CARGERIE COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the prescribed notice has been duly published and all objections respecting the common hereinafter mentioned have been heard as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:-

CARGERIE COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Cargerie Common, viz.: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 155 in parish of Meredith, being a point on the Woodburne Creek; thence by that creek downwards to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of allotment 47 in the parish of Coole Barghurk; thence by a line bearing west 265 chains, more or less, to the River Leigh; thence by that river upwards to the Cargerie Creek; thence by that creek upwards to allotment 8, parish of Cargerie; and thence easterly by the south boundary of the parishes of Cargerie and Meredith to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 5000 acres.—(70.Z.21044.)

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO CERTAIN SHIRES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTEBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Shire of Belfast by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869: And whereas the said Shire of Belfast has been since constituted two separate Shires, which are respectively designated the Shire of Belfast and the Shire of Minnamite: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and do revoke so much and such parts thereof as extend Part II. of the recited Act to the Shire of Belfast; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective Shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Belfast,
The Shire of Minnamite.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 175,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.17 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths in January 1871 exceeded those in December by 7. They were, however, fewer by 43 than the average of January during the previous ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.0° on the 26th, and the lowest was 48.0° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (67.5°) was 1.4° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.0°) took place on the 18th, viz.:—from a maximum of 92.0 to a minimum of 53.0°. The least range

(85°) was on the 24th, viz.:—from a maximum of 72° to a minimum of 63°. The mean daily range was 23°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.840 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Fifty-nine per cent. of the deaths were of males and 41 per cent. were of females; 57 per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year against 58 per cent. in January 1870, 58 per cent. in January 1869, 62 per cent. in January 1868, 75 per cent. in January 1867, 65½ per cent. in January 1866, 65 per cent. in January 1865, 64 per cent. in January 1864, 64 per cent. in January 1863, 68 per cent. in January 1862, and 71 per cent. in January 1861.

Five persons of 75 years old or upwards died during the month, viz., a male aged 75 of old age, two males aged 76 of heart disease and congestion of the lungs respectively, one male aged 83 of old age, and a female aged 79 of old age.

Twenty-six violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A girl aged 1½ died of compression of the brain; a boy aged 10 of fracture of the skull caused by being thrown out of a cart; a miner aged 27 from injuries to the head caused by the fall of a bucket; a seaman aged 31 of fracture of the skull and subsequent immersion in the water; a drayman aged 38 was killed by a cart-wheel passing over him; a cab proprietor aged 40 from accidental injuries to the head; a cab proprietor aged 44 from injuries caused by being knocked down by a cab; a railway porter aged 45 was accidentally killed; four females aged respectively 13, 5, 14, and 19 years died of accidental burns; four boys aged respectively 7, 10, 11, and 11, were accidentally drowned; and two youths aged 13 and 18 were drowned in the River Yarra; a miller aged 44 and a gunsmith aged 45 were also accidentally drowned; a child aged 4 months was suffocated in bed; a male aged 1½ years died of accidental strangulation; two females aged respectively 23 and 46 years committed suicide by poison; a carter aged 41 drowned himself; and a male aged 40 hanged himself.

Seventy-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 216, of which 121, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 95, or nearly 44 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 164 were under one year of age, 43 were between one and two years, 3 were between two and three years, 4 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 164, of which 103, or nearly 63 per cent., were males, and 61, or about 37 per cent., were females; 7 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 11 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 11 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 1 was between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 was eighty and upwards.

QUARANTINE DISTRICT UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870* the Governor in Council has ordered that the portion of Victoria, whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, and which is known as the Narraport run, shall be a Quarantine District within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

NARRAPORT RUN.—Commencing at the north-west angle, and bounded on the north by the Karyrie run, bearing easterly about eight miles; thence southerly about eight miles twenty-six chains; thence westerly to the eastern boundary of the Morton Plains run about two miles and a-half; thence by the north-eastern boundary of Morton Plains to the eastern boundary of Wirrumbirchip, bearing north-westerly about seven miles and a-half; and thence by the eastern boundary of Wirrumbirchip run, bearing northerly about three miles to the commencing point.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannan run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarram-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumburp run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

COLERAINE QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the Nagwarry run, being a point on the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia; thence by the said run bearing easterly to the Argyle run; thence by that run bearing southerly, south-easterly, north-easterly, and easterly to the Spring Bank run; thence by that run bearing easterly to the Glenelg River; thence by that river downwards to the Kinkell run; thence by that run bearing north-westerly, northerly, westerly, southerly, and south-easterly to the Glenelg River aforesaid; thence by that river downwards to the Sandy Water Holes run; thence by that run northerly and westerly to the Warriang run; thence by that run northerly and westerly to the aforesaid boundary line; and thence by that line north to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

The boundaries above described comprise the Glenelg, Woodford, West Strathdownie, East Strathdownie, Kiladbro, West Ardno, East Ardno, and Limestone Ridge runs.

HAMILTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 2, parish of Greenhills, being a point on the eastern side of the road from Portland to Hamilton; thence east to Lake Condah Swamp; thence southerly by the eastern margin of that swamp to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Lake Condah pre-emptive section; thence by that creek to Lake Condah; thence by the western shore of that lake southerly to Darlot's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Fitzroy River; thence by that river upwards to the aforesaid road from Portland to Hamilton; and thence by that road north-easterly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

BURNWANG EAST RUN.—Commencing at the junction of Mount Pleasant Creek with the Campaspe River; thence by the Campaspe River run bearing south-easterly to the Colbinabbin run; thence by that run bearing northerly one mile and a-half, more or less, and easterly one mile and three-quarters, more or less, to the Burrumburp run; thence by that run and by the Stewart's Plains run bearing northerly ten miles, more or less, to the Rest Down Plains runs; thence by that run bearing north-westerly to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.
