The Offices of the Registrar-General and Registrar of Titles shall be open to the public for the payment of fees, and the filing, registering, and recording of the various documents, and for the purpose of making searches, from the hour of 9.30 in the forenoon till 3 o'clock in the afternoon every day excepting Saturdays, when the offices shall be open for the above purposes till 11.30 in the forenoon.

The 13th of the Regulations of 26th July 1866 (page 1567 of that year) is hereby superseded.

## THE TOWONG ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of March 1869, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Towong Road District." And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the said road district a portion of the colony lying south of it and adjoining thereto, and not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the said Towong Road District a portion of the colony adjoining thereto (such portion not lying within the city or town above mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-

recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define the said road district added to as aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—

THE TOWONG ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the rivers Murray and Mitta-mitta; thence by the River Murray to Forest Hill; thence by the northern boundaries of Bairnsdale Shire, being by a line north-westerly about twenty-seven miles; thence by a line south-west about eight miles long to Mount Gibbo; thence by a direct line south-westerly to Mount Cooper; thence by a direct line south-westerly to Mount Wills; thence by the Dividing Range north-westerly to Mount Nelson, being the northern boundaries of the Bairnsdale Shire; thence by the western watershed of the Snowy Creek to a point due west of the junction of the Snowy Creek with the Mitta-mitta; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the Yackandandah Shire, being the eastern watershed of the Sandy Creek to the junction of the Sandy Creek and the Mitta-mitta River; and thence by the Mitta-mitta to the Murray River, being the point of commencement.

## CUTTING TIMBER ALONG THE MARGIN OF LAKE BURRUMBEET PROHIBITED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed, or otherwise authorized, shall cut timber along the margin of Lake Burrumbeet for a width of three chains.

**DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the several Shires specified in the annexed Schedule, with the exemptions specially therein named, to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

Lawrence street—From Franklyn street to Adair street. Camp street—From Templeton street to Harker street. Templeton street—From Camp street to Edward street. Miller street—The whole. Evans street—The whole.
Shire of Dundas, "parish of Bochara" only	So much of the parish of Bochara as lies within one mile of the township of Redruth.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown land as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*

diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the notices prescribed by the said Act have been given: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

**AXEDALE AND EPPALOCK UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Axedale and Eppalock United Town and Farmers' Common, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 15th day of September 1862, the 13th day of November 1862, and the 5th day of November 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the two areas, the respective boundaries whereof are shown on a plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne, and described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 6 of section 3, parish of Eppalock; thence by the north-western boundary of the Kimbolton run bearing south-westerly one hundred and fifteen chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing S. 60° E. sixty chains, more or less, to the western boundary of allotment 8 of section 4; and thence by the western boundaries of sections 4 and 3 bearing N. 30° E. one hundred and five chains, more or less, to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage about 300 acres.

Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 5 of section 5, parish of Eppalock; thence by a line bearing N. 60° W. one hundred chains, more or less, to the north-western boundary of the Kimbolton run; thence by that boundary and a line bearing south-westerly two hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to the north boundary of the parish of Lyell; thence by that boundary bearing east one hundred and forty chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment 2 of section 9, parish of Eppalock; and thence by sections 9, 8, and 5 bearing north, east, and N. 30° E. to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage about 1450 acres.—(70 & 23829.)

**ELMHURST TOWN COMMON.**—The Elmhurst Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 29th day of June 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing on the Wimmera River at the point where the north-western boundary of the town of Elmhurst abuts thereon; thence by that river upwards to a point distant in a direct line three miles from the point of commencement; thence by a line bearing S. 33° W. four miles, more or less, to the western boundary of the Glenlogie run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run northerly and north-easterly to a point bearing S. 15° E. from the south angle of the land purchased by James Grant under the 31st section of *The Land Act 1869*; thence to the said angle of that land by a line bearing N. 15° W. one hundred and thirty-three chains fifty links, more or less; thence by that land bearing N. 33° 15' E. ten chains, and N. 54° 45' W. nine chains fifty links; and thence by a line and the north-western boundary of the town of Elmhurst bearing N. 35° 15' E. one hundred and seven chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage about 5000 acres.—(71 B.6300.)

**EVERSLEY AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Eversley Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 4th day of December 1867 and the 30th day of August 1869, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 5, parish of Eversley; thence by a road bearing north fifty chains; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and ninety-one chains; thence by a road bearing south fifty chains; and thence by a road bearing east one hundred and ninety-one chains to the point of commencement.—Area added to common 955 acres.—(70 X.23,764.)

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Local Government Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining

to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added. And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of September 1856, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Upper Yarra Road District": And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November 1866, the said road district was divided into electoral subdivisions: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add to the said road district a portion of the colony lying south of it and adjoining thereto, and not lying within the limits of the abovementioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the south-western and eastern subdivisions of the said Upper Yarra Road District a portion of the colony adjoining thereto (such portion not lying within the city or town above mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do re-define the south-western and the eastern subdivisions of the said road district added to as aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE SOUTH-WESTERN SUBDIVISION.**—Commencing at the centre of the Yarra Yarra opposite the north-west corner of the parish of Warrandyte; thence southerly and easterly by the west and south boundaries of the said parish to the south-east corner of allotment 41; thence north to the south-west corner of section 13; thence east by south boundary of said section to the centre of the road opposite the north-west corner of allotment 9, Mooroolbark; thence south by the centre of said road to the south-west corner of the parish of Mooroolbark; thence east and north and west by the north boundaries of said parish; thence north and west by the east and west boundaries of the parish of Warrandyte to the commencing point.

**THE EASTERN SUBDIVISION.**—Commencing at the junction of the county boundaries of Evelyn with the south boundary of the parish of Mooroolbark; thence south and east by county boundaries of Evelyn and Mornington to the source of the main eastern branch of the Worri Yalook Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the said creek to the south boundary of the parish of Gruyere; thence east and north by the boundaries of the parish of Gruyere, and including said parish, to the eastern boundary of the parish of Mooroolbark; thence by the east and south boundary of this parish to the commencing point.

# REGULATIONS RELATING TO GOLD MINING LEASES.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of June One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Sir James McCulloch	Mr. Wilson

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the *Mining Statute* 1865, doth hereby rescind clause numbered twenty-nine of the regulations made by the Governor in Council on the twenty-third day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and Schedule F of the said regulations, and in lieu thereof doth hereby make the following regulation, that is to say:—

29. The lease to be issued by the Governor to the applicant, under the said recited regulations made on the twenty-third day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, shall be in the form and shall contain the reservations, covenants, and provisions set out in Schedule F hereto, or with such modifications and additions as the circumstances of the case may require, or as the Governor in Council may think proper.

And the Governor in Council doth hereby add to the said regulations made on the twenty-third day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one as follows—which addition shall be read with and form part of the said regulations—intituled "Holders of miners' rights may apply for leased land upon a breach of the covenants and conditions of lease."

49. When an application under clause forty-four of the said regulations has been referred to the Warden, the Warden shall also enquire respecting the value to the holder or holders of a miner's right or rights making such application for any work and labor then done on, or within, or beneath the leased land and premises which, in the Warden's opinion, is available for or necessary to any future mining operations; and in case the lease shall be forfeited and declared void, the said holder or holders of a miner's right or rights making the said application under clause forty-four of the said regulations shall not receive a lease of the land applied for until he or they shall have deposited with the Warden for payment to the person or persons entitled to the former lease the amount found by the Warden as the value of the said work and labor: Provided that no sum shall be allowed or paid for any such work or labor in any case where it is proved, to the satisfaction of the Warden, that the lessee or lessees, his or their executors, administrators or transferees, have neglected to fulfill the covenants of the lease for a period of twelve months previous, the said application having been made by the holder or holders of a miner's right or rights.

## SCHEDULE F.—(Rule 29.)

This indenture, made the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, A.D. 18\_\_\_\_, between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part, and [not more than five names will be inserted] (hereinafter called the lessee) of the other part. Witnesseth that in consideration of the rents hereinafter reserved and of the covenants and provisions hereinafter contained, Her Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise unto the lessee, his executors, administrators and transferees, all that piece of land particularly described in the First Schedule hereto, and delineated and colored yellow on the map hereon endorsed or hereunto annexed, and all mines of gold in, on, and under the land (hereinafter called "the said mine.") together with all and singular shafts, levels, drifts, works, ways, fixtures, erections, liberties, easements, advantages, and appurtenances which are now or at any time during the term hereby granted may be held, occupied or enjoyed therewith for the purpose of mining on the said land for gold, and also with full power for the said lessee, his executors, administrators and transferees, and (his and) their agents and workmen to dig, sink, drive, make and use excavations, pits, shafts, levels, watercourses, and other works necessary for working, winning, and raising the gold in, on, or under the said land, and to take and appropriate the same during the term hereby granted, and to make and construct on the said land races, drains, dams, reservoirs, roads, and tramways; and also to erect all buildings, engines, furnaces, pumps, machinery and things necessary for the purpose of winning and obtaining the gold in or under the said land, and for effectually carrying on the works of the said mine; and also to erect on the said land such offices, cottages, and dwelling-houses for the use of the persons and workmen employed in the said mine and works as the said lessee, his executors, administrators or transferees shall think proper: to hold the said land, mine, and premises with the appurtenances (subject nevertheless to such right, interests, and authorities as may be lawfully sub-lying therein at the date of these presents) unto the said lessee, his executors, administrators and transferees from the date hereof for the term of \_\_\_\_\_ years next ensuing, for the purpose of gold mining and for no other purpose, yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year unto Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors during the said term the yearly rent of \_\_\_\_\_ (at the rate of £1 per acre) by equal

half-yearly payments of \_\_\_\_\_ each to be made in advance, the first payment to be made on the day of the date hereof, and the next payment on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ next, and the succeeding payments respectively to be made on the same days in each succeeding year, clear of all rates, taxes, and assessments to which the said land, mine, and premises are now or at any time during the said term may be subject or liable. Provided always and it is hereby agreed that if the said half-yearly rent shall be in arrear for twenty-one days after the same shall have become payable, or if any other

sum of money hereby covenanted to be paid shall be in arrear twenty-one days after the time appointed for payment thereof, whether such rent or sum of money shall have been legally demanded or not, any Bailiff of Crown Lands may, by himself or his agents, enter upon the said land, and seize and distrain all gold, and rock or earth containing gold, actually gotten, and all machinery, apparatus, tools, wagons, carts, carriages, engines, plant, live and dead stock, and all other goods, chattels, and effects whatsoever in, upon, and about the said land and premises; and every distress then made may take away, sell, and dispose of, as in cases of distress for rent reserved in common leases, and out of the moneys arising thereby retain so much as shall be sufficient to satisfy the said arrears and other payments, and which shall at the time of such sale be unpaid, and all expenses incurred by him or them; and if any surplus, the same to be paid to the said lessee, his executors, administrators or transferees.

And the said lessee do hereby for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and transferees covenant with Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, in manner following, that is to say:

1. That the said lessee, his executors, administrators, and transferees shall and will during the said term pay unto Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, the rent hereby reserved, at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. And shall and will, except when prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs, make, construct, and work the said land, mine, and premises in the best and most effectual manner and without interruption. And shall and will diligently explore and search for gold, and work the said land, mine, and premises to the best advantage.

3. And shall and will employ in the construction of the works, or in mining operations on or under the said land, during the first month of the said term and during the usual hours of labor, able and competent workmen and miners at the least, and during the remainder of the said term not less than \_\_\_\_\_ such miners and workmen; unless prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs.

4. And shall and will, during the said term, effectually drain the said mine, and pump out all water likely to cause injury thereto, or which would prevent or interfere with the working thereof, and if the said mine shall be affected, or liable to be affected, by the same flow or body of water as any other mine or mines contiguous thereto, shall and will contribute with the lessee or lessees, or owner or owners of such other mine or mines, a reasonable proportion of the machinery and labor necessary to free and keep free such mine or mines from water to a workable extent, or if the said mine shall be kept free from water to a workable extent, whether wholly or partially by means of the machinery and labor of a contiguous mine or mines, then shall and will pay for and on behalf of the lessee or lessees, owner or owners of such contiguous mine or mines, a reasonable proportion of the expenses of such machinery and labor; the Minister of Mines for the time being to depute some efficient person who shall have access to, and inspection of, all such mines to determine when the said mine is so freed or kept free wholly or partially from water, and what are the reasonable proportions of the expenses afore-said, and to whom and when the same are to be paid; such decision to be final and conclusive on all parties.

5. And shall and will make such provision for the disposal of the detritus, dirt, waste, workings, or refuse of the said mine, so that the same shall not be an inconvenience, nuisance, or obstruction to any roads, ways, rivers, creeks, or private or Crown lands, or in any manner occasion any public or private damage or inconvenience.

6. And shall and will make such provisions for decency, and the observance of sanitary regulations, as the Minister of Mines for the time being shall approve of or direct.

7. And shall and will erect and keep erected, during the said term, posts not less than two feet six inches high above the ground, and painted white, so as accurately to define the boundary-line and angles of the said land, and so that each post shall be visible from those nearest to it on each side.

8. And shall and will, if required by the Minister of Mines, erect and keep in repair a substantial wall or fence round each of the shafts, at any time during the said term, open on any part of the said land or used for the purpose of the said mine so as effectually to prevent all accidental access thereto; and when the Minister of Mines for the time being, or other person authorized in that behalf, shall consider any such shaft unnecessary, and shall by certificate under his hand notify the same, then shall and will effectually fill up and substantially enclose the same.

9. And shall and will, as often as required so to do during the said term, make and deliver to the Secretary for Mines for the time being, or other officer appointed for that purpose, all such true and proper plans and sections, returns, statistics, and particulars made up to the last day of the preceding month of the workings and operations of the said mine, as shall be in accordance with the rules and directions from time to time issued by the Minister of Mines, or other officer authorized so to do, the same to be accompanied with a statutory declaration of the truth and correctness thereof by the lessee of the said mine, his executors, administrators or transferees, or such other person as the said minister shall direct.

10. And shall and will, during the said term, make proper and reasonable compensation to the occupier or occupiers or lessee or lessees from the Crown of any adjoining land in respect of any damage which may be sustained by him or them by the working of the said mine, or the carrying on the works thereof, or by any other works connected therewith, such compensation to be determined by the Minister of Mines, or other person authorized by him so to do.

11. And further, shall and will at all times during the said term, keep and preserve the said mine and premises from all unnecessary injury or damage, and also the levels, drifts, shafts, watercourses, roads, ways, works, buildings, erections, and fix-

tures therein and thereon in good repair and condition, except such of the matters and things last aforesaid as shall from time to time be considered by a mining surveyor, or other proper officer, to be unnecessary for the working of the said mine or any contiguous mine, and in such state and condition shall and will at the end, or other sooner determination of the said term, deliver peaceable possession thereof and of all and singular the premises hereby demised to Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, or to the warden, or other officer authorized to receive possession thereof.

12. And shall and will observe, perform, and fulfil the stipulations, covenants, and provisos which way be contained in the Second Schedule hereto :

13. And shall not nor will use or occupy, or permit to be used or occupied, the said land for other than mining purposes, or for pasturage, or as garden ground for the persons employed in, on, or about the said mine.

14. And shall not nor will cut any timber on the said land, except for the mining operation hereby authorized and for the domestic purposes of those residing on the said land.

15. And shall not nor will transfer, underlet, or part with the possession of the said land, mine, and premises, or any part thereof, or mortgage, charge or encumber the same without the license of the person for the time being authorized to grant leases of Crown lands for mining purposes: Provided that no such license shall be necessary in cases where by operation of law or otherwise a sale of the said land, mine and premises, or any part or parts thereof is made by any person or persons entitled to sell the same for the benefit of the creditors, or a creditor, of the lessee or h transferees.

16. And shall and will permit the Chief Mining Surveyor, or his deputy, or other duly authorized person, with all proper assistants, at all reasonable times during the said term, quietly to enter into and upon the said land, mine, and premises, to survey and examine the state and condition thereof, and for the purposes aforesaid, to descend all pits and shafts, and to use all roads, ways, engines, ropes, machinery, gear, labor, and other things in or on the said land and mine which shall be deemed necessary by him, without making any compensation for the same, so nevertheless that in so doing no unnecessary interference is caused with the carrying on of the said mining works.

17. And shall not nor will close up or obstruct any adit or adits to or from any contiguous mine or mines whereby fresh air is admitted or ventilation promoted.

Provided always, and it is hereby agreed and declared in manner following:

18. That it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, Her heirs, successors, and assigns to make and use in, on, or under the said land any levels, drifts, leads, shafts, watercourse, adits, roads, ways, and passages for freeing and keeping free any other lands or mines from water, or for conveying water to any other lands or mines for mining purposes, or for supplying any other mines with fresh air, or for effectually working any other mines, or for any public purpose whatsoever, causing as little damage, obstruction, or interference as possible to or with the said mine and the works thereof.

19. And it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, Her heirs, successors, and assigns to take, carry away, and use any sand, stone, gravel, clay, or timber, in, on, or under the said land for any public purpose whatsoever; and all proper facilities for the purposes aforesaid shall be given by the lessee, h executors, administrators, or transferees: And that if at any time during the said term any part or parts of the said land shall be required for sale or any railway, road, canal, aqueduct, watercourse, reservoir, or any public purpose, it shall be lawful for the Governor for the time being, on giving three months' notice of his intention so to do, to cause to be set out the part or parts of the said land which shall be so required; and so soon as the same shall be so set out, such part or parts of the said land shall cease to be included in the lands hereby granted, and the lessee, h executors, administrators, or transferees shall not be entitled to any abatement of rent or any compensation whatever in respect thereof.

20. And if the lessee h executors, administrators, or transferees shall prove to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, that on account of unexpected or unforeseen difficulties in exploring or working the said land, mine, or premises, or by reason of the want of water, or on account of having too much water upon or in the said land, mine, or premises, or for want of machinery, or (when a company are the beneficial owners of the said land, mine, or premises) from exhaustion of capital of the company, or the necessity for the reconstruction of such company, or for, from, or on account of any other cause whatever which the Governor in Council shall deem sufficient, the lessee h executors, administrators, or transferees, shall be unable to employ the number of men hereby covenanted to be employed, the Governor in Council may, by order in writing if he shall think fit, but not otherwise, from time to time waive and dispense with the compliance of the covenants for the employment of workmen and miners, and respecting the working of the mine, for any period not exceeding six calendar months.

21. And lastly, that if the lessee, h executors, administrators, or transferees shall at any time during the said term fail to use such land *bona fide* for the purpose for which it has been demised, or if and whenever the said rent, or any other payment hereby covenanted to be made, shall be in arrear for ten days after the time appointed for payment thereof, whether the same shall have been legally demanded or not, or if and whenever there shall be a breach of or non-compliance with the covenants and provisos herein contained by the lessee, h executors, administrators, or transferees, and the lessee, h executors, administrators, or transferees shall not have obtained an Order in Council under the last preceding clause of these presents, in case the breach shall have been for the non-compliance of the covenants for the employment of workmen or miners, or for the working of the mine, the Governor in Council, who alone and finally shall judge and determine the

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (31 Vict. No 337, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of the *Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in each of the road districts hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in each of such districts, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be shires: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road Districts hereinafter mentioned to be Shires within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE LANCEFIELD ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of July 1862, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the nineteenth day of April 1869, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF ROMSEY.

THE RUTHERGLEN ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a proclamation bearing date the eighth day of September 1862, and was altered and re-defined by a proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July 1863, and was divided into electoral subdivisions by an Order of the eighth day of February 1869, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-fourth day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four the Shire of Warrnambool was divided into three separate ridings the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the east Riding of the Shire of Warrnambool therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Warrnambool, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the west Riding of the Shire of Hampden: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said west Riding of the Shire of Hampden and of the east Riding of the said Shire of Warrnambool in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.—Commencing at the intersection of the Darlington to the Cressy main road with the western boundary of the parish of Tooloork; thence south along the western boundary of the parishes of Tooloork, Ettrick, Tararua, and part of Karuah to the shore of Lake Colongulac; thence south-westerly by the shore of that lake to the south boundary of the parish of Koort-koort-nang; thence west by the said south boundary and part of the south boundary of the parish of Kilnoorat to the north-west angle of the parish of Colongulac; thence south by the western boundary of the parishes of Colongulac and Tandaroak to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence east by the northern boundary of the parish of Jaucourt to the north-east corner of that parish; thence south by the eastern boundary of the last-named parish to its south-east angle; thence by a line bearing due south to the sea-coast; thence westwardly by the sea-coast to the mouth of Curdie's River; thence northerly by the course of that river to the intersection of the road on the south margin of the parish of Brucknell; thence west by that road to the south-west angle of said parish; thence north by the road on the west margin of the parishes of Brucknell and Ecklin, and by the parish boundary of Ecklin to the Mount Emu Creek; thence westwardly by the course of that creek to the intersection of the three chain road on the western boundary of allotment 13 B in the parish of Garvoc; thence northerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 12 in said parish; thence north-easterly by the road on the north of said allotment 12, and of allotments 4, 3, and 2 of said parish to its junction with the road on the east of said allotment 2; thence northerly by the western boundary of the shire of Hampden to the intersection of the main road from Darlington to Lismore; thence easterly by that road to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.—Commencing at the Hopkins River, on the boundary between the shires of Mortlake and Warrnambool; thence east by the said boundary to the western boundary of the Shire of Hampden; thence southerly, westerly, and southerly by said boundary to centre of the road opposite the north-east angle of allotment 2 in the parish of Garvoc; thence southerly and westerly, and westerly by the road on the north of said allotment and allotments 3, 4, and 12 in the said parish, to its junction with a three chain road bounding allotments 12 and 13 B on the west; thence southerly by the same three chain road to Mount Emu Creek; thence easterly by the course of that creek to the north-west angle of the parish of Ecklin; thence south by said parish boundary and by the road on the west margin of the parishes of Ecklin and Brucknell to the south-west angle of last said parish; thence east by the road on the south margin of the said parish of Brucknell to its intersection with Curdie's River; thence southerly by the course of that river to the sea-coast;

thence westerly by the sea-coast to the Hopkins River; thence by the course of the said river to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Wilson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 7) it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may from time to time alter and adjust the boundaries of a shire or road district, or of a shire and borough or shire and road district, and may unite two or more road districts into a shire, or unite one or more other order, within three months after such adjustment, give directions with respect to all or any matters, things, questions, liabilities, differences, or disputes whatsoever connected with or arising out of such adjustment, and all such directions shall have the force of law and be binding on all persons whomsoever: provided that the yearly income of rates derivable to such shire or borough so constituted by union shall not be less than One thousand pounds sterling, based upon a rate not exceeding one shilling in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable property under the jurisdiction of such shire or borough respectively; provided also that the powers conferred upon the Governor by this section shall be exercised upon the petition of the ratepayers of the shire, borough, or district affected thereby, in the same manner as is hereinafter provided in the case of the constitution of shires: And whereas by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act* (34 Vict. No. 357, § 4) it is amongst other things enacted, that the seventh section of *The Shires Statute* shall be read as if after the words following, that is to say, "with a borough," there were inserted the words "so as to constitute a shire," and all the provisions of *The Shires Statute* touching the "union of two or more road districts into a shire," shall be applied, so far as possible, in the case of the union of road districts with a borough under the said section as amended hereby; for the purposes of the said section, as so amended, *The Shires Statute* shall, where necessary to give full effect to its provisions, be read as if the several words and expressions contained therein included the words and expressions in *The Boroughs Statute* denoting a like subject matter: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, "The Fryer's Road District" was constituted; and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the boundaries thereof were altered and re-defined: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, "The Campbell's Creek Road District" was constituted: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the Borough of Guildford was constituted: And whereas the yearly income of rates derivable to the shire hereby constituted by union will be not less than One thousand pounds sterling, based upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable property under the jurisdiction of such shire: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Acts above recited are now exercised upon petitions of the ratepayers of the said respective road districts and borough first recited affected thereby in the same manner as is provided in the tenth section of the Act, and notices of such petitions have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter-petitions have been presented to the Governor praying him not to grant the prayer of the petitions above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order unite the two road districts respectively designated the Fryer's Road District and the Campbell's Creek Road District with the Borough of Guildford into a Shire, and doth hereby constitute the same to be a Shire within the meaning of the said Acts, and doth set forth the name and the boundaries of such Shire in manner following, that is to say:—

THE UNITED SHIRE OF MOUNT ALEXANDER.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Yandoit; thence by the north boundary of that parish bearing westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 21, section 14, in the parish of Guildford; thence by the west boundary of section 14 bearing north to the south-west angle of the township reserve of Guildford; thence by the west boundary of that reserve bearing north to a point thereon bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 2, parish of Guildford; thence by a line bearing west fifty links; thence by a line following the centre of the road forming the east boundary of the last-named allotment bearing north twenty chains (more or less) to the River Loddon; thence crossing that river by a line bearing south-westerly to the southern angle of allotment 33 of section 6; thence by the west boundary of that allotment bearing north forty chains fifty-three links to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing east fifty links; thence by a line following the centre of the

**HEXHAM CLEAN DISTRICT**.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line northerly to the most southern point of Lake Corangamite; thence along the western border of that lake to the Pappurndahl run; thence northerly along the western boundaries of the Pappurndahl run, of the Little Corangamite or Struan run, of the Gerangemera, and of the Gnarkeet run, and the western boundary of that run to the southern boundary of the Borriyallock run; thence along the southern and western boundaries of that run and along the eastern boundary of Bangal run to Skipton; thence westerly along the three-chain road to Dunkeld; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon Plains run, of Mount Sturgeon Plains South run along the southern boundary of that run and of the Crookstone run to the Eumeralla River; thence down that river to the sea, and thence to the mouth of the Moyne River; thence northerly by the Moyne River to the point at which that river is intersected by the southern boundary of the Tarrone estate; thence westerly and northerly by the south and west boundaries of the Tarrone estate to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section 22, parish of Kapong; thence northerly by a one-chain road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 11, same parish; thence easterly by a one-chain road to the north-east angle of same allotment; thence northerly to a point one chain distant at the south-west angle of allotment 3, section 11, same parish; thence northerly to the north-west angle of allotment 2, section 11, same parish; thence easterly by a one-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 12, same parish; thence southerly by the boundary between the parishes of Kapong and Willatook to the point at which the boundary between the runs of Tarrone and Woodlands intersects the parish boundary (then as delineated on the Government survey plans); thence southerly and easterly by said boundary of runs to the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 26, parish of Willatook; thence easterly by a one-chain road to the north-east angle of said allotment; thence easterly to a point two chains distant at north-west angle of allotment 1, section 25, same parish; thence easterly by a one-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 25, same parish; thence easterly to a point three chains distant at north-west angle of allotment 1, section 24, same parish; thence easterly by a one-chain road to north-east angle of allotment 2, section 24, same parish; thence southerly by a one-chain road to the north-east angle of allotment 3, section C, parish Warrong; thence easterly by the boundaries of the parishes of Warrong and Willatook to the west boundary of the parish of Woolsthorpe; thence southerly by the boundary of the parishes of Warrong and Woolsthorpe to the south-west angle of allotment 1, section 30, parish of Woolsthorpe; thence easterly and north-easterly by the south boundary of the parish of Woolsthorpe from the point where it meets the road from Woolsthorpe to Winslow; thence to the eastern side of that road; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 34, section C, parish of Merrai; thence easterly by a one-chain road to the south-west angle of section 19, parish of Cooramook; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of section 25, same parish; thence easterly by the north boundary of the parish of Cooramook to the Hopkins River; thence southerly by the Hopkins River to the sea; thence easterly by the sea to Cape Otway:

**BENALLA CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2** (*in lieu of Benalla Clean District No. 2, constituted by an Order of 12 December 1870, which has been revoked*):—Comprising the following runs, viz.: Emu, Tatong, Sanorin, Fern Hills, Barjarg, Duoran, Fifteen-mile Creek, Whitefield, Whitefield West, Tabletop, Glenmore, Holland's Creek, Mokoan; Myrthee West, and Killeera: Commencing at the west angle of the Mokoan run, being a point of the Broken River; thence by the north-western and eastern boundaries of that run to the Emu run; thence easterly by that run to the Killeera run; thence by that run easterly and southerly to the Myrthee West run; thence by that run north-easterly to the Myrthee run; thence by that run southerly and easterly to the King River; thence up that river to its source; thence by a line bearing southerly to the source of the Broken River; thence down that river to the Barjarg run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Broken River; thence again down that river to the point of commencement. **KILMORE CLEAN DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Wharparilla run, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the Burnewang East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Caragrag run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Wanalta West run; thence by the northern, western, and south-western boundaries of that run; thence by the southern boundary of the Wanalta East run to the south-west angle of Toolamba run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence down that river to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

**SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 1**.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrumbidgee run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reddy Lake run to the Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Conover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brennanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western, southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to Bullock Creek; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the Yarraberb and Tandarra runs; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaninny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the commencing point: Provided that allotment 96 in the parish of Kinypania, known as Mackin's farm, and allotments 10 and 12, parish of Powlett, known as Clancy's farm, shall form no part of this Clean District.

**SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2**.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Yarraberb run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run and the western boundary of the Tandarra run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaninny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; thence up that river to the north-eastern angle of that run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the northern boundary of the Burnewang West run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run; thence by the southern boundary thereof to the western boundary of the Campaspe River run; and thence by the said boundary of that run to the commencing point.

**WIMMERRA CLEAN DISTRICT**.—Commencing on the Murray River at the point where the western boundary of the colony of Victoria abuts thereon; thence up that river to the eastern boundary of the Murrumbidgee run; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reddy Lake run to the Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern

boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs, also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Avoca Forest West run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run to the Avoca River aforesaid; thence again up that river to the Mountain Creek; thence up that Creek to the south angle of the Moyreisk run; thence by the boundaries of that run northwesterly, northerly, westerly, southerly, and north-westerly to the Strathfillan run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Ramsbottom run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run and by the southern boundaries of the Totlington and Bolangum runs to the Glenwyllan run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Newington run; thence by the southern boundaries of the Newington and Ledcourt runs, by the eastern and southern boundaries of the Wartook run, and by the southern boundary of the Rosebrook run to the Brim Spring run; thence by the south-eastern boundary of that run to the Glenisla run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of that run to the Glenelg River; thence down that river to the Fulham run; thence by the south-eastern and western boundaries of that run to the before-mentioned Glenelg River; thence again down that river to Power's Creek, which forms the north-eastern boundary of the Buckle-Kipple run; thence by the said boundary of that run and the southern boundaries of that and Bogalara runs to the Dergholm run; thence by the northern and north-western boundaries of that run to the Elderslie run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the western boundary of the colony aforesaid; and thence by that boundary bearing north to the commencing point.

#### REGULATIONS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

**WHEREAS** by section 78 of *The Scab Act 1870* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for determining the powers and duties of inspectors for the release of sheep placed in quarantine, and for any other purpose whatsoever connected with the execution of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth repeal the regulations of the twenty-second day of December 1870, published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of December 1870, and doth by this present Order make the regulations following:—

##### AUTHORITIES AS TO QUARANTINE DISTRICTS.

1. No inspector shall give the written authority provided for by section 65 of the said Act to drive any travelling sheep into any quarantine district from any place without the boundaries thereof until he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Board of Advice for the district in which he is acting to the giving of such authority.

2. No authority shall be given by any inspector for the removal from any quarantine district of any sheep "kept" within a quarantine district without the written authority of the chief inspector, or the officer acting for him in his absence.

##### AUTHORITIES AS TO CLEAN DISTRICTS.

3. No inspector of sheep shall give the authority provided for by section 67 of the said Act, to drive sheep into a clean district, except the inspector of such clean district, and he only when the following conditions have been complied with:—

(a.) On receiving, through the inspector of the district in which the sheep are being depastured, a written application from the owner, stating the number, ages, sexes, and brands of the sheep which he desires to drive into a clean district, the run on which they are being depastured, and the route by which it is proposed to enter the clean district, and the statutory declaration made by the said owner of the truth of the following matters, viz.: That to the best of his belief none of the sheep are infected; that all of them have been entirely free from scab for a period of not less than four months preceding the making of the declaration, and that during such period no infected sheep have been found amongst them; that during such period none of them have been on any road or run, or in any yard or enclosure in which infected sheep have been during such period; and that none of them have been dressed for the cure or prevention of scab during such period.

(b.) On receiving from the inspector in whose district the sheep are being depastured a written statement that he has no reason to doubt the correctness of the declaration above mentioned in any particular. And in no case shall any such authority be granted if the inspector from whom the same is received shall be of opinion that the granting of the authority will not be approved of by the Board of Advice for his own district.

4. If the application be granted the authority shall state the number and particulars of the sheep, the road or route to which it extends, and the time for which it is to remain in force, and shall be in the form or to the effect of that in Schedule A hereto, and signed by the inspector granting the same.

5. Every such license shall be revoked by any inspector if it shall be ascertained by any inspector that any statement contained in the declaration upon which the authority was granted was incorrect, or that any part of the road or route mentioned in the authority is infected.

6. Such authority shall be revoked by notice of revocation signed by an inspector specifying the cause of revocation, and every such notice shall be in the form or to the effect of that in Schedule B hereto, and shall be delivered to the person in charge of the sheep to which the authority to be revoked relates, and the inspector revoking the authority shall keep a copy of the notice of revocation and endorse thereon the date of service.

7. Immediately upon service of notice of revocation the revoked authority shall be thereby absolutely determined; but if sheep have been removed under such authority the person in charge may return with such sheep along the road or route by which they have travelled.

#### RELEASE OF SHEEP FROM QUARANTINE.

8. Application for release from quarantine of sheep placed in quarantine must be made, in writing, by the "owner" to the inspector of the district in which the sheep are, supported by his statutory declaration of the truth of the following matters:—

- That all the sheep as to which the application is made, are, to the best of his belief, free from scab.
- That, to the best of his belief, no scab has existed in any of the flocks placed in quarantine at any time during four months preceding the making of the declaration.
- That no sheep on any run on which the sheep in quarantine have been kept, have been dressed for scab during the like period.
- That no sheep on such run having doubtful symptoms of scab have been killed or made away with during the like period.

The inspector shall endorse on the application any remarks he desires to make thereon, and lay the application before the Board of Advice of his district at their next meeting, and the board shall in like manner endorse their remarks, and the application and declaration shall then be returned to the inspector, and forthwith transmitted by him to the chief inspector for his approval.

#### INTERPRETATION OF WORDS.

9. The words "kept," "owner," "run," and "infected" where used in these regulations shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the meaning assigned to them in and by *The Scab Act 1870*.

*Bye-law No. 28 of the Council of the Borough of Brighton, made under section numbered 168 of, and the 12th schedule to the Borough Statute, for the purpose of adopting subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11 of part 1; the whole of parts 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9; the subdivisions 3 and 4 of part 10 and part 11.*

IN pursuance of section 163 of the 12th schedule to the *Boroughs Statute*, the Council of the Borough of Brighton ordain as follows, (that is to say):—

i. The subdivisions 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 11, of part 1; the whole of parts 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9; the subdivisions 3 and 4 of part 10 and part 11 of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough.

Bye-law No. 1, entitled—Standing rules and orders to regulate the proceedings of the Council of the Municipal District of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 4, entitled—To empower the Municipal Council of Brighton to stop up or close against public traffic any street, road, way, or footpath, during the progress of works.

Bye-law No. 5, entitled—A bye-law for the regulation of bathing on the sea-coast within the Municipal District of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 8, entitled—For the regulation of water carriers.

Bye-law No. 9, entitled—For the regulation of shades or awnings over or across the public footpaths within the Municipal District of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 11, entitled—For determining the validity of disputed elections, and regulating the proceedings at the election of chairman.

Bye-law No. 12, entitled—To regulate the calling and conducting public meetings of ratepayers in the Municipal District of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 14, entitled—For regulating the roadways for carts and other wheeled vehicles across footpaths.

Bye-law No. 15, entitled—For the proper cleansing of buildings, lands, streets, roads, and thoroughfares.

Bye-law No. 16, entitled—For preventing the danger created by the negligent or wilful throwing about of glass bottles, broken earthenware, or other dangerous rubbish.

Bye-law No. 17, entitled—For preventing damage to trees or shrubs.

Bye-law No. 18, entitled—For regulating the width of future streets.

Bye-law No. 19, entitled—For regulating the straying of cattle, &c., within the Municipality.

Bye-law No. 20, entitled—For preventing danger or nuisance from insufficient or improperly constructed chimneys, &c.

Bye-law No. 21, entitled—For preventing the erection or repair of canvas, calico, felt, or other dangerously inflammable buildings.

Bye-law No. 23, entitled—For the prevention of horse racing, furious riding or driving, through the streets, roads, and thoroughfares, within the Municipal District of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 24, entitled—For preventing the use of firearms within the Municipality of Brighton.

Bye-law No. 25, entitled—To regulate the trade of butchers within the Municipal District of Brighton.
