CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY GRANTED BY THE STEAM NAVIGATION BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE STEAM NAVIGATION BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Governor has directed the Order of Her Majesty in Council hereinafter set forth, whereby it is declared that Certificates of Competency granted by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria to Masters, Mates, or Engineers of British sea-going steam ships shall be of the same force as those issued by the Imperial Government, and also the Memorandum which accompanied the order to be published.

WHEBRAS by The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act 1869, it is among other things enacted that where the Legislature of any British possession provides for the examination of, and grant of certificates of competency to, persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British ships, and the Board of Trade reports to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like nuamer, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council—

To declare that the said certificates shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts: No. 50.-JULY 14, 1871.-1.

To declare that all or any of the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency granted under those Acts shall apply to the certificates referred to in the said Order:

To impose such conditions and to make such regulations with respect to the said certificates, and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and suspension thereof, as to Her Majesty may seem fit, and to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach of such conditions and regulations:

And that upon the publication in the London Gazette of any such Order in Council as last aforesaid, the provisions therein contained shall from a date to be mentioned for the purpose in such Order, take effect as if they had been contained in the Act; and that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to revoke any Order made under this section:

And whereas the Legislature of the British possession of Victoria has provided for the examination of and grant of certificates of competency for the foreign trade to persons intending to act as masters, mates, or engineers on board British seagoing steam-ships, which certificates are hereinafter denominated Colonial Certificates of Competency, and the Board of Trade have reported to Her Majesty that they are satisfied that the said examinations are so conducted as to be equally efficient as the examinations for the same purpose in the United Kingdom, under the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and that the certificates are granted on such principles as to show the like qualifications and competency as those granted under the said Acts, and are liable to be forfeited for the like reasons and in the like manner:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the power vested

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased—

n Her by the said recited Act, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased—

(1.) To declare that the said colonial certificates of competency granted by the Steam Navigation Board of Victoria appointed by the Government of the said possession of Victoria, shall be of the same force as if they had been granted under the said Acts.

(2.) To declare that all the provisions of the said Acts which relate to certificates of competency for the foreign trade granted under those Acts, except so much of the 139th section of The Merchant Shipping Act ISS4 and the 10th section of The Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1862, as requires the delivery by the Board of Trade to any master, mate, or engineer of a copy of any certificate to which he appears to be entitled as therein mentioned, so much of the third paragraph of the 23rd section of the said last-mentioned Act as requires at the conclusion of a case relating to the cancelling or suspended to be forwarded to the Board of Trade, and the whole of the provisions of the fourth paragraph of the same section, shall apply to such colonial certificates of competency.

(3.) To impose and make the conditions and regulations following, numbered 1 to 10 respectively, with respect to the said colonial certificates of competency and to the use, issue, delivery, cancellation, and su-pension thereof, and to impose for the breach of such conditions and regulations the penalties therein mentioned.

Form of Certificates.

Form of Certificate.

1. Every such colonial certificate of competency shall be on parchment, and as nearly as possible similar in shape and form to the corresponding certificate of competency for the foreign trade granted by the Board of Trade under the Acts relating to merchant shipping.

Name of Possession to be inserted.

2. Every such colonial certificate of competency shall have the name of the said possession of Victoria inserted prominently on its face and back.

Certificates to be Numbered Consecutively.

3. Such colonial certificates of competency shall be numbered in consecutive order.

Lists of Certificates granted, cancelled, &c., to be sent to Registrar-General of Seamen.

4. The Government of the said possession shall furnish the Registrar-General of Seaman in London from time to time with accurate lists of all such colonial certificates of competency as may be granted by them as aforesaid, or as may, for any cause whatsoever, be cancelled, suspended, renewed or re-issued.

Three years domicile of Service necessary.

Three years domicite of Sernice necessary.

5. Such colonial certificates of competency shall be granted only to persons who have been domiciled in the said possession, or who have served in ships registered therein for a period of, or for periods amounting to at least three years immediately preceding their application for such colonial certificates.

Certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates not to be granted when former are cancelled.

6. Such colonial certificates of competency shall not be granted 6. Such colonial certificates of competency shall not be granted to any person who may have had a certificate, whether granted by the Board of Trade or by the Government of a British possession, cancelled or suspended under the provisions of the said Acts, or of any Act for the time being in force in any part of Hor Majesty's dominions, unless the period of suspension has expired, or unless intimation has been received from the Board of Trade, or the Government by whom the cancelled or suspended certificate was originally granted to the effect that no objection to the grant of such colonial certificate is known to exist, or unless a new certificate has been granted to him by such Board or Government, and in the last-named event no such colonial certificate so f competency shall be for a higher grade than the certificate so fast granted as aforesaid. Colonial certificates of competency granted contrary to this regulation shall be regarded as improperly granted.

Certificates improperly granted may be cancelled without formal

7. Any such colonial certificate of competency which appears, from information subsequently acquired or otherwise, to have been improperly granted, whether in the above or in any other respect, may be cancelled by the Government of the said possession, or by the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, without any formal investigation under The Merchant Shipping Act 1854, and the holder of such certificate shall thereupon deliver it to the Board of Trade or the Government of the said possession, or as they or either of them may direct; and in default thereof shall incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to merchant shipping are thereby-made recoverable.

Cancellation, &c., of a Certificate shall involve cancellation of all the other Certificates possessed by its owner.

all the other Certificates possessed by its owner.

8. Every decision with respect to the cancellation or suspension of a certificate pronounced by any board, court, or tribunal under the provisions of the said Acts, shall extend equally to all the colonial certificates at the time possessed by the person in respect of whom the decision is made, as well as to all certificates cranted to him under any of the Acts relating to merchant shipping, and whether such certificates be specified in such decision or not.

Certificates believed to be fraudulent may be demanded.

0. Any officer of the Board of Trade, or the Registrar-General of Seamen, or any of his officers, or a superintendent of a mercantile marine office, or a consular officer or duly appointed shipping officer on a British possession, may demand the delivery to him of any such colonial certificate of competency which he has reason to believe has been improperly issued, or is forged, aftered, cancelled, or suspended, or to which the person using it is not justly entitled, and may detain such certificate for a reasonable period, for the purpose of making inquiries respecting such issue, forgery, alteration, cancellation, suspension or possession, and any person who without reasonable cause neglects or refuses to comply with such demand shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds, which shall be recoverable in the same manner as penalties imposed by the Acts relating to merchant shipping are thereby made recoverable.

Suspended Certificates to be re-issued only by Colony by which originally granted.

originally granted.

10. Any such colonial certificate of competency which has from any cause been cancelled or suspended, whether by a tribunat in Victoria or elsewhere, shall be renewed or re-issued only by the Government of Victoria.

This Order shall take effect in the said possession of Victoria from and after the date hereof, and shall be decued to apply to and take effect with respect to all such colonial certificates of competency as shall have been granted as aforesaid since the fourth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and saventy. seventy.

D.—Memorandum to accompany Copy of the Order in Council for carrying into operation Section 8 of "The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act, 1869."

Additional arrangements.

In addition to the conditions and regulations contained in the Order in Council, it is important that arrangements for the following purposes be made in the Possessions in which certifi-

cates are granted under The Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act

Particulars for Registrar-General of seamen.

2. The lists of certificates to be sent to the Registrar-General of Seamen should specify the serial number, date, and grade of certificate granted, also particulars for the identification of the holder if necessary. Similar particulars will be necessary as regards the certificates cancelled and suspended.

Lists should be sent every mail.

3. Lists should, if possible, be forwarded by every mail, as from them the Registrar-General of Seamen will compile and keep up registers of all the certificates granted, cancelled, and suspended under the Act.

Attempts to obtain certificates by persons whose certificates have been cancelled, &c.

been cancelled, &c.

4. It is of very great importance to guard strictly against attempts to obtain certificates made by persons who have had previous certificates cancelled or suspended. With the object of defeating such attempts, the Board of Trade have instructed the Registrar-General of Seamen to send to every Possession'in which certificates are granted, lists of all cancellations and suspensions. It may happen occasionally, that by means of false or fraudulent testimonals and documents the governments or examiners are successfully imposed upon and that certificates are issued. Provision is therefore made in the Order in Council for the cancellation and withdrawal of certificates improperly granted. It is hoped that these measures will be effectual for the purpose. the purpose.

Necessity for regularity in forwarding particulars of cancella-tions, &c.

tions, qc.

5. As there is no power to withdraw any certificate which may be accidentally granted in the United Kingdom, the Local Marine Boards who have charge of the examinations have been requested to cause every possible precaution to be taken to present such an improper grant of a certificate in the United Kingdom, and the measures taken by those boards will be facilitated by the regular receipt of the list of cancellations, &c., to be sent from the several Possessions to the Registrar-General of Seamen in London.

Superior certificate should bear the same serial number as the inferior certificate.

6. In the United Kingdom when the holder of a certificate passes for a higher grade, the No. given to his superior certificate is the same as that upon the inferior. A similar course might with advantage be adopted in the Possession in respect of certificates granted in it.

Certificate issued in lieu of one damaged,

7. A certificate issued in lieu of one which has become damaged should bear the number of such damaged certificate, and such damaged certificate should always be retained by the authorities

Certificate lost or destroyed should be cancelled, and the substi-tule should receive a different number.

S. It is, however, desirable that certificates granted in place of those which are lost and destroyed should bear fresh numbers, and that the original certificates should be cancelled and their numbers included in the list of cancelled certificates sent to the Registrar-General of Seamen, so us to prevent any chance of their being used by any one into whose hands they might

Certificates of those who die should be cancelled.

For the same reason it is desirable that upon the death of a certificate holder, his certificate should be cancelled and its number included in the cancelled list.

rtificate should show what other certificates its owner possesses.

10. The Board of Trade think it expedient that every certificate should show upon it particulars, i.e., the grade, place where granted, and serial number of all the other certificates possessed by its owner, whether granted under the Merchant Stipping Acts or any Colonial Act or Acts applicable to certificates. Steps for securing this have been taken in the United Kiugdom, and a regulation for the purpose should be made in each of the Possessions in which certificates are granted.

Ships trading with United Kingdom should be provided with proper certificated officers.

11. Section 136 of The Merchant Shipping Act 1854, specifies 11. Scotton 130 of The Interchait Supply 20 1603, specifies the numbers of certificated officers to be carried in ships going to sea from ports in the United Kingdom. Inconvenience and delay may be prevented if there is some regulation in the colony to insure proper certificated officers being on board ships coming to the United Kingdom.

Copies of the forms of certificates required for guidance of officials.

12. Four hundred copies on paper of the form of every colonial certificate to which the order in council will apply, should be forwarded to the Board of Trade with as little delay as possible for distribution amongst the superintendents of mercantile marine offices in the United Kingdom, and others to whom the certificates will be presented in course of business.

Date of publication of Order in Council should be notified with-

out delay.

13. The date of publication of the order in Council in the Possession should be notified to this Board without delay.
