SIR,—I have the honor to report that when making the passage from Vavan to Tonga, in the Friendly Group of Islands, on the 1st June 1871, a rock was seen a few feet above water. Owing to the hazy state of the atmosphere no land could be seen to enable bearings to be taken to verify position; but as the distance from the last land seen was 41 miles, run in 4½ hours, and the island of Kao being seen 1½ hour after seeing the rock, its position must be near the following latitude and longitude, namely:—

Lat. 19° 17' 00" S, and Long. 174° 45' 00" W.

### CONSTITUTING A ROAD DISTRICT TO BE A SHIRE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of July 1871.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act* 1870 (34 Vic. No. 357, § 2), it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of the Shires Statute, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions if any of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:-

THE EAST LODDON ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the twelfth day of December 1864, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF EAST LODDON.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

thence by the crest of the Grampians northerly to the commencing point."

The part referred to in the petition secondly mentioned is described by metes and bounds as follows: "Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of the Shire of Stawell intersects the northern boundary of the electoral district of Ararat; thence west by that boundary to a point due north of the north-west angle of allotment 50, parish of Dunneworthy; thence south to the northern boundary of said allotment and intersects the north boundary of the Shire of Ararat; thence west, east, and north by said boundary to the point of commencement."

#### BALLARAT DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to report for the quarter ending 30th June 1871.

There has been no outbreak of scab in this district during the quarter.

On the 15th May I discovered scab in a flock of 1093 sheep in the Corporation yards, which I had destroyed, burying them in an adjacent paddock, in accordance with section 53 of the Scab Act. These sheep were the property of Mr. David Clarke, of Piggoreet, who in addition to losing the sheep paid the whole cost of destruction.

A large portion of this district has been proclaimed a Clean District; and at a meeting of the Board of Advice, held on the 28th instant, it was recommended that all the three-chain roads should be excluded from the Clean District to facilitate sheep travelling to market.

The whole of the sheep have been dipped in lime and sulphur.

McPherson, of the Kangaroo Ground, have been fined under the 36th clause of the Act £262 4s., with 5s. costs, for neglecting to dip 10,488 sheep; and under the 32nd clause £440, with 5s. costs, for neglecting to brand 3500 sheep with the letter S from the 26th of February to the 19th of March; and under the 47th clause £300, with 5s. costs, for not shepherding 4000 sheep from the 1st to the 18th of March.

Mr. Irving, of Annandale, has been fined under the 36th clause of the Act £182 10s., with 5s. costs, for neglecting to dip 7300 sheep; and under the 32nd clause £360, with 5s. costs, for neglecting to brand 7300 sheep with the letter S from the 1st to the 18th of March; and under the 47th clause £300, with 5s. costs, for neglecting to shepherd 7300 sheep from the 1st to the 18th of March.

Mr. Chrisp, of Koetong, has been fined under the 36th clause £31 5s., with 5s. costs, for neglecting to dip 1250 sheep.

Mr. Chrisp, of Bungil, also fined under the 36th clause £277 10s., with 5s. costs, for neglecting to dip 11,100 sheep; and under the 32nd clause £277 10s., with 5s. costs, for neglecting to brand 11,100 sheep with the letter S from the 8th to the 20th of March.

I HAVE the honor to furnish you with the quarterly report ending 30th June under clause 12 of Scab Act for the Coleraine district.

I regret to report that I have had occasion to issue one license this quarter for 11,000 sheep depasturing on the Woodford station. I found disease in two flocks, but owing to the fences having been damaged by fires, and consequently the sheep mixing, the owner applied for a license for all the sheep on the station the day previous to my arrival there. I have given him notice to shepherd and yard the sheep.

I made a thorough inspection of the whole of the sheep in those quarantine stations, in company with the South Australian local inspector, and can report favorably of their condition. They are generally looking well, and to all appearance perfectly clean. The sheep on the Kalahuro station continue clean, lime and sulphur having I trust worked an effectual cure.

The Mokanger station also continues perfectly clean. There is no further outbreak of disease to my knowledge in this district.

I have had no prosecutions this quarter.

My Board of Advice have recommended that several runs be annexed to the Clean District. A description of the boundaries will be forwarded shortly.

#### GEELONG DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to hand this my report of the district for the three months ending 30th ultimo, in accordance with the provisions of the Scab Act.

I am sorry to report that there is still a great deal of scab in the district, and careless people help to spread it. Mr. E. Harvey, of Borhoneyghurk, was obliged to license his flock on account of a stray sheep found in his flock, branded T, with no other brand. Mr. E. Curlewis, Hermsley East, was likewise obliged to license on account of some of his neighbor's, Mr. Cuthbert's, straying into his flock. They have settled matters between themselves, Mr. Cuthbert paying for the dipping. Mr. Cuthbert's sheep got the scab through his own carelessness in putting a ram that he had had for months scabby into his flock. And he again gave Mr. N. Campbell scab through selling him a few sheep. Mr. D. Clarke, of Piggoreet, bought sheep in the Ballarat yards, and three weeks after he took a flock of 1000 sheep to Ballarat for sale containing a part of these sheep, and Mr. Inspector Shaw then found them to be scabby. The flock were killed and buried at the expense of their owner. Mr. Clarke applied for a license for the balance, but afterwards killed them himself. I have also to report that I found a scabby pet in the possession of a butcher on the township of Leigh road. He at once killed it, as well as the rest of the sheep with it; but it is a most unfortunate place to find scab, as so many travelling sheep pass there, and a good many are trucked from the railway station. I also found a flock in possession of the proprietors of the Gheringhap Boiling Establishment, numbering 780, part of which were also very bad with scab. They had been bought by a dealer about a month before in the Ballarat yards, and had come originally from Messrs. Churnside's Cairnballock station, but were clean when they left it. Mr. Inspector Elliget has since visited the station, and reports no sign of scab on it. These two last will form the subjects for Police Office proceedings.

I have had one prosecution for neglecting to brand licensed sheep.

Clean certificates have been granted with the concurrence of the Board of Advice, to four owners, viz.:—Mr. J. L. Dow, Forest station, Freshwater Creek; Mr. F. W. Armytage, Woolloomanata, Duck Ponds; Mr. James Anderson, Manse Farm, Barrabool, and Mr. E. Gaudry, Ironbark station, Jan-juc.

Several stations have been placed in quarantine, but as yet no part of the district has been proclaimed clean. The Board of Advice meet regularly on the third Thursday in the month; it has been proposed to strengthen it by the addition of three members, as at present it only consists of four effective, two being absent from the colony.

I herewith enclose return of licenses and fines for the quarter.

This flock was licensed before, on the 3rd January 1870, and when inspected on the 28th March last I found two strange scabby sheep among them. The other license was issued to Mr. J. N. McLeod, of Castlemadda station, for 1500 sheep, among which I found four scabby sheep (just breaking with scab), and were licensed before on the 1st December 1870.

I have inspected the sheep on the Messrs. Robertson's station, Yarran-rarran, licensed on the 27th October 1870; the Melbourne Banking Company's station, Audley Estate, licensed on the 28th November 1870; Mr. D. Vine's station, Audley, licensed on 21st November 1870; and the farms of Messrs. Morton and Campbell, David Looker, Edmund Rawlinson, John Maiseed, and James Bannan, and believe the sheep on these stations and farms to be thoroughly cured.

I also inspected the sheep on Mr. Learmonth's stations, Eltrick and Ellangowan, all of which had been recently dipped under my authority; also Mr. Francis Egan's stations, Greenwald and Glenaulin; the sheep on these stations had been licensed. I saw no scab on any of the sheep, but am not certain cures have been effected, as the country is very rough and difficult to muster.

All the sheep on Mr. T. G. Hamilton's stations, Sinclair East and West, and Springburn, have been removed.

I have just returned from visiting the stations bordering on the Glenelg River and found the sheep quite clean.


