WHEREAS by The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870
(34 Vict. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of The Shires Statute, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the flovernor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of The Shires Statute by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to any:—

W HEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth of January 1870, and to the Shire of Darebin by Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth of November 1870: And whereas the said Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District and the said Borough of Woodend, have together been since constituted the Shire of Newham: And whereas the said Shire of Darebin has been since constituted two shires which are respectively designated the Shire of Darebin and the Shire of Jika: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-ninth day of December 1859, and the twenty-fifth day of January and seventeenth day of November 1870, and do revoke so much and such parts thereof as extend Part II. of the recited Act to the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District, the Borough of Woodend, and the Shire of Darebin; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31
