Notice is therefore given that in all cases where the Yan Yean Water is allowed to run to waste, or to be used illegally for irrigation or otherwise, the penalties provided by the *Public Works Statute* will be rigidly enforced; in addition to which the supply-pipe will, without further intimation, be cut off in every instance where water is being wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

TOWN OF MATLOCK.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has altered the boundaries of the town of Matlock, which were defined in a Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of September 1865, and doth by this notice proclaim as the town of Matlock, the portion of Crown Lands hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the northern side of the road forming the northern boundaries of sections 4a and 1a, bearing N. 6° 46' E. one hundred links from the north-west angle of section 4a; thence by a line bearing westerly to a point on the same side of the said road bearing N. 6° 46' E. one hundred and fourteen links and a half from the northern angle of section 1a; thence by the northern side of the said road bearing south-westerly to the western side of the road forming the western boundaries of sections 1a and 2a; thence by the said side of that road bearing south-easterly to the southern side of the road forming the southern boundaries of sections 2a, 3a, 19, 16, 15, and 12; thence by the said side of that road bearing easterly to the eastern side of the road forming the eastern boundary of section 12; thence by the said side of that road bearing northerly to the southern side of the road forming the southern boundaries of sections 11, 8, 12a, 13a, and 14a; thence by the said side of that road bearing easterly to the eastern side of the road forming the eastern boundaries of sections 14a, 7, and 6; thence by the said side of that road bearing northerly till it is intersected by the production of the northern side of the road, forming the northern boundary of section 6; thence by a line bearing north about seventeen chains to a point bearing east from the commencing point; and thence to that point by a line bearing west about seventy-eight chains.—(70/81—19 sec.)

THE ROYAL ASSENT TO THE ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ABOLITION OF STATE AID TO RELIGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Constitution Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that the provisions of the Act of the fourteenth year of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-nine, and of the Act of the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, *For the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, which relate to the giving and withholding of Her Majesty's assent to Bills, and the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, and the instructions to be conveyed to governors for their guidance in relation to the matters aforesaid, and the disallowance of Bills by Her Majesty, shall apply to Bills to be passed by the Legislative Council and Assembly constituted under the *Constitution Act of Victoria* and the now-recited Statute, and by any other legislative body or bodies which may at any time hereafter be substituted for the present Legislative Council and Assembly: And whereas the Bill hereinafter mentioned was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas by an Order of the Queen in Council, made on the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy, a copy whereof is hereto appended, Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the said Bill: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Acts, do by this my Proclamation signify that the Bill intitled *An Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, which was reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon upon the fifteenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy, has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

At the Court at Balmoral the twenty-fourth day of October 1870.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifth and sixth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled, *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things enacted, that no Bill which shall be reserved for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon shall have any force or authority within the colony of New South Wales until the Governor of the said colony shall signify, either by speech or message to the Legislative Council of the said colony or by proclamation as therein aforesaid, that such Bill has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and that Her Majesty has been pleased to assent to the same: And whereas by another Act passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled, *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it was provided, among other things, that the provisions of the said former Act, concerning the reservation of Bills for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon, should apply to and be in force in the colony of Victoria: And whereas the said provisions were maintained in force as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony by a subsequent Act passed in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, entitled, *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*: And whereas the Governor of the said colony of Victoria has reserved a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony, entitled *An Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for the signification of Her Majesty's pleasure thereon: And whereas the said Bill so reserved as aforesaid has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be assented to by Her Majesty: Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers thereby reserved to Her Majesty as aforesaid, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her assent to the said Bill.

And the Right Honorable the Earl of Kimberley, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF KOROIT.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the Borough hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

COMMON ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas all objections respecting the increase of the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

PYALONG UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The Pyalong United Town and Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 16th day of April 1866, and the 14th day of September 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing on the left bank of Mollison's Creek, at the point where the east boundary of the existing common abuts thereon; thence by that creek downwards to a point on a line running parallel with and thirty chains from the said boundary of that common; thence by that line bearing north one mile and three-quarters, more or less, and N. 17° W. two miles and three-quarters, more or less, to a point bearing N. 60° E. from the north angle of the existing common; thence by a line bearing S. 60° W. to that angle; and thence by the eastern boundary of that common bearing S. 17° E. two hundred chains, more or less, and south one hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 1000 acres.—(70. W. 25695.)

BYE-LAWS OF THE WHITTLESEA DISTRICT BOARD.

ALL meetings of the board for the transacting the ordinary business shall be held at the office of the board, at 11 o'clock a.m.; one hour after such time, should there be not a legal quorum assembled, the chairman or the clerk may adjourn the same to a subsequent date.

2. At all meetings of the board the business of the board shall commence as soon as the legal quorum shall be present, but should a legal quorum at the expiration of one hour after the time named for holding the meeting be not present, such circumstance shall be noted in the minute book, with the names of the members present.

3. The minutes of previous meetings shall in all cases be read and confirmed before any other business, and no discussion thereon shall be permitted, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence, the receiving of petitions, and the bringing up of reports shall have precedence of all motions.

5. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its presentation, without notice being given in the usual manner.

6. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meeting of the board, and any business the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may bring forward any business he may consider desirable by the way of notice of motion. No such notice of motion shall be dealt with at such meeting of the board, unless notice thereof shall be given to the clerk by the member bringing it forward at a meeting previous to that at which the same shall be considered.

7. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member giving such notice or some other member authorized by him (in writing) be present when the business is called in order. Any motion not so proceeding with shall be struck out of the notice-paper.

8. Any member when proposing a motion or an amendment, or when discussing any matter, shall rise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted except by a call to order. The member so calling to order shall then be heard, and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered on.

9. No member shall speak twice on the same subject, except by way of explanation merely, or in reply as the mover of the original motion, or upon any amendment, and upon such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.

10. Any member when rising to address the board upon any subject or upon any motion or amendment or explanation, in doing so shall not be permitted to exceed five minutes.

11. The chairman, when called upon to decide any point of order or privilege, shall state his opinion thereon, and his decision shall be final.

12. Any member desiring to speak on any subject shall rise and address the chairman while so doing.

13. The chairman shall rise and address the board when putting any motion or discussing any subject.

14. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or entertained unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order by simply directing the chairman's attention to its infringement.

15. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall determine who shall have precedence.

16. No member shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or impute any improper motives; and all personal

reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly. Any member may require the clerk to take down any particular words used by any member immediately after being so used.

17. Any member who shall use any expressions capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall be required by the board to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

18. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the board. Notice, in writing, of intention to protest must in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution so protested against.

19. All persons entering into contracts with the board shall be required to deposit ten per cent. on the amount of the contract, or shall provide any other mode of security the board may require for such a purpose.

20. In all cases it shall be deemed sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount being not so paid to him, a notice shall be left, stating that unless the amount be paid within fourteen days legal proceedings may be taken for payment of same without further notice.

21. Any ratepayer or other person desiring to make a statement to the board shall be allowed to do so only through one of the members of the board.

SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 27.

By-law of the Council of the Shire of Warrnambool made under Part 2, sections 16 and 25, of the Abattoirs Statute.

THE Council of the Shire of Warrnambool ordain as follows (that is to say) that the following shall be the regulations for determining the sum to be paid to the shire fund in respect of every slaughter-house license, and the conditions on which such license shall be granted, and for providing for the inspection and management of slaughter-houses so licensed, and for fixing the penalty to be paid to the shire fund for the breach of any such regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. That any applicant for a slaughtering license shall state in writing the situation of and description of the slaughter-house and premises proposed to be licensed, and shall give notice in some newspaper generally circulating in the district of his intention to apply, and such notice shall be given seven days prior to the application being made.

2. The fees for every license for a slaughter-house shall be One pound.

3. Every slaughter-house so licensed as aforesaid shall be open for inspection by any justice, inspector, or constable, or by any member or officer of the council at any time of the day or night, and every holder of such license refusing to allow such inspection as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Every holder of such slaughter-house license as aforesaid shall keep such slaughter-house in a cleanly and proper state, and shall remove or cause to be removed all filth and refuse therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and shall provide a sufficient supply of water to maintain cleanliness, and for any breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be paid to the shire fund.
