**DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for

the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the several Shires specified in the annexed Schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

**GOORAMADDA COMMON.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the notices prescribed by the said Act have been given: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

**GOORAMADDA COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, together with allotment 16 of section C, in the parish of Gooramadda, shall be and constitute a common to be designated the Gooramadda Common, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1A of section P, parish of Gooramadda, being a point on the southern side of the road from Carlyle to Belvoir; thence by that road bearing N. 81° 18' E. one hundred and thirty-six chains fifty-nine links to the north-east angle of allotment 3A of section Q; thence north, crossing the said road to the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section N; thence by that allotment bearing north seventy-three chains nineteen links; thence again by that allotment and by allotment 3 bearing N. 69° W. twenty-eight chains forty-four links; thence north to the Murray River; thence up that river to a point bearing north from the north-east angle of allotment 12 of section A; thence south one hundred and twelve chains, more or less, to the road aforesaid; thence by that road bearing north-westerly to a point bearing north from the north angle of allotment 5 of section G; thence south, crossing that road, to the said angle of that allotment; thence by a road bearing south eighty-seven chains forty-four links to the south-east angle of allotment 20; thence by a line and allotment 9 of section D bearing east twenty-eight chains seventeen links; thence south thirty chains; thence by a road bearing west twenty-eight chains seventeen links; thence

by a road bearing south sixty-one chains fifty links; thence by allotments 9 and 8 of section H bearing west fifty-two chains; thence again by allotment 8 and by a line bearing south to the south-western side of the road from Goomanadda to Chiltern; thence by that road bearing S. 34° 35' E. forty-six chains fifty links, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section L; thence by that allotment bearing west eight chains forty-two links, south thirty-four chains, and east ten chains; thence by allotment 5 bearing south thirty-one chains fifty-four links; thence S. 83° 34' W. fifty-nine chains two links to the south-east angle of allotment 8; thence by that allotment bearing north thirty-three chains one link; thence again by that allotment by a line and by allotments 3 and 4 of section M bearing west eighty-nine chains fifty links; thence again by allotment 4 bearing south thirty-five chains twenty-five links; thence S. 83° 34' W. one hundred and thirty-six chains fifty-four links to the south-west angle of allotment 1B of section T; and thence by a road bearing north two hundred and thirty-eight chains twenty-six links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. **PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act, 31 Victoria No. 310, shall apply to the shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

**THE SHIRE OF ROSEDALE.**

The deaths in April were fewer by 21 than those in March. They were also lower than the average of April during the previous ten years.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 87°8' on the 2nd, and the lowest was 39°2' on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (58°0') was 1°2' below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37°8') took place on the 2nd, viz.:—from a maximum of 87°8' to a minimum of 50°0'. The least range (10°1') was on the 23rd, viz.:—from a maximum of 67°1' to a minimum of 57°0'. The mean daily range was 22°6'. The mean atmospheric pressure (30 059 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females; 49 per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 50 per cent. in April 1870, 47 per cent. in April 1869, 52 per cent. in April 1868, 56 per cent. in April 1867, 54 per cent. in April 1866, 60 per cent. in April 1865, 62 per cent. in April 1864, 58 per cent. in April 1863, 53 per cent. in April 1862, and 58 per cent. in April 1861.

Nine persons of 75 years of age or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A female aged 75 of anasarca, a male aged 76 of heart disease, a male aged 81 of rheumatism, a male aged 83 of apoplexy, a male aged 84 of paralysis, two males aged 77 and 79, and two females aged 81 and 85 respectively of old age.

Sixteen violent deaths occurred, of which the following are the particulars:—A girl aged 5 died of an injury to the brain caused by a fall; a seaman aged 20 of the effects of a fall from the masthead of a ship; a draper aged 29 was accidentally killed by a railway engine passing over him; a printer aged 25 died of tetanus caused by an injury to the foot; a girl aged 5 was accidentally burnt to death; a boy aged 3½ was poisoned by sucking lucifer matches; a female aged 42 was accidentally poisoned; a tinsmith aged 13 and a seaman aged 28 were accidentally drowned; two newly-born female infants were wilfully murdered; a chemist aged 30 shot himself; a male aged 26 died of a self-inflicted wound in the arm; a groom aged 28 and a clerk aged 29 poisoned themselves; and a male aged 55 hanged himself.

Sixty-three deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Immigration Depot, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Police Barracks, 3 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 159, of which 86, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 46 per cent. were of females; of those dying, 99 were under one year of age, 43 were between one and two years, 11 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 168, of which 89, or 53 per cent., were males, and 79, or 47 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 7 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 14 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 7 were between fifty-five and sixty, 7 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 were eighty and upwards.

**FOOTSCRAY CEMETERY.**

**AMENDED REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE FOOTSCRAY PUBLIC CEMETERY FOR THE MANAGEMENT THEREOF, PURSUANT TO AND IN CONFORMITY WITH "THE CEMETERIES STATUTE 1864."**

**A**ll charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges hereinafter set forth, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tomb-stone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made to the said trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in Schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the said trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The said trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the said trustees or their surveyor; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 8 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 8 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours will be from 9 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and condition by and at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10. Every coffin, whether in a public or private grave, must have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, must be submitted to the said trustees for approval, who determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

12. The plans of all fences must be submitted to the said trustees for their approval.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the office, and may be inspected.

14. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tomb-stone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, or who shall behave indecorously, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

15. That all orders for burials must be given the day before the burial is to take place, unless in cases of emergency.

16. Hearses and mourning coaches only are to enter the cemetery.

17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

18. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in the charges and regulations.
