WHEREAS by the Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the third day of December 1866 the limits of the Circuit District of Sandhurst and Castlemaine were amongst others defined: And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the said limits: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the limits of the Sandhurst and Castlemaine Circuit District, and doth appoint that the limits of the said district, within which Circuit Courts shall be holden, shall be those hereinafter defined, that is to say:-

THE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT OF SANDHURST AND CASTLEMAINE-Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the first named river to Hughes Creek; thence by a line south-westerly to Mount Koala; thence by a line true south to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range westerly to the range which divides the waters of the Bullarook Creek from the waters of the Glenbower or Joyce's Creek; thence by that range north-westerly to a point bearing east from the junction of the Bullarook and Tullaroop or Deep creeks; thence to that junction by a line bearing west; thence down by the last-named creek to the Loddon River; thence down that river to an anabranch of the Murray River; thence down that anabranch to the south boundary of the town of Castle Donnington; thence by the south, west, and north boundaries of that town to the Murray River; and thence up that river to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Robert Walsh, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be and be called such town or city accordingly: Provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that from and after every such proclamation the borough so proclaimed a town or city as aforesaid shall take and bear the name of the "Town of" (mentioning the name assigned to such town) or "City of" (mentioning the name assigned to such city); the council of such borough, and the members of the said council shall take and bear the name of the council and councillors respectively of such town or city; the mayor and clerk of the said borough shall thenceforth respectively be called the mayor and clerk of the said town or city respectively; and the burgesses of such borough shall thenceforward be known and called the burgesses of such town or citizens of such city; the wards (if any) of the said borough existing at the time of such proclamation shall be and be called wards of the said town or city; and the borough fund of the borough shall be called the town fund or city fund of the said town or city; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force

and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: provided that all acts and things done or had and all penalties and forfeitures actually incurred or imposed, and all sums of money due or payable under this (or any other Act whatsoever) at the time of the proclamation of such town or city shall be of the same force and effect and be recovered and paid and go in like manner to all intents and purposes as if such proclamation had not taken place: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Sandhurst for the preceding year was not less than Twenty thousand pounds: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date herewith it was determined to proclaim the said Borough to be a City: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim the Borough of Sandhurst to be a City within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and to be designated by the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say,

THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

COMMON ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: And whereas the notices prescribed by the said Act have been given: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE CURRAWA AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMER'S COMMON, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 31st day of December 1866, the 6th day of April 1868, and the 29th day of December 1868, is hereby altered by adding thereto allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 19 and 21, parish of Currawa, and allotments 240, 250, 260, 261, 262, 263, 264 and part of allotment 233 parish of Doobie, comprising in all, about 4409 acres, and deducting therefrom allotments 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 29, 30, 31, 51 and 52, parish of Currawa, comprising about 2566 acres.—(70 21740.)

DARRAWEIT GUIM CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY AT DARRAWEIT GUIM.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By The Cemeteries Statute 1864, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under the rules and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Order for interment will be received by the sexton, or by any of the trustees.

6. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

7. A form of application for burial, containing the name, age, late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable and entered in the interment book, in same form.

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months; except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Three o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented closely, or covered by a slab of stone or iron.

12. A plan of every monument, and a copy of every inscription, to be submitted to the trustees, for their approval.

13. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a model to be seen on application.

14. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. The ground will be open daily to the public, from sunrise to sunset.

16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected; and a register of all grounds is kept by the secretary.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and regulations.

18. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
