CONSTITUTING A ROAD DISTRICT TO BE A SHIRE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of September 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Mr. Walsh | Mr. O'Grady.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (34 Vict. No. 357, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property as appearing by the general rate then last made shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

THE MOUNT ELIZA ROAD DISTRICT, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of October 1860, and was altered by three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth day of February 1861, the twenty-third day of October 1868, and the eleventh day of September 1871, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PART OF THE SHIRE OF MARONG ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF EAST LODDON.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of November 1871.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor

that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the thirty-first day of August in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four the Shire of Marong was divided into three separate ridings, the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the North-east and North-west Ridings of the Shire of Marong therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Marong, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of East Loddon: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Shire of East Loddon and of the North-east and North-west Ridings of the said Shire of Marong in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF EAST LODDON.—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 125 parish of Kamarooka; thence north (true) along the western boundary of the road on the east side of the said allotment 170 chains; thence north (magnetic) to the centre of Mount Hope Creek; thence northerly by the centre of Mount Hope Creek to a point bearing east of the north boundary of the parish of Jarklin; thence by a direct line west to and by the said north boundary to the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly along the centre of the said River Loddon to a point west of the south-west angle of Yarra-yrne township reserve; thence east along the northern boundary of road to the south-east angle of allotment 5, section 15, parish of Salisbury; thence north along the western boundary of road 50 chains; thence east along the southern boundaries of the parishes of Yallock and Tandarra and the southern boundary of allotment 125, parish of Kamarooka, to the aforesaid south-east angle of said allotment, being the point of commencement.

THE NORTH-EAST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MARONG.—Commencing at a point on the southern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst, where it is intersected by the western boundary of the railway from Melbourne to Sandhurst; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of the said municipality to the western boundary of the Long Gully annexation to the said municipality; thence northerly and easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the said annexation to the northern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence by the said northern boundary east to the Bendigo creek; thence northerly by the Bendigo Creek and the western boundary of the Campaspe Road District (Huntlyshire) to the north boundary of the parish of Neilborough; thence true west to the east boundary of the parish of Yallock; thence south to the south-east angle of the parish of Yallock; thence westerly by the south boundary of said parish to the north-east angle of the parish of Yarraberb; thence southerly to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence westerly to the north-east angle of the parish of Leichardt; thence southerly and westerly by the east and south boundaries of the parish of Leichardt to the north-east angle of the parish of Woodstock;

thence southerly by the east boundary of the parish of Woodstock and a direct line to the centre of the road from Newbridge to Kangaroo Flat; thence easterly by that road to the centre of the road from Melbourne to Sandhurst; thence northerly by the centre of the road from Melbourne to Sandhurst to its intersection with the centre of the road to the Kangaroo Flat Railway station; thence east by the centre of the last-named road to the western boundary of the Melbourne to Sandhurst railway; thence northerly by said western boundary to the commencing point.

THE NORTH-WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MARONG.—Commencing at a point on the road from Newbridge to Kangaroo Flat, south of the south-east angle of the parish of Woodstock; thence northwardly to and by the east boundary of said parish to the south boundary of the parish of Leichardt; thence east and north by the south and east boundaries of said parish to the south boundary of the parish of Yarraberb; thence east and north by the south and east boundaries of the last-named parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Neilborough and the south-west angle of Tandarra parish; thence true west to the east boundary of lot 5, section 15, parish of Salisbury; thence south to the south-east angle of said lot 5; thence by a line bearing true west to the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly by the centre line of the Loddon River to the centre of the road from Newbridge to Kangaroo Flat; thence by that road easterly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the preparation of the Rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the several divisions of the Electoral Provinces and Districts named in the third column of the schedule hereto annexed has been unavoidably impeded by reason of the non-receipt by the Electoral Registrars for such divisions of the Lists (or some portion thereof) of Ratepayers within the time fixed by the Acts Nos. 279 and 334 from the several officers named in the first column of the same schedule, but such lists have since been received by the Registrars aforesaid, and the names appearing thereon are included in the rolls for the respective divisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth hereby declare valid the rolls of Rate-paying Electors for the divisions of the Provinces and Districts hereunder mentioned, containing the lists of names so omitted to be sent as aforesaid, viz.:

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO CERTAIN SHIRES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and to the Borough of Woodend by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fifth of January 1870, and to the Shire of Darebin by Proclamation bearing date the seventeenth of November 1870: And whereas the said Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District and the said Borough of Woodend, have together been since constituted the Shire of Newham: And whereas the said Shire of Darebin has been since constituted two shires which are respectively designated the Shire of Darebin and the Shire of Jika: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamations bearing date respectively the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and the twenty-fifth day of January and seventeenth day of November 1870, and do revoke so much and such parts thereof as extend Part II. of the recited Act to the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District, the Borough of Woodend, and the Shire of Darebin; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Darebin,
The Shire of Jika,
The United Shire of Newham.

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358), has, by Order made on the 16th day of November 1871, directed that the Shire Councils named in the subjoined schedule shall, within twelve months from the said 16th day of November 1871, drain, form, and metal the several lengths of main roads set opposite their respective names, and amounting in all to twenty-five miles eight chains and eighty-four links, as provided by the 29th section of the said Act, according to sufficient plans deposited with the Minister administering the said Act, that is to say:—

[*This district is in lieu of the Mansfield Quarantine District constituted by Order of 14 August 1871, which has been revoked.*]

SEYMOUR QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing on the Goulburn River at a point where the eastern boundary of the Worrrough run abuts thereon; thence up that river to the south-west corner of the Cathkin run; thence by the west boundaries of the Cathkin and Gobur runs to the northern boundary of the last-mentioned run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that run and the northern boundaries of Borodomanin South, Borodomanin North, and Junction runs to the Barjarg run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run to the Lima run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Broken River; thence down that river to the southern boundary of the Goomalibee run; thence south-westerly by that run and the Upotipotpon run to the Stony Creek run; thence by the south-eastern, southern, and western boundaries of that run to

the Gowangardie run; thence by that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the Caniambo run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the south-eastern boundary of Arcadia run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of the Molka run to the south-eastern boundary of Noorilim run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to its junction with Whitehead's Creek; thence by the north and east boundaries of the Meringo run to the Goulburn River; and thence up that river to the point of commencement: Provided that all runs intersected by the boundaries above described shall be held to be within the Seymour Quarantine District: Provided, further, that such part of the Sydney road and all public roads as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads as are included in the boundaries above described shall form no part of the Seymour Quarantine District.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

KILMORE CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Wharparilla run, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the Burnawang East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Carag-carag run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Wanalta West run; thence by the northern, western, and south-western boundaries of that run; thence by the southern boundary of the Wanalta East run to the south-west angle of Poolamba run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence down that river to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

SANDHORST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 1.—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brennanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powell Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western, southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to Bullock Creek; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the Yarraberh and Tandarra runs; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piesaniny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the commencing point: Provided that allotment 96 in the parish of Kirinyapual, known as Mackin's farm, and allotments 10 and 12, parish of Powell, known as Clancy's farm, shall form no part of this Clean District.

Pursuant to Order of 28 June 1871.

LIMA CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of the Saintfield station; thence west by the north boundary of that station; thence north by the east boundary of the Strathbogio and Warrenbayne stations; thence east by the south boundary of the Junction station; thence up the Broken River to the north-west corner of the Barjarg station; and thence south-west, along part of the west boundary of that station, to the point of commencement.

Pursuant to Orders of 14 August 1871.

All previous Orders constituting the Clean Districts designated the Mount Battery and the Upotipotpon Districts have been revoked.

SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2.—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Yarraberb run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run and the western boundary of the Tandarra run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Picanniny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; thence up that river to the north-eastern angle of that run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the northern boundary of Campaspe River run; thence by part of the northern boundary of that run westerly to the Yarraberb run; and thence by the eastern boundary of that run southerly to the point of commencement.

road); from Hamilton to Penshurst; from Hamilton to Macarthur; from Portland to Hamilton *via* Branxholme; from Portland to Coleraine *via* Condah, together with all reserves on such roads, shall form no part of the Hamilton Clean District.

DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870" ALTERED.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the 5th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, and for the purposes of that Act, altered the Scab Districts designated the Mansfield District and the Seymour District, and has assigned to such districts the respective boundaries hereinafter defined, in lieu of the boundaries previously assigned thereto.

The names and addresses of the Inspectors of Sheep for the districts hereby altered are subjoined to each district for general information.
