PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned places to be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the days appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said courts, that is to say:—

At Wood's Point, on Friday the seventeenth day of November, in lieu of the thirteenth of November 1871.

At Jamieson, on Monday the twentieth day of November, in lieu of the fifteenth of November 1871.

At Mansfield, on Thursday the twenty-third day of November, in lieu of the seventeenth of November 1871.

At Ararat, on Friday the fifteenth day of December, in lieu of the fifteenth of November 1871.

At Stawell, on Monday the eighteenth day of December, in lieu of the seventeenth of November 1871.

At Hamilton, on Friday the twenty-second day of December, in lieu of the twenty-first of November 1871.

DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGE- ABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined

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by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the whole of the

BOROUGH OF CHEWTON

to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the borough hereinafter mentioned as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF WOOD'S POINT.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the sixteenth day of January in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five the Shire of Avoca was divided into three separate ridings the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the North Riding of the Shire of Avoca therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Avoca, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the West Riding of the Shire of Tullaroop: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said West Riding of the Shire of Tullaroop and of the North Riding of the said Shire of Avoca in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 20, section 3, parish of Craigie; thence due north to the northern boundary of said parish at a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the borough of Carisbrook, distance forty-eight chains; thence east to the said south-west angle; thence north by the west boundary of said borough to the intersection of a Government road three chains wide from Carisbrook to Maryborough; thence westerly by that road to the north-eastern boundary of the borough of Maryborough; thence south-easterly, south-westerly, north-westerly, and north-easterly by the boundaries of the said borough to the intersection of the one-chain road from Maryborough to the Timor Creek reserve; thence by that road northerly and westerly to the centre of McNeil's Creek; thence by the centre of McNeil's Creek south-westerly to a point east of the north boundary of the town reserve, parish of Wareek; thence west to and by the said north boundary to the north-west angle of the said town reserve; thence by a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence south by the western boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of town reserve of said parish; thence easterly by a right line to a point where the eastern boundary of the parish of Amherst cuts the north side of the Amherst and Carisbrook road; thence south by the said parish boundary to a point due west of the north-west angle of allotment 21, section 3, in the parish of Craigie; thence by a direct line easterly to the commencing point.

THE NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF AVOCA.—Commencing at a point on the Main Dividing Range west of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence by the Main Dividing Range northerly to the south boundary of the shire of St. Arnaud; thence easterly by the said south boundary to the south-east angle of that shire at Natta Yallock; thence easterly by the south boundary of the Dunolly Mining Division to a point in the west boundary of the parish of Wareek, being six miles and a half, more or less, from the south-east angle of Natta Yallock; thence south by the west boundary of parish of Wareek to the north-east angle of allotment 14, section C, parish of Rathscar; thence by a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence south by the west boundary of the parish of Bung Bong to a point due east of the north-east angle of the borough of Avoca; thence west to the said north-east angle; thence by a direct line west to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-sixth day of April in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine the Alexandra Road District was divided into three electoral subdivisions the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-third day of August One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine the said road district was constituted the Shire of Alexandra and the electoral subdivisions thereof became and are now called Ridings: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Merton Riding of the Shire of Alexandra therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Alexandra, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Mansfield: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Shire of Mansfield and of the Merton Riding of the said Shire of Alexandra in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.—Commencing at the junction of the Puzzle range with the Strathbogrie range, being the Anglesey county boundary; thence by the Puzzle range to the Goulburn River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Howqua River, and by the Howqua River to its source; thence by a line to the source of the Back Creek; thence by the Back Creek to the Broken River; thence by the Broken River to the Sandy Creek, and by the Sandy Creek to its source; thence by a line to the nearest summit of the Strathbogrie range, and by that range to the starting point.

THE MERTON RIDING OF THE ALEXANDRA SHIRE.—Beginning at the junction of the Home Creek with the Goulburn River; thence due north to the Strathbogrie ranges, being the Anglesey county boundary; thence by the Strathbogrie ranges north-easterly to the Puzzle range; thence by the Puzzle range south-easterly to the southern boundary of the Junction run; thence by the boundaries of the Junction and Borodomin runs to the south-west corner of the latter run; thence westerly to the north-east angle of the parish of Alexandra; thence south by the eastern boundary of this parish to its intersection with Colonial Creek; thence south-westward by this creek and the Goulburn River to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-third day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight a road district was constituted under the designation of "The Mount Eliza Road District," and the boundaries thereof were therein described: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the seventh day of December in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight a road district was constituted under the designation of "The Flinders Road District," and the boundaries thereof were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Flinders Road District therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Flinders Road District, described in such petition, from such road district, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such road district shall be attached to the Mount Eliza Road District: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Mount Eliza Road District and of the said Flinders Road District in manner following, that is to say:—

THE MOUNT ELIZA ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Moorooduc; thence eastward by this parish boundary to its junction with the parish of Bittern; thence south to the south-west angle of allotment 55 B, parish of Bittern; thence eastward by the southern boundaries of allotments 55 B to 41 B inclusive to the parish boundary of Tyabb; thence southward and eastward by the said parish boundary to the shore of Western Port Bay; thence northward to the north-east angle of the parish of Tyabb; thence westward and northward by the southern and western boundaries of the parish of Langwarrin to the north-east corner of allotment 4 of section VI, parish of Frankston; thence by the northern boundaries of allotments 4 and 1 of said section, and by a line in continuation of the same to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence southward by the said shore to the commencing point.

THE FLINDERS ROAD DISTRICT.—Starting at the mouth of Hann's Creek at the south-east angle of the parish of Tyabb; thence southerly and westerly by the shore of Western Port Bay to the mouth of Wallermersong Creek; thence northward by the western boundaries of the parishes of Flinders and Halmarring to the north-west angle of the latter parish; thence by the northern and part of the eastern boundary of same parish to the south-west angle of allotment 55 B, parish of Bittern; thence eastward by the southern boundaries of allotments 55 B to 41 B inclusive to the parish boundary of Tyabb; thence southward and eastward by the said parish boundary to the commencing point.

FURTHER RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT UNDER "THE INSOLVENCY STATUTE 1871."

THE Rules of the Supreme Court subjoined hereto having been laid before the Legislative Council on the 15th day of August 1871, and before the Legislative Assembly on the 8th day of the same month, and no address having been presented to the Governor to disallow the same, are now published in accordance with the provisions contained in the 32nd section of the Act 15 Victoria No. 10.

WHEREAS by *The Insolvency Statute 1871*, section 25, it is provided that the Judges of the Supreme Court may make rules in the same way as rules of the Supreme Court might then be made for the purpose of giving effect to the said Act in all matters in which jurisdiction is thereby given to the Supreme Court or a judge thereof: Now we, the Judges of the Supreme Court, in pursuance of the said enactment, make the following further rules, and direct that they come into force from the 14th day of August 1871:—

1. The petition to a judge of the Supreme Court for an order *nisi* for sequestration under the 39th section of the Act, shall be generally verified by the affidavit of the petitioning creditor or creditors, or one of them, as to all the material facts therein stated, and the date of the alleged act of insolvency, or by the affidavit of the duly authorized agent or agents of such creditors or creditor, stating besides the verification of the petition, that he is duly authorized and disclosing facts within his own knowledge which account for the inability of the creditors or creditor to verify the same; and such petition shall also be verified

by the affidavit of the sheriff's officer or other person best informed of the fact of the alleged act of insolvency; but the judge may under circumstances dispense with the above affidavits, or require further evidence by affidavit, or *vidæ voce* examination upon the above or other matters.

2. The petition and affidavits used for obtaining any such order *nisi* shall, before the same is signed by the judge, be deposited with him or his associate.

3. The associate of the primary judge may issue separate summonses for the examination of witnesses upon the hearing of an order *nisi* for compulsory sequestration.

4. All documents used for obtaining an order *nisi* for compulsory sequestration from a court of insolvency under the said 39th section, and such order *nisi* shall be deposited with the associate of the primary judge before the hearing thereof, for use at the said hearing or appeals to the full court.

5. All orders made by a single judge exercising the powers of the Supreme Court, either in disposing of orders *nisi* for compulsory sequestration or otherwise, in insolvency, may be signed by the associate of such judge, and all orders of the full court upon appeals may be signed by the Master in Equity.

6. When an order *nisi* is made absolute and the petitioning creditor shall not take out the same within one week, any person interested may apply by summons before a judge for liberty to take out the same, and the judge may direct accordingly, and order the petitioning creditor to pay the costs and fees necessary for taking out the order and the costs of the application.

7. When an order *nisi* for a compulsory sequestration made by a court of insolvency is made absolute or discharged, or such order made by a judge of the Supreme Court is made absolute by a single judge and there is no appeal, or the appeal is disposed of making the order absolute, the associate of such judge shall forward the petition, affidavits, and other documents used at the hearing, to the chief clerk of the district court of insolvency to be filed in such court.

8. The fees payable to solicitors for proceedings before the supreme court or judge thereof, in the insolvency jurisdiction, shall be the same as allowed by the higher scale under *The Common Law Procedure Statute 1865*.

9. The fees payable to the Crown or the consolidated revenue of Victoria for proceedings before the Supreme Court or a judge thereof in the insolvency jurisdiction shall be those contained in the following schedule:—

MINING IN THE MALMSBURY RESERVOIR RESERVE AUTHORIZED.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.
