## THE INDIGO UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if any borough and any road district shall adjoin each other and form with the boundaries thereof respectively one continuous area, or if any borough shall lie surrounded by any road district, and if the council of such borough and the board of such road district shall be desirous that such borough and such road district be formed into one united district under the said Act, the same may be done in like manner and with the like effect in all respects as is thereinbefore provided with regard to the union of two or more road districts; and for the purpose of such union such borough shall be deemed to have been a district, and the several wards thereof, if any, to have been subdivisions, under the said Act, and the several provisions of the said Act shall apply to the same accordingly: And whereas the Borough of Chiltern (the boundaries of which are described in Schedule I. of *The Boroughs Statute 1869*) is wholly surrounded by the Indigo Road District, the boundaries of which are described in a Proclamation bearing date the first day of December in the year 1862: And whereas the council of the said borough and the board of the said road district have by petitions under the respective common seals of the said council and board prayed the Governor in Council, in manner provided by the twelfth section of the above-recited Act, that the said borough and road district shall be constituted one united district: And whereas it seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an Order in Council this day constituting the said borough and road district one district

as hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the constitution of the said Borough of Chiltern and Indigo Road District to be one district under the said Act, by the name in and by the said Order in Council assigned to the same, that is to say:—

### THE INDIGO UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

## REGULATION AND ORDER MADE UNDER THE ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ABORIGINAL NATIVES OF VICTORIA.

At the Executive Council held at Toorak the twelfth day of May 1871.

### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor  
Mr. a'Beckett | Mr. Bates.

WHEREAS by the second section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 349, intituled *An Act to provide for the Protection and Management of the Aboriginal Natives of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make regulations and orders for the purposes therein mentioned and at any time to rescind or alter such regulations: And whereas on the 13th day of February last His Excellency the Governor in Council made certain regulations and orders, and it is expedient to alter same: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following Regulation:—1. That the word "year" in the said recited regulations and orders of the 13th day of February 1871, numbered respectively 10 and 11, shall mean the financial year as fixed and adopted by the Legislative Assembly.

And the Honorable Sir James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Alteration in Port Albert Light.

THE Colonial Government of Victoria has given Notice that, from the 1st day of April 1871, the following alteration will be made in Port Albert Light.

The red fixed and flashing light will be changed to a *white* fixed and flashing light, showing a flash *every three minutes*. The steady white light will show for *one minute forty seconds*, it will then be eclipsed for *twelve seconds*, and after the flash again eclipsed for *thirty-four seconds*. In clear weather it should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

Within a distance of 3 miles the light will appear as a continuous *fixed* light between the flashes.

#### BYE-LAW No. 1.

**BYE-LAW** of the Council of the Shire of Darebin, for providing for the "due management of the affairs and proceedings of the said Council," made under Part XII. of the "Shires Statute."

In pursuance of Section 187 of 33 Victoria, No. 358 (the "Shires Statute"), the Council of the Shire of Darebin ordain as follows (that is to say):—

1. If within one hour after the time appointed for a meeting of the council there be not a quorum present, the names of the councillors present, if any, shall be entered in the minute book, and the meeting adjourned in accordance with section 143 of the "Shires Statute."

2. At every ordinary meeting of the council, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation of the minutes of any preceding meeting or meetings not previously confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

3. After the confirmation of the minutes as in the last preceding section herein provided, the business of the day shall be proceeded with in the manner and order set forth (that is to say):—

- 1st. Reading copies of letters sent.
- 2nd. Reading letters received and ordering thereon.
- 3rd. Reception and reading of petitions and ordering, as to when and in what manner the same shall be taken into consideration.
- 4th. Reception of deputations if present.
- 5th. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
- 6th. Orders of the day arising from proceedings of former meetings of the council.
- 7th. Any matters or business relating to the council or shire that the president deems fit to bring under the notice of the council.
- 8th. Any matters any members of the council may think fit to bring under the notice of the council.
- 9th. Consideration of business of which previous notice shall have been given in the order in which such notices shall appear to have been given.
- 10th. The examination and passing of accounts for payment.
- 11th. Reading notices of motion for consideration at a future meeting.
- 12th. All other business not herein otherwise provided for.

4. The order of business as set forth in the last preceding section hereof may be suspended *pro tem.*, by a resolution of a majority of the members of the council then present, in cases of emergency, or for the reception of deputations.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be presented by a councillor, who shall endorse his name on the back thereof and be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and the same shall be taken into consideration at such time and in such manner as the council may then direct.

6. All reports of a committee shall be written upon foolscap paper, and shall be signed by the chairman, or acting chairman, prior to being presented to the council, and should there be distinct recommendations contained in such report, the same shall not be adopted until the sense of the council be taken separately on each such recommendation.

7. Every notice of motion shall be in writing and shall be given to the secretary, who shall forthwith read the same aloud and enter the same in the minute book; but nothing herein contained shall be so read as to prevent the giver of such notice of motion from altering the same by giving an amended notice in writing to the secretary not less than ten clear days prior to the meeting at which such motion is to be considered.

8. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given notice of the same or some other councillor authorized by him, in writing, on that behalf, shall be present to proceed therewith when called in order; any motion not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper. Provided always, that if any councillor who has given such notice of motion shall, from illness or any other unavoidable cause, be absent from the meeting at which the same should have been taken into consideration, and by notice in writing to that effect addressed to the president at the office of the shire shall request that the consideration of such motion shall stand over until the next ordinary meeting of the council, it shall be in the discretion of a majority of the councillors then present to postpone the consideration of such motion accordingly: Provided further that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to refer to the business at any other than ordinary meetings of the council.

9. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall be, *pro hac vice*, a member of such committee, and shall convene the first meeting of such committee for the purposes of their appointment.

10. The ruling of the president or councillor acting as chairman shall be final on all questions or points of order and practices.

11. Every councillor, when proposing, seconding, or speaking to any motion or amendment, shall rise and address the president or councillor acting as chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down until such point of order shall have been decided. The subject may then be resumed or other business entered upon; and if two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president or councillor acting as chairman shall decide which of such councillors shall have precedence.

12. The mover of every motion or amendment shall state the nature of the same, and have it seconded and taken down in writing before any discussion shall take place thereon; and no councillor shall speak twice on the same question, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon an original motion or amendment of which he was the mover, and immediately after such reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

13. One amendment only shall be made and discussed at one time, but if lost another amendment may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of the original motion, and only one amendment shall be permitted thereon.

14. The president or councillor acting as chairman shall, on taking any vote, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative; and all voting shall be taken by a show of hands.

15. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives to, nor make personal reflection upon, any other councillor; and any councillor making use of any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, shall at once, if required so to do by the president or any other councillor acting as chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

16. The president or councillor acting as chairman shall call to order any councillor out of order, and if any such councillor shall refuse to obey such call, or shall refuse when called upon to withdraw any offensive expression and make a satisfactory apology to the council as in the last preceding section hereof to that intent provided, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing bye-law was passed by special order on the 6th day of March 1871, and confirmed on the 3rd day of April 1871.
