excluded from the above declared clean district; and that the run known as Narraport be also excluded from such district.

SANDY CREEK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Sandy Creek Cemetery for the management thereof.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the consent of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever from the date of such permission being given.
3. Application for such permission to be made to the said trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule hereunder written, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.
4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, justice of the peace, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the said trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. The said trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct the same, under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The time fixed for the funeral is to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Nine a.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.
10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who shall determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, or character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
11. The plan of all the fences to be submitted to the said trustees.
12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the said trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
13. The ground will be opened daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the secretary's office and at the cemetery.
15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy or attempt to destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, shall, on conviction, before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum as a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds.
16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.
17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery, or will smoking be permitted.
18. The certificate form in schedule A to be signed by the chairman of the trustees and countersigned by the secretary.
19. Any person, upon giving an order for interment, shall answer the questions contained in schedule B.

CONDITIONS.

1. The house coal is to be the best of its kind, free from shale, small coal, dust, or other impurities. The smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities. The firewood to consist of either box, she-oak, red or white gum, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies; and should an order be not complied with within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price. Supplies are to be delivered in quantities from one to twenty tons at a time on board steam dredges wherever the same may be employed, and on board steam tugs at any wharf or hulk selected by the contractor in Hobson's Bay, the Yarra River, or Geelong, as the case may be.

3. The contractor for coal will be bound to furnish scales and weights, and to weigh the coal on delivery. The contractor for firewood will be bound to supply the description of wood named in the order, and to place the same in separate stacks of two feet in width and five feet high for measurement, on such ground as may be pointed out, a space being left between each stack.

4. As soon as the order for the coal or wood shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form, with the order attached thereto, to the department supplied. 6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

8. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor to such suit, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

10. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in these Contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months; it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.
