MANAGER OF A COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

THE Governor in Council, on the 22nd day of December 1870, made the following appointment and arrangement with reference to the undermentioned Common-toll road, under the provisions of the Act 33 Victoria No. 358, § 336, viz:—

HENRY LONDON

to be Manager (*vice* T. H. Tierney, resigned) of the common-toll road extending from Castlemaine, *via* Campbell's Creek, to Newstead, as proclaimed under Order in Council of 21st December 1869; and that on the last day of each calendar month, he shall receive from the collectors and lessees of all tolls upon such road, and the bridges thereon, all moneys collected by them as and for such tolls, or due by them as the rents thereof; and shall once in every month distribute the same amongst the local bodies interested therein, in the proportions prescribed by Order in Council of 3rd August 1869; such appointment to be in force for one year from 1st January 1871.

PART OF THE SHIRE OF BELFAST ATTACHED TO
THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth
day of December 1870.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 23) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-second day of December in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy the Shire of Belfast was separated into two shires which are therein described, and thereupon all ridings of the said shire so separated cease to exist: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Belfast therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Belfast, described in such petition, from such Shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the north and south Ridings of the Shire of Warrnambool: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Shire of Belfast and of the North and South Ridings of the said Shire of Warrnambool in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BELFAST.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the township of Woolthorpe; thence south-westerly by the north-western boundary of sections 26 and 29 in the parish of Woolthorpe, and allotment 3 of section E in the parish of Warrang; thence southerly by the western boundary of said allotment, and of allotments 2 and 3 of section F in the said parish to the south-west angle of allotment 3 of section B; thence westerly by the road on the north of sections Q, P, O, N, M, and the northern boundary of allotments 2 and 3 of section K, in the said parish of Warrang, to the north-west angle of allotment 3 of said section K; thence southerly to the south-east angle of section 24 in the parish of Kapong; thence westerly by the road on the south of said section, and of sections 25, 26, 27, and 28 in said parish, and of the township of Orford to its intersection with the River Shaw; thence southerly by the course of that river to a point opposite the north-west angle of allotment 18 in the parish of Yambuk; thence by a line bearing west eighty chains; thence northerly to the south-west angle of allotment 160 in the parish of St. Helens; thence north by the western boundary of said allotment and allotment 153, and further north crossing a road, and by the western boundaries of allotments 144 and 137 in said parish to the centre of the road on the northern boundary of said allotment 137; thence west by that road and by a line bearing west to the intersection of the western boundary of the Shire of Belfast, as gazetted 2nd September 1863; thence southerly and easterly by the boundaries of said shire to a point on the sea-shore due south of the south-west angle of the Tower Hill Church of England reserve; thence north to the south-west angle of said reserve; thence by parts of the southern, western, and northern boundaries of the Borough of Kororo, as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th of October 1870, to the north-east angle of allotment 33 in the parish of Yarrturk; thence northerly by the road on the west of allotments 10, 9, and 4 in said parish to the intersection of the road on the north of said allotment 4; thence westerly by that road to the centre of the main Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence north-easterly by that main road to the junction of the road on the southern boundary of the township of Woolthorpe; thence westerly by the last said road to the commencing point, excepting the Borough of Belfast.

THE NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of South Caramut; thence south by a road, the western side of which coincides with the western boundaries of the parishes of South Caramut, Minjah North, Minjah, and Woolthorpe, to the intersection of the road from Woolthorpe to Green Hills, at the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 20, in the parish of Woolthorpe; thence south-easterly by the said road intersecting sections 20, 19, 22, and 23 in the said parish to its junction with the road bounding the township of Woolthorpe on the west; thence southerly by the last-named road to the south-west angle of the township of Woolthorpe; thence

easterly by the road on the south of said township to the centre of the main Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence northerly by said road to the intersection of the Spring Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the course of the said creek to its intersection by the Drysdale creek; thence by the course of the Drysdale Creek northerly and easterly to the southern boundary of the parish of Ballangeich; thence east by the said parish boundary to the Hopkins River; thence northerly by the course of the said river to a point where the centre of the Ararat to the south-western sea-board road is cut by the county boundary of Hampden in the township of Chatsworth; thence southwards by the centre line of said road to the northern boundary of the township of Caramut; thence by the northern and western boundaries of said township to the intersection of Muston's Creek; thence by the centre line of said creek north-westerly to the south-east angle of the parish of Purdeet East; thence by the road on the southern boundary of said parish to the commencing point.

THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.—Commencing at the intersection of the main Ararat and south-western sea-board road by the Spring Creek; thence south-westerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 5 of section C in the parish of Yarrturk; thence easterly by the road bounding said allotment on the north to the intersection of the road on the east boundary of said allotment; thence south by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 28 in said parish; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment and by the north of allotment 16 in said parish to the north-east angle of said allotment 16; thence southerly by the road bounding on the east allotments 16 and 26 in said parish, and allotments 46, 45, 44, and 41 in the parish of Yangerly to the centre of the main Warrnambool to Belfast road; thence westerly by the said road to the south-west angle of Tower Hill Church of England reserve; thence by a line due south to the sea shore; thence by the sea-coast to the mouth of the Hopkins River; thence northerly by the course of the said river to the south-east angle of the parish of Ballangeich; thence westerly by the southern boundary of said parish to the Drysdale Creek; thence by the course of the said creek southerly and westerly to the intersection of the Spring Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the course of the said creek to the commencing point, excluding the Borough of Warrnambool.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Swan Spit Shoal.

REFERRING to a notice, dated the 6th instant,* masters, pilots, and others are hereby informed that a black buoy has been placed in twenty-one (21) feet water at the S.E. end of the shoal which has recently formed to the eastward of the Swan Spit.

The following bearings mark the position of the buoy, viz.:—
Light light at Shortland's Bluff in line with the west end of Swan Spit Light S.W. by W.

No. 12 Perch Buoy just open to the eastward of the West Channel Lightship (swung to the ebb). Swan Beacon W.4N.

The shoal which has irregular soundings from thirteen to seventeen feet lies N.N.W. about one cable length from the buoy and is about half a cable in width, having twenty-two feet water at its outer or eastern edge.

BALLARAT DISTRICT.

Office of Inspector of Sheep,
Ballarat, 31st December 1870.

I HAVE the honor to report, for the quarter ending 31st December 1870, that there has been one license issued in the Ballarat district, for 4050 sheep on the Yarram-yarram station, which station is now in the Hamilton district. The small flock of Mr. Wm. Ditchfield, near Mount William, I found to be quite clean in November, and I am not aware of the existence of scab in this district at present.

Steps are being taken to proclaim the greater portion of the district a "Clean District," making such provision as shall not interfere with travelling sheep or fat sheep being driven to market.

There have been no diseased sheep in the market yards during the quarter.

I HAVE the honor to furnish you with a report of the state of my district as regards scab, in accordance with the 12th section of the Scab Act, and to state I have no sheep in my district under license.

I have further the honor to state that John O'Neil, butcher, of Chiltern, was fined on the 1st of November by the Chiltern bench £10 for having owned 123 unlicensed scab sheep, and was also fined £5 under clause 35 of the Scab Act. O'Neil, at the time of my making the discovery of the scab, destroyed all his sheep. The disease, I am pleased to report, has not shown itself in any of the surrounding flocks.

Benalla, 31st December 1870.

I HAVE the honor, agreeable to your request of the 10th inst., relative to section 12 of the Scab Act, to forward to you the following report on the state of the district at this date in reference to scab. On the 30th September last I had about 72,000 sheep under scab licenses; that number has been steadily decreasing, which is now reduced to 3,000, the actual number now under license in this district.

Having inspected about 50,000 of the above number since their licenses expired, I found them to all appearance clean, 32,000 of which were dressed in sulphur and lime, and 18,000 dressed in tobacco. Clean as these sheep appear to be at present, there is yet a danger from re-infection in consequence of the difficulty of making clean musters, more especially in large paddocks, where it is possible that an individual diseased sheep may lurk about for months undetected.

I HAVE the honor, in accordance with section 12 of the Act, to hand you herewith a return of the licenses issued and fines inflicted for the quarter ending this day.

I have no fresh cases of scab to report, but am sorry to add that in three instances where lime and sulphur have been used the sheep have not been cured, and I have strong doubts as to a fourth flock, but having only recently had the last dip I cannot say decidedly. In two instances sheep have been licensed, on account of being shorn and yarded in the same places as infected sheep.

No stations in this district have as yet been placed in quarantine, but after the next board meeting, at which I am to report on the state of the flocks that have been licensed, those found infected will be. After which it will be considered if any, and what part, shall be proclaimed a Clean District.

There have been two meetings of Board of Advice, at the Leigh Road, on the 29th November and 15th instant. At the last it was fixed that all future meetings (without anything particular calls them together) shall be on the third Thursday in the month; the next will therefore be on 19th January 1871, at Inverleigh. Mr. Kininmouth has accepted the office of secretary and corresponding member of the board, but as yet no permanent chairman has been appointed.

Mr. Learmonth applied to me for a renewed license on the 10th December for 1000 sheep licensed on the 23rd August, which I refused to grant, as the first license had lapsed. I found one of these sheep scabby on the 10th December; this 1000 is not included in the 3,000. Mr. J. W. C. Flower, of Lake Condah, applied to me for a license for 1160 sheep after I had found scab on a strange sheep among this lot, which application I also refused to grant.

Mr. Robertson, of Yarram-yarram, which station is now in the Hamilton district, applied for a license for 2600 sheep, but which will appear in the Ballarat district returns, in which district the station was when the license was issued by Mr. Inspector Shaw.

I have seen the sheep of Messrs. Morton and Campbell, Condah Swamp; Joseph Rawlinson, Condah; Edmund Rawlinson, Condah; and John Malseed, Wittleburn, which had been licensed in August last; they appear to be clean, but until the rains set in, cannot be assured they are so.

I have had no prosecutions this quarter. Some sheep belonging to Mr. Francis Egan, of Glenaulin, branded S (six in number) had joined two of the flocks on Ascot Heath. Mr. McPherson called upon me to examine them; they showed signs of having been scabby, were branded S, and had been recently dipped.

KILMORE DISTRICT.

Kilmore, 2nd January 1871.

I HAVE the honor to forward quarterly report to 31st December 1870. You will see from enclosed list that almost the entire Upper Goulburn part of my district is under license. In consequence of successive floods and the numerous creeks in that part it was impossible to take any efficient measures with sheep from the beginning of June to about the middle of November, and there are very few stations that did not show scab more or less at shearing. The Board of Advice in my district has not yet held a meeting; from the lateness of the season some of the members have not finished shearing. I have notified to them that I have important papers to lay before them at their earliest convenience, and expect daily to hear that a time has been appointed for meeting. I have endeavoured to see as many of the licensed sheep on the Upper Goulburn as possible, and find that an active and careful course of dipping in lime and sulphur is being carried out. With one or two exceptions, in which I

trust I have taken steps to effect a remedy, I think everyone is using his best exertions to eradicate the disease.

MELBOURNE DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to furnish you with my report for the quarter ending 31st December 1870. One license has been issued during this quarter, to Frederick Poole, of Mount Eliza, Frankston, for three hundred sheep.

The scabby sheep on the farm of Wilson Cornwall, of Pakenham, were destroyed by the owner, and proceedings against him were consequently allowed to lapse.

The sheep on Carr's farm at Frankston, lately under license, were examined by me and show no signs of disease.

On the 17th December Thomas Warr, of Mount Eliza, was fined by the bench at Snapper Point in a penalty of 6d. per head on 1890 sheep, for neglecting to comply with the 35th clause of the Scab Act.

I have examined the sheep belonging to John Moylan, of Mount Koroit, and to W. J. T. Clarke, near Melton, both of which appear to be free from scab.

I have examined 281,200 sheep at the Flemington yards, also various small lots from Tasmania and South Australia; the latter were dipped in Melbourne previous to proceeding to their various destinations.

I communicated to you the proceedings at these meetings in my letters of 17th October and 17th November.

There are no sheep now under license in this district, and I know of none being scabby.
