OTAGO HARBOR.

THE following remarks respecting the entrance of Otago Harbor, by the Harbor Master of that port, Mr. William Thompson, have been received from the Colonial Office, Wellington, 1871:—

The least water at present in the north or main channel is 22 feet at low-water springs, no change having taken place since May 1870.

In the old channel, which is a short cut into the harbor across the bar, much used by vessels not drawing more than 18 feet, there is now 15½ feet at low-water springs, and 20½ feet at high-water ordinary tides, being 18 inches more than in May last.

The mean rise at high-water at the heads is 4 feet 9 inches, which will give in ordinary tides in the north or main channel a depth of 26 feet 9 inches, being sufficient for vessels drawing 22 feet to enter, except when a south-east sea sets in on the coast, which rarely occurs.

For many years in the old channel there was not less than 18 feet at low-water; it was then used by all vessels visiting this port, some of them being ships of 2100 tons, and drawing 21 feet; but the great tidal wave of August 1868 suddenly reduced the depth to 12 feet at low-water, thereby necessitating the use of the north or main channel for large vessels. The north channel, by the same disturbing element, was, on the other hand, much improved, owing to the outer end of the bar being washed away; but since that date the bar has been slowly, but surely, returning to its original dimensions.

In the channel across the inner bar, there is at present not less than 18 feet at low-water spring tides, being 2 feet deeper than in May last. The usual process of change is going on here. A ridge forms nearly across the channel, shallowing to 15 feet, then breaking through on each side, leaving a knoll in the centre. At present there is at low-water a small knoll with 14½ feet, and 18 feet all round.

In conclusion, the capabilities of the port of Otago could not be better shown than by the fact that the ship *Achilles*, of 1520 tons register, drawing 21½ feet of water, was on the 3rd of July last safely piloted into this harbor, and anchored at Port Chalmers in the dark; also, that only three wrecks have occurred at the entrance since the formation of the settlement. As these wrecks, with ordinary management, might have been avoided, they cannot be received as evidence that the entrance to this harbor is dangerous, and it is stated that a larger amount of shipping has visited Otago Harbor, and fewer casualties have happened therein, than in any of the other principal ports of New Zealand.

TAURANGA HARBOR.

The following has been received from Commander George Palmer, R.N., of H.M.S. *Rosario*:—

All bearings are magnetic. Variation 14° 50' easterly in 1871.

Vessels approaching Tauranga Harbor should bring Maunani to bear south, and steer for it until within 2 or 3 cables of the North Rock.

For some hours after a northerly or easterly gale, the bar breaks right across from the Outer Middle Bank to Maunani. The Inner Middle Bank has extended three-quarters of a cable towards Maunani, whilst the channel has deepened considerably.

An experienced pilot is employed to look after the buoys, but their being in position cannot be depended on.

The *Rosario*, drawing 14 feet, has been frequently up the harbor at spring tides as far as Te Papa.

Owing to the strength of the tide round Stony Point, and the tendency of the channel to decrease in width, vessels of small steam-power are recommended to wait for slack water before entering Tauranga Harbor.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT
1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act* 1870, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts, within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Wannan run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarram-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumbeep run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

HAMILTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 2, parish of Greenhills, being a point on the eastern side of the road from Portland to Hamilton; thence east to Lake Condah Swamp; thence southerly by the eastern margin of that swamp to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Lake Condah pre-emptive section; thence by that creek to Lake Condah; thence by the western shore of that lake southerly to Darlott's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Fitzroy River; thence by that river upwards to the aforesaid road from Portland to Hamilton; and thence by that road north-easterly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. MINING AUTHORIZED ON RESERVED LANDS AT DAYLESFORD.

THE Governor in Council has authorized Joseph Beckett of Daylesford to mine upon and construct drives under the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council and described in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th February 1870, as a site for public gardens at Daylesford, subject to the conditions, restrictions, and limitations hereinafter specified, namely:—

1. The extent of the surface of the said reserve which shall be occupied under the authority of this Order shall not exceed one acre, at or in the immediate vicinity of the shaft already sunk on the north side of the reserve, and such surface area shall be enclosed with a substantial fence.
2. The mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner, as not to interfere, except as above provided, with the purpose for which the reserve was made.

3. The workings shall be open at all reasonable hours to the inspection of any mining surveyor or other authorized officer.
4. All instructions given by the mining surveyor or other authorized officer, relative to the mode of timbering or otherwise protecting the ground, shall be complied with.
5. Before commencing mining operations within the reserve, the said Joseph Beckett shall pay into the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster of the district the sum of Ten pounds sterling, as a guarantee that he will observe and fulfil these conditions.
6. On the discontinuance of mining operations, the said Joseph Beckett shall notify to the mining surveyor of the division his intention to abandon the ground, and shall then, in the presence of the mining surveyor, fill in to his satisfaction all shafts thereon, leaving all timber and props in the drives and shafts, and thereupon the mining surveyor shall give a certificate to that effect, and on the production of such certificate to the receiver and paymaster, one moiety of the deposit shall be payable to the holder thereof, and the other moiety shall be payable after the expiration of twelve months following, on the production of a certificate from the mining surveyor that all depressions have been levelled; but if any of the conditions herein be not fulfilled—of which the warden shall be the sole judge—then the whole of one or both moieties of the deposit shall be forfeited.
7. The Minister of Mines, or any person by him authorized in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the reserve.
8. In case any person or persons shall violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them to mine any longer within the limits of the reserve aforesaid.

RULES MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE JAMIESON CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Any person making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the consent of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever, from the date of such permission being given.
3. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees, and a certificate in the form of Schedule B will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.
4. All charges will be remitted in the case of poor persons being buried in the cemetery, on the certificate of a justice of the peace, under sec. 9 of Act No. 310, that the relatives and friends of deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges, and in all such cases the grave shall be dug by or at the expense of such parties under the supervision of the sexton.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or graves will be required to construct them under direction of the trustees.
6. Any person wishing to make an interment in any private grave or vault must obtain the consent, in writing, of the owner thereof, which must be submitted to the trustees on making the application for interment.
7. All monuments, gravestones, and vaults, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
8. Every vault or brick grave containing any coffin or coffins to be securely covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, iron, or good sound red-gum planking, or other durable material approved of by the trustees.
9. The plans of all monuments and fences to be submitted to the trustees; and any tomb, epitaph, or monument objected to will not be permitted to be erected.
10. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application to the secretary.
11. The procession to be at the cemetery at the time fixed for the funeral, which time must be punctually observed.
12. All funerals shall take place between the hours of ten a.m. and five p.m.
13. For adults all graves to be at least 7 feet deep, and for children under 12 years 5 feet.
14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations, or of adding new ones.

Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of.

In the event of supplies ordered under this contract not being delivered within the specified time, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within twenty-four hours after notice has been given of such rejection, and, if not so removed, the Railway Storekeeper is hereby empowered to send the same to Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the branch requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Commissioner of Railways, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contract under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
