CONSTITUTING ROAD DISTRICTS TO BE SHIRES

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of March 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Mr. Francis	Mr. Wrixon
Mr. a'Beckett	Mr. Mackay.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (34 Vic. No 337, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of the *Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions if any of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in each of the road districts hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in each of such districts, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be shires: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road Districts hereinafter mentioned to be Shires within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE ELTHAM ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September 1856, and was altered by another proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of May 1861, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the twenty-eighth day of December 1861, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

THE WOODEND, NEWHAM, AND ROCHFORD ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November 1861, and was altered and re-defined by two several proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-second day of February 1864 and the twenty-first day of August 1865, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an order of the fifteenth day of February 1869, shall be and hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF NEWHAM.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NOTICE—RULES AND REGULATIONS UNDER "THE STAMP STATUTE 1869."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of April 1871.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the 4th section of *The Stamp Statute 1869* it is provided, that from and after such time as the Governor in Council shall by notice published in the *Government Gazette* appoint, the following fees or such of them as shall be specified in such notice shall be collected by stamps, namely,—All fees payable to the Crown, or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to the several officers of Government in the several courts and offices in respect of matters or things to be done or performed under certain enactments specified in the schedule to the said Act; and all fees payable to the Crown, or the Consolidated Revenue of Victoria, or to any officers of the Government under any other enactment which the Governor in Council shall by any such notice in the *Government Gazette* direct to be collected by stamps: And whereas by the 5th section it is provided, that all or any stamps to be used under the said statute shall be impressed or adhesive as the Governor in Council shall direct: And whereas by the 8th section it is provided that the Governor may frame such rules as may appear to be necessary for carrying out the said statute and for regulating the use of stamps thereunder and particularly for prescribing the application thereof to documents from time to time in use or required to be used for the purpose of such stamps and for insuring the proper cancellation of adhesive stamps and keeping accounts of such stamps and for the issuing of stamps in exchange for spoiled stamps: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present order give the Notice and make the Rules and Regulations, hereinafter contained, concerning the matters aforesaid:—

1. *Notice of time at which fees are to be collected by stamps.*—Fees shall be collected by stamps under the said statute on and after the First day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.

2. *Enactments under which the fees are to be so collected.*—Subject to the exceptions hereinafter provided all fees under the enactments specified in the said statute and numbered 1 to 5 in the subjoined list, and also all fees under the statutes numbered 6 to 8 in the subjoined list shall be collected by stamps:—

1. An Act to make provision for the better Administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria, 15th Vic. No. 10.
2. Common Law Procedure Statute 1865.
3. Insolvency Statute 1865.
4. The Marriage and Matrimonial Causes Statute 1864.
5. The Juries Statute 1865.
6. The Patents Statute 1865.
7. The Copyright Act 1869.
8. The Insolvency Statute 1871.

3. *Exceptions.*—All fees under the said enactments not of right payable into the Consolidated Revenue of the colony of Victoria.

4. *Stamps to be adhesive.*—Stamps to be used under the statute shall be adhesive.

5. *All fees to be paid in stamps.*—Save as hereinbefore excepted, every fee payable under any of the said enactments shall

be paid by stamps affixed as hereinafter provided to some paper or document having reference to that in respect of which the fee is payable.

6. *Documents to be stamped.*—Stamps for fees payable in respect of the several matters specified in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be affixed to the corresponding documents specified in the second column of the schedule hereto.

7. *Affixing of stamps in other cases.*—Stamps for every other fee payable under any of the said enactments shall be affixed to a short written or printed note or præcipe asking for that in respect of which the fee is payable, and signed by or for the person by whom the fee is payable; and the heads of the several departments of the public service in which fees under the said enactment are respectively payable shall, from time to time, prescribe the form in which such notes or præcipes are to be taken and preserved.

8. *Cancellation of stamps.*—Before anything is done, or permitted to be done, in respect of that for which a fee is payable by stamps, the stamps by which the fee is paid shall be cancelled in manner provided by section 12 of the statute.

9. *Record of cancellation.*—The heads of the several departments in which fees payable by stamps shall be collected shall cause an exact account or record to be kept of the number and denomination of all stamps cancelled by the officers of their several departments, and of the dates of such cancellation, and shall furnish to the Treasurer such accounts thereof in such form and at such times as the Treasurer shall from time to time direct.

Allowance for spoiled stamps.—Where, through any mistake or inadvertence, any stamp has been used and cancelled unnecessarily by any officer in the public service, the head of the department may certify in writing signed by him that such stamp is fit subject for allowance, and on production of the certificate and the stamp to which it relates, the Minister administering the Act may issue a stamp or stamps of equivalent value to the applicant.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the several Shires and Road Districts specified in the annexed Schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant

Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

SCHEDULE.

Names of Shires and Road Districts.	Portions exempted.
Shire of Ararat	The townships of Moyston, Wickliffe, Boloke, Streatham, and Buangor, and the areas comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of those townships respectively.
Shire of Avon	The areas comprised within a circuit of two miles around the boundaries of the Borough of Sale and the townships of Stratford, Maffra, and Heyfield respectively.
Shire of Berwick	Such portion of the Main Gippsland road and half a mile on each side of it as is comprised within the Shire of Berwick.
Shire of Corio	All portions of the Shire of Corio, with the exception of "The Peak Riding" of that shire.
Shire of Gisborne	The townships of Gisborne, New Gisborne, Riddell, and Macedon, and the areas comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of those townships respectively.
Flinders Road District	The township of Flinders.
Willowmavin Road District	The area comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of the Borough of Kilmora.
Melton Road District...	All portions of the Melton Road District, with the exception of that portion comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:— Commencing on the Western Kororoit Creek, at the point where the northern boundary of the Melton Road District crosses the said creek; thence south-easterly by the said creek to its junction with the Eastern Kororoit Creek; thence by the Eastern Kororoit Creek to the southern boundary of the parish of Holden; thence east by the southern boundary of the said parish to the eastern boundary of the Melton Road District on the Main Mount Alexander road; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said road district to the southern boundary of the township of Sunbury; thence by the said southern boundary to the western boundary of the said township; thence north by the western boundary of the township of Sunbury to the northern boundary of the Melton Road District; thence west by the northern boundary of the said road district to the commencing point.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act* 1863, has, by Orders made on the 28th day of March 1871, directed that the undermentioned District Road Boards shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on the Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

LIGHTS AT THE ENTRANCE TO RIVER YARRA.

Referring to a Notice to Mariners dated the 13th of October 1870, masters of vessels, pilots and others are now informed that the new beacons having been completed, the lights will be exhibited therefrom on and after the 1st of April prox., from sunset to sunrise.

The directions issued on the 2nd of August 1866, are reprinted for general information.

Three fixed lights, each twenty feet above high-water level, will be exhibited near the entrance of the River Yarra, viz.: One red light on the outer Black Dolphin; one green light on the Elbow Beacon; one light on the Williamstown beach; the last so marked as only to show red up the first reach of the river, remainder white.

Sailing Directions.—Before entering the Yarra open the green light a little north of the red one, and when nearing the green light, port and bring it and the shore red light in one, which marks lead past the Shellbank Dolphin.

Bound out.—When passing the Shellbank Dolphin bring the green and shore red light in one, until close to the former, when starboard and haul gradually out towards the Dolphin red light.

A tide gauge has been placed at the outer Black Dolphin light for the guidance of masters and others navigating the Yarra.
