WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called The Police Offences Statute 1885, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and after such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation in the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Eart I. of the said Statute to the town hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—
