FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Saturday the Sixth day of January next, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Saturday the Sixth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two until Tuesday the thirteenth day February then next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of December 1871.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Mr. Grant | Mr. McLellan
Mr. Berry | Mr. Spensley.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 15, 16) it is amongst other things enacted, that if any shire and any borough shall adjoin each other and form, together with any highway, creek, or stream, which shall be the common boundary, one continuous area, or if any borough shall be surrounded by any such shire and such common boundary and form with such shire such continuous area, and if an annual or general election, or first appointment of councillors shall have taken place in and for such shire under the Act numbered one hundred and seventy-six hereby repealed or this Act, and in and for such borough under *The Municipal Corporations Act* 1863, or under *The Boroughs Statute*, and if the council of such shire and the council of such borough shall by petitions under their several common seals pray the Governor that such shire and such borough with such area may be formed into one shire under this Act, it shall be lawful for the Governor to constitute the same with such area one shire, by such name as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to such shire, and such shires shall be a united shire to all intents and purposes. In every case in which any borough shall have been united with any shire the Governor may direct that all the powers relating to matters not herein otherwise provided for shall be vested in the council of the united shire, and all such powers shall thereupon be read and take effect accordingly; and it is also enacted that upon every union of shires or of a shire and borough, or of road districts into a shire, if in the case of such first-mentioned union either or any of the several shires so united shall be a single shire, and in the case of the union of a shire and borough if such shire shall before then have been by the Governor divided into ridings or such borough shall before then have been divided into wards, and in the case of the union of road districts into a shire if any of such road districts shall before then have been divided into subdivisions such divisions shall be void, and (unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the Governor) each of the several shires so united which shall be a single shire and each riding of any such shire previously having been a united shire and in the case of the union of a shire and borough or road districts into a shire such borough and every such road district shall become and be by the name theretofore borne by the same respectively a riding of the shire formed by such first-mentioned union: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five the Beechworth United Road District was constituted; and by an Order in Council made on the eighth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six the said road district was constituted a shire, under the designation of the Shire of Beechworth; and by another Order in Council made on the thirtieth day of April One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six the said shire was divided into three separate ridings: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-sixth of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six the borough of Beechworth was constituted: And whereas the council of the said shire of Beechworth and the council of the said borough of Beechworth have by petitions under their respective common seals prayed the Governor that such shire and borough ad-

joining each other, and forming together with their common boundary one continuous area, may with such area be formed into one shire under the said Act: And whereas notices of the said petitions have been duly published in the manner prescribed by the 29th section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the said shire of Beechworth and the said borough of Beechworth which adjoin each other and form together with their common boundary one continuous area to be one shire under the said Act by the name and with the area hereinafter set forth and described, that is to say:—

THE UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.—Commencing at the junction of the Myrtle Creek with the River Ovens; thence north-westerly by the Ovens River to a point south of the road between allotments 9 and 10 in Tarrawingee East, being the south-east angle of the North Ovens shire boundary; thence north by the centre of that road and a straight line to a point due west of the Pilot Hill; thence by a line due east to the Pilot Hill; thence by the southern and south-western boundaries of the Yackandandah shire to the source of the Myrtle Creek; thence by that creek to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PART OF THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the thirtieth day of November One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the Shire of Portland was constituted: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventh day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four the Shire of Dundas was divided into three separate ridings, the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Portland therein described, and notices of such petitions have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Shire of Portland, described in such petition, from such shire, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the South Riding of the Shire of Dundas: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Shire of Portland and of the South Riding of the said Shire of Dundas in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF PORTLAND.—Commencing on the sea-coast at the south-east corner of South Australia; thence north by the eastern boundary line of South Australia to the south-west angle of the township of Lindsay; thence by a line east to the River Glenelg; thence southerly by the River Glenelg to its junction with the Stokes River; thence north-easterly by the Stokes River to a point south-west of the south-east angle of allotment 4, section 4, in the parish of Grassdale; thence by a line north-east to the said south-east angle of said allotment; thence north to the north-east angle of section 4 in the said parish; thence by a line north to the eastern angle of section 17 in the parish of Tahara; thence by a line east to the centre of the road from Green Hills to Coleraine; thence northerly by said road to the Wannon River; thence south-easterly by that river to the north-west angle of the parish of Murrudal; thence south by the western boundary of that parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 3 and 4 in the said parish; thence westwardly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 17 of section D in the parish of Tahara; thence south by the western boundaries of said allotment 17 and of allotments 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 of said section D, to the road from Green Hills to Coleraine; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of section 19 in the parish of Murrudal; thence easterly by the road on the north of the parish boundary of Branxholme, and by said parish boundary

to the north-east angle of section 6 in the said parish; thence south by the parish boundary to the main road from Braxholme to Hamilton; thence north-easterly by that road to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Yulecart and the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section in the parish of Byambynee; thence southerly by that line to the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundaries of the shires of Minnamite and Belfast to the sea-coast; thence westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point, excepting the borough of Portland.

THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Murndal; thence south by the western boundary of that parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 3 and 4 in the said parish; thence westerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 17 of section D in the parish of Tuhara; thence south by the western boundaries of said allotment 17 and of allotments 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 of said section D to the road from Green Hills to Coleraine; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of section 19 in the parish of Murndal; thence easterly by the road on the north of the parish boundary of Brauxholme and by said parish boundary to the north-east angle of section 6 in the said parish; thence south by the parish boundary to the main road from Braxholme to Hamilton; thence north-easterly by that road to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Yulecart and the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section in the parish of Byambynee; thence southerly by that line to the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said pre-emptive section to its south-west angle; thence by a direct line south-easterly to the north-west angle of the Weerancourt pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of the said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section 4, parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of said section 4 and the south-west and southern boundaries of section 2 of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said county to the southern boundary of the county of Dundas; thence by the said southern boundary westerly to the commencing point.

RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF YACKANDANDAH ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eighteenth day of December 1871.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI, hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of January 1866 the Shire of Yackandandah was divided into ridings: And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Order in Council and again to divide the said shire into ridings: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the said Shire of Yackandandah, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order rescind the Order in Council of the 26th day of January 1866, hereinbefore mentioned, and doth hereby divide anew the said Shire of Yackandandah into Three Ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE NORTH-WESTERN RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Indigo Creek with the River Murray; thence easterly by the River Murray to a point due north of the western boundary of the parish of Belvoir West; thence south by the western boundary of the said parish and a straight line to the range forming the eastern watershed of the Indigo Creek; thence by that range to the source of Middle Creek; thence by the range forming the watershed of Commissioner's and Indigo Creek to the Yackandandah Gap; thence by a line to Mount Pilot; thence by a line due north to Indigo Creek, and by the Indigo Creek to the River Murray, being the point of commencement.

THE NORTH-EASTERN RIDING.—Commencing at a point in the River Murray due north of the western boundary of the

parish of Belvoir West; thence by the western boundary of the parish of Belvoir West and a straight line due south to the range forming the eastern watershed of the Indigo Creek; thence by that range to the source of Middle Creek; thence by a straight line north-easterly to the southern angle of section 14, in the parish of Baranduda; thence by a line east to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence northerly by that boundary to the River Mitta-mitta, and by the Mitta-mitta to the Murray, and westerly by the River Murray to the point of commencement.

THE SOUTH-EASTERN RIDING.—Commencing at the southern angle of section 14, in the parish of Baranduda; thence by a line east to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence southerly, easterly, and north-westerly by the eastern and southern boundaries of the shire to the Yackandandah Gap; thence by the range forming the watershed of the Commissioner's and Indigo Creek to the source of the Middle Creek; and thence by a straight line north-easterly to the southern angle of section 14, in the parish of Baranduda, being the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The deaths in November exceeded those in October by 7. They also exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 21, but if allowance be made for the increase of population during the decennial they will be found to have been less than the average of November by 30.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89°2' on the 21st, and the lowest was 41°5' on the 7th. The mean temperature of the month (60°4') was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36°9') took place on the 7th, viz.:—from a maximum of 78°4' to a minimum of 41°5'. The least range (8°9') was on the 1st, viz.:—from a maximum of 57°1' to a minimum of 48°2'. The mean daily range was 20°3'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29 854 inches) was a little below the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females; 42 per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year, against 48 per cent. in November 1870, 47 per cent. in November 1869, 49 per cent. in November 1868, 45 per cent. in November 1867, 60 per cent. in November 1866, 60 per cent. in November 1865, 43 per cent. in November 1864, 47 per cent. in November 1863, 65 per cent. in November 1862, and 51 per cent. in November 1861.

Five persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 76 of peritonitis, a female aged 80 of palsy, two males aged respectively 80 and 83, and a female aged 80 of old age.

Twelve violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A bricklayer aged 25 died of accidental injuries to the thigh, a coachman aged 26 was killed by a cart-wheel passing over his chest, a butcher aged 26 died of tetanus resulting from a fall, an accountant aged 37 died of shock to the system the result of a surgical operation, a girl aged 1 died of scalds, a cutter aged 55 was burnt to death in a house, a girl aged 12, a seaman aged 20, and a laborer aged 34 were accidentally drowned, a woman aged 47 cut her throat, an insane male aged 52 poisoned himself, and a female aged 28 (also insane) drowned herself.

Seventy-four deaths, or 28 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 13 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 63, or 52½ per cent., were of males, and 57, or 47½ per cent., were of females; 88 were under one year of age, 20 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 164, of which 89, or 54 per cent., were males, and 75, or 46 per cent., were females; 6 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 11 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 9 were between fifty-five and sixty, 7 were between sixty and sixty-five, 9 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 1 was between seventy-five and eighty, 4 were eighty and upwards, and 1 was of age unspecified.

Zymotic diseases caused 59 deaths, against 65 in October. Under this head, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 31 to 14, and deaths from typhoid and infantile fever fell from 7 to 3. On the other hand, deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery increased from 7 to 20, and deaths from croup increased from 1 to 4. Scarlatina and diphtheria caused 5 deaths in both months. The most fatal class of complaints was still the local, which caused 109 deaths in October, and 105 in November. Under the head, "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis caused 46 deaths in the former, and 38 deaths in the latter month.

BARTON RUN.—Commencing at the point where the Lexington run crosses the summit of the Mount William Range; thence by that range and a line, being the eastern boundary of the Mount Burchet run, bearing southerly and south-westerly to the Yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Yarram-yarram run; thence by that run bearing south-easterly to the Mount William run; thence by that run bearing north-easterly and easterly to the Mount William Plains run; thence by that run and by the Burrumbeep run, bearing north-easterly to the Lexington run aforesaid; and thence by that run westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

STAFFORDSHIRE REEF CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE STAFFORDSHIRE REEF CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the vault or ground is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his and their representatives for ever.

3. Application of such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission in form set forth in schedule A will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day between 10 o'clock a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but persons requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on satisfactory evidence being produced to the trustees of the inability of the relations or friends of the deceased to pay the "fees and charges."

7. Hours for interment from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., except in special cases, as where death is occasioned by any contagious disease. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually attended to.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in proper repair at the expense of the owner. A plan of the cemetery showing the situation of the purchased and other graves is kept at the office. Registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary, by *The Cemetery Statute 1864*.

9. Any person or persons who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do, or cause any damage to be done to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by law, and is liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds (£20), or at the discretion of the justices to three months imprisonment, and to the payment of all damages therefor.

10. A plan of every monument, tombstone, and railing proposed to be erected and placed shall be exhibited to the said trustees before permission for the erection thereof is given, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission and prevent the erection of any monument, tombstone, or railing which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument, tombstone, or railing which may be proposed to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.

11. Wooden fences allowed subject to the approval of the trustees, and which, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees after two weeks notice having been given to the owners.

12. No vehicle of any kind allowed inside the cemetery without special permission of the trustees in writing.

13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these rules and regulations.
