WHEREAS by the Constitution Statute it is amongst other things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Hor Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's, assent to Bills, and, the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the Constitution Act of Victoria and the now-reciting Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly. And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council, made on the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the fifteenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy, has been laid before Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the fifteenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

4. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence, the receiving of petitions, and the bringing up of reports shall have precedence of all motions.

5. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its prosentation, without notice being given in the usual manner.

6. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meeting of the board, and any business the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may bring forward any business he may consider desirable by the way of notice of motion. Every holder of such slaughter-house license as aforesaid shall keep such slaughter-house in a cleanly and proper state, and shall remove or cause to be removed all fifth and refuse therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and shall provide a sufficient supply of water to maintain cleanliness, and for any breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be paid to the shire fund.
