## PENALTIES FOR THE BREACH OF REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF COMMONS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Land Act 1869*, section 59, the Governor in Council has made the subjoined Regulation prescribing Penalties, and the mode of recovering the same, for the breach of regulations framed under the said Act for the management of Commons, that is to say:—

The managers of any common proclaimed under or previously to the passing of *The Land Act 1869*, or hereafter to be proclaimed, shall have power to recover fees due or payable for depasturing on any common or commons under their control, whether such fees became due or payable previous to or during the term of office of such managers, in a summary way before two or more justices of the peace; and if any person infringe any regulation made by the Governor in Council for the management of any common by depasturing cattle thereon without being entitled so to do, or depasture any cattle in excess of the number he is entitled to depasture on such common, or knowingly or wilfully remove or unnecessarily disturb the cattle of any person entitled to depasture cattle on such common, he shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay for the first offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and for every subsequent offence of which he shall be convicted a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

### PARTS WHERE CERTIFICATES FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE GRANTED ON PAYMENT OF FEE OF £10.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Shires and parts of Shires hereinafter mentioned to be respectively districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The Shire of Alberton, with the exception of those parts of it which are comprised within circuits of three miles around the boundaries of the townships of Alberton, Palmerston, Tarraville, and Yarram-yarram respectively.

The Shire of Avoca, with the exception of the townships of Avoca and Landsborough, and with the further exception of the areas comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of those townships.

Such part of the Shire of Stawell as is not within half a mile of that portion of the main road from Ararat to Horsham extending from the north-west angle of the township reserve at Glenorchy to the southern boundary of the Shire.

### PROHIBITION AGAINST CUTTING, ETC., OF TIMBER ALONG PART OF THE ARARAT TO HORSHAM ROAD REVOKED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of March 1870, it was declared that no person, although duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut or remove live or dead timber on the unappropriated Crown land within a distance of Ten chains of each side of that portion of the road from Ararat to Horsham which lies within the Shire of Stawell: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore referred to.

## BERLIN GOLDFIELD COMMON DIMINISHED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE BERLIN GOLDFIELD COMMON, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 1st day of February 1870, is hereby altered in accordance with the boundaries hereinafter defined, and the unappropriated Crown land within such boundaries shall henceforth be and constitute the said common, viz.:—Commencing at the west angle of allotment 8 of section 2, parish of Kingower, being a point on the eastern side of the road from Dunolly to Wedderburn; thence by that allotment bearing N. 10° 36' E. eleven chains fifty-one links to a creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Kangderaar Creek; thence by that creek upwards to the south boundary of allotment 1 of section 2, parish of Kangderaar; thence by allotments 1 and 16, by a line crossing a road, and by allotments 17 and 18 bearing west seventy-three chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment 18; thence by allotments 18 and 19 bearing north thirty chains; thence by allotment 19 bearing east thirty-three chains seventy-five links; thence by a road bearing N. 29° 29' W. fourteen chains, more or less, and N. 17° 51' W. seven chains ninety-one links; thence by allotment 21 bearing west twenty-four chains fifty-two links, north twenty chains, and east eighteen chains eight links; thence by a road bearing N. 17° 51' W. twenty-one chains one link; thence by a road bearing west eleven chains sixty-four links to the north-west angle of allotment 22; thence by a line bearing north thirty-three chains, more or less, to the road from Kingower to Jericho; thence by that road bearing N. 71° 30' W. twenty-three chains, more or less, and N. 49° 30' W. forty chains; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and sixty chains; thence by a line bearing south two hundred and fifty chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing east two hundred and seventy chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 6000 acres.—(70.X.21976.)

**RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE TRUSTEES OF  
 THE GRETA CEMETERY.**

**A**ll charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the consent of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives, for ever, from the date of such permission being given. The permission shall be in the form contained in Schedule A.

3. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees, and a certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.

4. All charges will be remitted on the burial of poor persons in the cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or graves will be required to construct them under the directions of the trustees.

6. Any person wishing to make an interment in any private grave or vault must obtain the consent (in writing) of the owner thereof, which must be submitted to the trustees on making application for interment.

7. All monuments, gravestones, graves and vaults, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

8. Every vault or brick grave containing any coffin or coffins to be securely covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, iron, or good redgum planking, or other material approved by the trustees.

9. The plans of all monuments and fences to be submitted to the trustees; and any tomb, epitaph, or monument objected to will not be permitted to be erected.

10. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application to the secretary.

11. The procession to be at the cemetery at the time fixed for the funeral, which must be punctually observed.

12. All funerals shall take place between the hours of Ten a.m. and Six p.m.

13. All persons wishing interments to be made shall be required to give notice to the trustees twelve hours previous to such interment.

14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
