## ALTERATIONS IN CHANNELS OVER WIDE BAY BAR.

IN consequence of the gradual shifting northwards of the main channel over Wide Bay Bar, the relative position of the leading Beacons on Inskip and Hook Points is now altered so as to give a line of direction for crossing the bar on a S.W. by S. course, with a depth of not less than 3 fathoms at low water springs.

From the main channel over the bar trending so far northwards, the west channel has again deepened to 9 feet at low water; and beacons for leading through it have been re-erected on the south end of Great Sandy Island—the inner beacon being white with a pointed top, and the outer red with the upper part V-shaped. The top of the inner beacon will be seen through the arms of the outer beacon on a W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. bearing.

## COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the road commencing at the junction of Reilly street with Brunswick street, in the borough of Fitzroy; thence eastward by northward across the Merri and Darebin Creeks to the point of division forming the upper and lower roads to Heidelberg; thence north-eastward by the former road past the Ivanhoe Hotel and the western boundary of the township of Heidelberg to the Plenty River; which road passes through or into the town of Fitzroy, the borough of East Collingwood, and the shire of Heidelberg respectively: And whereas tolls are payable under the Shires Statute upon such road to the council of the shire of Heidelberg: And whereas such road is commonly used for direct traffic by persons passing with animals and vehicles along such road for the length thereof, which extends not only through or into the shire of Heidelberg, but also through or into the town of Fitzroy and the borough of East Collingwood: And whereas the councils of the town of Fitzroy and the borough of East Collingwood respectively have, in writing under their respective common seals, complained to me that they ought, by reason of such traffic being common to their town and borough respectively with the shire of Heidelberg, to have a share of such tolls: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said road hereinbefore described for the whole length thereof to be a "Common-toll Road" of the town of Fitzroy, the borough of East Collingwood, and the shire of Heidelberg respectively.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## TIMBER RESERVATION.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such Proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee,

as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, such reserve to be designated by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

**STRANGWAYS STATE FOREST**—Eight hundred acres, more or less, county of Talbot, parish of Strangways, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described: Commencing at the east boundary of the town of Newstead at the point where it is intersected by the northern side of the road to Muckleford; thence by that road bearing N. 83° 30' E. thirty-nine chains twenty-five links, more or less, to a point determined by the production of the eastern side of the road which forms the eastern boundary of allotments 20, 19, 18, &c. of section A; thence by a line and that road bearing S. 6° 30' E. fifteen chains thirty-eight links; thence by a road and a line bearing N. 83° 8' E. thirty-one chains fifty links, more or less, to John Muoro's licensed land; thence by that land bearing N. 11° E. two chains seventy-five links, more or less, and east twelve chains twenty-eight links to the western side of a road running towards Muckleford; thence by that road bearing north-easterly to August Nicholson's licensed land; thence by that land bearing west fifteen chains sixty-seven links, north twenty chains three links, and east twenty-eight chains seventy-four links to Francis Dibb's land; thence by that land bearing north fifteen chains ninety-one links, west five chains forty-eight links, north eleven chains twenty-seven links, east nine chains forty-eight links, and N. 75° 30' E. twelve chains eighty-six links; thence by a road bearing north seven chains fifty links, more or less, to the north boundary of the parish of Strangways; thence by that boundary bearing west one hundred and fifty-two chains twenty-five links, more or less, to Wm. McKay's licensed land; thence by that land bearing south five chains fifty-eight links, west thirteen chains, south seven chains forty links, west sixty-one links, and south nine chains ninety-eight links; thence by Wm. Martin's land bearing east ninety-two links, south eight chains sixty-four links, and west eleven chains seventy-seven links; thence by a road bearing S. 3° 30' W. one chain seventy-five links, more or less, to James Scott's land; thence by that land and the land licensed by Wm. Martin, W. Cheevers, and Jas. Thomas respectively, bearing east four chains eighteen links, south ten chains eighty-six links, east ten chains fifty-eight links, north five chains sixty-three links, east fifteen chains twenty-four links, S. 19° 10' W. three chains eighty-three links, S. 70° 50' E. thirteen chains thirty-three links, and S. 19° 10' W. twelve chains eighty-six links to the north boundary of the town of Newstead; and thence by that boundary and the aforesaid east boundary thereof bearing respectively east twenty chains, more or less, and south six chains, more or less, to the commencing point.—(71.B.17985.)

#### JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE NEW COURT TOWN DISTRICT OF ALEXANDRA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of September 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor  
Mr. Walsh | Mr. O'Grady

**WHEREAS** by an Act passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, numbered 272, and intitled, *An Act to amend the Law for regulating Juries*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor in Council shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters, and things in and towards preparing, collecting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as in the said Act are aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the twenty-fifth day of July 1870, it was ordered that a county court should be holden at Alexandra, the same being a place at which a county court had not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the new court town district of Alexandra,

and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Alexandra shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Alexandra on or before Friday the twenty-ninth day of September instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the ninth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sundays the eighth and fifteenth days of October next ensuing; the court of petty sessions at Alexandra aforesaid shall revise such list on Thursday the nineteenth day of October aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Saturday the twenty-first day of October; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday the thirteenth day of November in the present year.

And the Honorable Howard Spensley, Her Majesty's Solicitor-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The deaths in August exceeded those in July by 2. They also exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 23. It must, however, be remembered that during these ten years the population of Melbourne and suburbs has increased from 140,000 to 205,000.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 70°2' on the 24th, and the lowest was 38° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (51°8') was 2°2' above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27°) took place on the 3rd, viz.—from a maximum of 65° to a minimum of 38°. The least range (5°7') was on the 18th, viz.—from a maximum of 46°5' to a minimum of 40°8'. The mean daily range was 17°1'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.93 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Fifty-seven per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 43 per cent. were of females; 45 per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 41 per cent. in August 1870, 35 per cent. in August 1869, 43 per cent. in August 1868, 39 per cent. in August 1867, 44 per cent. in August 1866, 49 per cent. in August 1865, 34 per cent. in August 1864, 38 per cent. in August 1863, 43 per cent. in August 1862, and 49 per cent. in August 1861.

Nine persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 77 of paralysis, a male aged 78 and a female aged 75 of heart disease, a female aged 75 of bronchitis, a female aged 75 of hepatitis, a female aged 80 of dysentery, a male aged 93, and two females aged respectively 76 and 81 of old age.

Eleven violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A boy aged 2 died of a fractured skull caused by a fall from a chair, a boy aged 4 was accidentally run over by an omnibus, a girl aged 8 died of injuries to the head resulting from a fall, a brickmaker aged 26 was killed by falling into a clay pit, a milkman aged 32 died of fracture of the skull caused by a fall from a horse, a girl aged 3 died of scalds, a seaman aged 36 died of drowning, a female infant died of suffocation shortly after birth, a male infant aged 14 weeks was suffocated in bed, a newly born female infant was killed by exposure, verdict manslaughter, and a publican aged 39 poisoned himself.

Seventy deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.: 39 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 125, of which 73, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 52, or 42 per cent., were of females; 74 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two years, 13 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 150, of which 83, or 55 per cent., were males, and 67, or 45 per cent., were females; 4 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 8 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 11 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 7 were between forty-five and fifty, 10 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were eighty and upwards.

Under this head phthisis, combined with hæmoptysis, caused 49 deaths in August and 42 deaths in July.
