PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Court of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned place to be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the day appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said court, that is to say:—

At Sandhurst, on Monday the eighteenth day of December next, ensuing, in lieu of the twenty-second day of November instant.

PROCLAMATION OF A DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10 REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of a previous proclamation bearing date the 22nd of February 1871, whereby the Whittlesea Road District was constituted a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

THE UNITED SHIRE OF NEWHAM.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of November 1871.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 15, 16) it is amongst other things enacted, that if any shire and any borough shall adjoin each other and form, together with any highway, creek, or stream, which shall be the common boundary, one continuous area, or if any borough shall be surrounded by any such shire and such common boundary and form with such shire such continuous area, and if an annual or general election or first appointment of councillors shall have taken place in and for such shire under the Act numbered one hundred and seventy-six hereby repealed or this Act, and in and for such borough under *The Municipal Corporations Act* 1863, or under the *Boroughs Statute*, and if the council of such shire and the council of such borough shall by petitions under their several common seals pray the Governor that such shire and such borough with such area may be formed into one shire under this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor to constitute the same with such area one shire, by such name as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to such shire, and such shires shall be a united shire to all intents and purposes. In every case in which any borough shall have been united with any shire the Governor may direct that all the powers relating to matters not herein otherwise provided for shall be vested in the council of the united shire, and all such powers shall thereupon be read and take effect accordingly; and it is also enacted that upon every union of shires or of a shire and borough, or of road districts into a shire, if in the case of such first-mentioned union either or any of the several shires so united shall be a single shire, and in the case of the union of a shire and borough if such shire shall before then have been by the Governor divided into ridings or such borough shall before then have been divided into wards, and in the case of the union of road districts into a shire if any of such road districts shall before then have been divided into subdivisions such divisions shall be void, and (unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the Governor) each of the several shires so united which shall be a single shire and each riding of any such shire previously having been a united shire and in the case of the union of a shire and borough or road districts into a shire such borough and every such road district shall become and be by the name theretofore borne by the same respectively a riding of the shire formed by such first-mentioned union: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford road district was constituted; and by other Proclamations bearing date the twenty-second day of February One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and the twenty-first day of August One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the boundaries thereof were altered and defined; and by an Order in Council made on the fifteenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine the said road district was divided into three separate subdivisions; and by another Order in Council made on the twenty-eighth day of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one the said road district was proclaimed a shire, under the designation of the Shire of Newham: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the third day of February One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two the borough of Woodend was constituted: And whereas the council of the said shire of Newham and the council of the said borough of Woodend have by petitions under their respective common seals prayed the Governor that such shire and borough adjoining each other and forming together with their common boundary one continuous area, may with such area be formed into one shire under the said Act: And whereas notices of the said petitions have been duly published in the manner prescribed by the 29th section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the said shire of Newham and the said borough of Woodend, which adjoin each other and form together with their common boundary one continuous area, to be one shire under the said Act by the name and with the area hereinafter set forth and described, that is to say:—

THE UNITED SHIRE OF NEWHAM.—Commencing at the point on the boundary of the Electoral District of Dalhousie bearing south of the south-west angle of the Woodend township reserve; thence by a direct line north to the said south-west angle; thence by the south boundaries of portions 110 and 111 in the parish of Woodend west to the centre of the Campaspe River; thence by the centre line of the Campaspe River northwardly to the north-west angle of the parish of Woodend; thence by the north boundary of the parish of Woodend east to the west boundary of the parish of Newham; thence northwardly and eastwardly by the west and north boundaries of the parish of Newham, the north boundary of the parish of Rochford, and the boundary of the Electoral District of Dalhousie, to a point north of the east boundary of the parish of Rochford; thence by a line south to and by the said east boundary to the south-east angle of the parish of Rochford; thence by the boundaries of portions 2 and 1 of the same parish west to the east boundary of the Gisborne shire; thence northwardly, westwardly, and southwardly by the east and north boundaries of the shire of Gisborne to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act* 1870 (34 Vict. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE BOROONDARA ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the eighth day of July 1854, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF BOROONDARA.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PART OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF BUNGAREE.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 23) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor, that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the sixteenth day of October in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five the Shire of Ballan was divided into three separate ridings, the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the West Riding of the Shire of Ballan therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act, and no counter petition has since been presented to the Governor, praying him not to grant the prayer of the petition above mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Ballan, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Bungaree: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said West Riding of the Shire of Ballan and of the said Shire of Bungaree in manner following, that is to say:—

THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF BALLAN.—Commencing at the source of the eastern branch of the Moorabool River; thence by that river southward and eastwardly to the north-west angle of Yallock parish; thence by the northern boundary of said parish to the Geelong and Mount Alexander road; thence by the said road to the southern boundary of the shire; thence west by the south boundary and north by the west boundary of the shire to the Melbourne to Ballarat main north road; thence easterly by the last-named road to the

western branch of the Moorabool River; thence northerly and easterly by the western branch of the Moorabool River to a point in a direct line with the northern boundary of Bolwarra pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line to and by the said north boundary of Bolwarra P.R. to the eastern branch of the Moorabool River; thence northerly by the said eastern branch of the River Moorabool to the commencing point.

THE SHIRE OF BUNGAREE.—Commencing at the centre of the Creswick Creek road where it is intersected by the northern boundaries of the Ballarat municipalities; thence northwardly by the centre line of that road to a point opposite the north-east angle of portion 63, parish of Ballarat; thence by a direct line east to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by a direct line to the northern boundary of the county of Grant; thence northwardly and eastwardly by the said boundary of the county of Grant to the source of the eastern Moorabool; thence south-easterly by the eastern branch of the Moorabool to the northern boundary of Bolwarra pre-emptive section; thence westerly by the northern boundary of Bolwarra P.R. and a direct line of the same bearing as said northern boundary to the western branch of the Moorabool; thence southerly and westerly by the said western branch to the Ballarat to Melbourne main north road; thence by the said main north road westerly to the east boundary of the Borough of Ballarat East; thence north by the said east boundary and the north boundaries of the Borough of Ballarat East and of the City of Ballarat to the commencing point.

Provided that the farm occupied by James Tomkins, being lots 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, and 86 of the parish of Delatite, and lots 6, 7, 12, and 14 of the parish of Merrigig; also the farm occupied by John Hearne, being lots 69, 70, 71, 75, and 80, parish of Delatite, and lots 29, 30, and 31, parish of Merrigig; also the farm occupied by Kenneth McKenzie, being lots 1, 4, 3, 7, 8, 11, and 28, parish of Merrigig; also farm occupied by Lewis Dundas, being lots 18, 19, 21, 132, 133, parish of Bealite, and lot 67, parish of Loyola; as also the road leading from Changua station to Mansfield and from Mansfield to Jamieson, shall form no portion of the Mansfield Quarantine District. *[This district is in lieu of the Mansfield Quarantine District, constituted by Order of 14 August 1871, which has been revoked.]*

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 1.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonoover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brennanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western, southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to Bullock Creek; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the Yarraberb and Tandarra runs; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaniny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the commencing point. Provided that allotment 96 in the parish of Kinypanal, known as Mackin's farm, and allotments 10 and 12, parish of Powlett, known as Clancy's farm, shall form no part of this Clean District.

Pursuant to Order of 28 June 1871.

LIMA CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of the Saintfield station; thence west by the north boundary of that station; thence north by the east boundary of the Strathbogio and Warrenbayne stations; thence east by the south boundary of the Junction station; thence up the Broken River to the north-west corner of the Barjarg station; and thence south-west, along part of the west boundary of that station, to the point of commencement.

Pursuant to Orders of 14 August 1871.

All previous Orders constituting the Clean Districts designated the Mount Battery and the Upotipotpon Districts have been revoked.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Yarraberb run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run and the western boundary of the Taudarra run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaniny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Resdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; thence up that river to the north-eastern angle of that run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the northern boundary of Campaspe River run; thence by part of the northern boundary of that run westerly to the Yarraberb run; and thence by the eastern boundary of that run southerly to the point of commencement.
