CONSTITUTING A ROAD DISTRICT TO BE A SHIRE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of February 1871.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (34 Vic. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of the Shires Statute, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions if any of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE **ROSDALE ROAD DISTRICT**, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February 1869, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the **SHIRE OF ROSDALE**.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROPOSED ATTACHMENT OF PART OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN TO THE SHIRE OF BUNGAREE.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Shires Statute 1869*, sections 22 and 29, that certain persons, stated to be ratepayers of the part of the Shire of Ballan hereinafter described, have by petition under their hands prayed the Governor that such part be severed from such shire and be attached to the Shire of Bungaree.

R.; thence westerly by said boundary of P. R. and the continuation of it to the Western Moorabool; thence

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by the Western Moorabool to the Melbourne and Ballarat main north road; and thence by said road to the commencing point."

YOUR EXCELLENCY.—I beg to forward for Your Excellency's information, and with a view to promulgation in New Zealand if you think fit, the accompanying particulars received from Her Majesty's ship *Rosario*, regarding the positions of certain islands visited during her cruise to the Gilbert Group.

SIR.—I beg to forward a list of the positions of the islands visited by the *Rosario*, during her cruise to the Gilbert Islands. I would here observe that Byron Island is about 1° west of the position assigned to it on Chart No. 2464; and also that the small island which lies almost midway between the position of Independence and Sophia Islands, and may be either, would be especially dangerous to a vessel passing this longitude at night.

I have been informed, by several people used to navigating these seas, that Onaseuse or Hunter Island does not exist, and this is borne out by our observations on the 7th instant.

List of Positions obtained by the *Rosario*, on a Cruise between Fiji and Gilbert Islands. Chart 2464, Pacific Ocean, Sheet 6.

An island about 3 miles in circumference, Independence or Sophia Island. (Centre.) Lat. 10° 40' S. Long. 179° 31' E. Pamfute. (South Islet.) Lat. 8° 31' S. Long. 179° 10' E. Tracy Island. (South point.) Lat. 7° 30' S. Long. 178° 49' E. Byron Island. (South point.) Lat. 1° 25' S. Long. 176° 40' E. Peru Island. (South point.) Lat. 1° 25' S. Long. 176° 02' E. Drummond Island. (North point.) Lat. 1° 08' S. Long. 174° 42' E. Island at south entrance of Apamama Lagoon. (South point.) Lat. 0° 23' N. Long. 173° 52' E.

5th November 1870, at 10 a.m., passed 3 miles west of position of reef (P), lat. 12° 30' S., long. 176° 30' E., without seeing any signs of it.

7th November 1870, at 3 p.m., passed 4 miles west of lat. 15° 31' S., long. 176° 11' E. (position assigned to Onaseuse or Hunter Island). Nothing in sight from mast-head.

The above longitudes depend on the meridian of observation point, Levuka, Ovalau, Fiji, being in longitude 178° 49' 3" E.

COMMON AT ARTHUR'S CREEK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration,

addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

COMMON AT ARTHUR'S CREEK:—The unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute a Common, viz.:—Commencing on Arthur's Creek, at the point where it is intersected by the east boundary of allotment 28, parish of Linton; thence by that creek upwards to a point distant one mile in a direct line from the first-named point; thence south-east one hundred chains; thence south-westerly three miles, more or less, to the north-east angle of the Greensborough Farmers' Common, being a point on the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—Area about 2900 acres.—(70. & 26281.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

MURDER OF A WOMAN AT DRY CREEK, KILMORE.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the night of Friday the 20th of January last a woman, known to some persons as Mrs. Yorkey or Mrs. Heard, was found dead at Dry Creek, Kilmore, under circumstances indicating that her death was the result of brutal violence: And whereas at an inquest the jury returned a verdict of wilful murder against some person or persons unknown: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons by whom the deceased was murdered.

PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION AND IDENTIFICATION.

About midnight of the 20th of January the woman was heard in violent altercation with a man who was accusing her of stealing his purse. Soon afterwards blows and groans were heard, and one of the witnesses rushing out saw the supposed offender near the woman, and began to remonstrate, but was answered with threats. The offender's rapid flight and the darkness prevent the man's accurate description being given. He is, however, supposed to have been Irish, a laborer or "navvy," aged 30 or 35, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, very stout and thick built, and to have been at work on some railway line. The woman is described as English, aged 32 to 36, of medium height and build, with dark complexion, black curly hair, black eyes, round face, and the left thumb-nail injured. She wore a black alpaca dress, trimmed with black crape round the neck, shoulders, and cuffs, the sleeves long and tight, the jacket of a sort of black twill with bugie braid, and a straw hat. She wore two old gold rings.
