EAST COLLINGWOOD VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

THE following new code of Rules for the East Collingwood Volunteer Rifle Corps has received the approval of the Governor in Council.

EAST COLLINGWOOD VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

1. An annual meeting of the corps, of which one week's notice shall be given, shall be held in the month of July in each year at which a committee, a secretary, and two auditors shall be elected.

2. The committee shall consist of twelve members, exclusive of the secretary and commissioned officers who shall *ex officio* be members thereof, five to form a quorum.

3. The duties of the committee shall be to decide upon any matters referred to them by the commanding officer, and generally to give expression to the wishes of the majority of the corps in civil business. No vote or resolution of the committee shall be deemed to be of greater force or effect than a recommendation for the consideration of the commanding officer.

4. The secretary shall attend the meetings of the corps and of the committee, keep clear and intelligible minutes or records of all proceedings at such meetings, have the custody of all letters and papers connected with the corps, and conduct the correspondence relating thereto under the direction of the commanding officer.

5. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve members, provided the subject to be dealt with be not of a military nature. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps and it shall have been called by advertisements inserted in three of the daily papers previous to the day of meeting.

6. No person shall be allowed to vote or take part in the proceedings at any meeting who is not at the time an effective member of the corps, or who shall have any unpaid fine or penalty recorded against him. This rule is not to apply to members newly joined who have passed recruit drill.

7. At every meeting of the corps, or of the committee, the senior officer present shall preside.

8. A bank account shall be kept in the name of the corps to which all money granted by the Government, together with all sums arising from fines or other sources, shall at once be paid by the commanding officer, or by any person authorized by him to receive them.

9. Each recruit, after being sworn in as a member of the corps, shall receive a uniform, to be paid for from the funds of the corps, and the cost of the uniform shall be deemed an advance of so much actual cash, which the recruit or member is to repay by making himself effective as per Volunteer Regulations.

10. Any member failing to make himself effective, as per Volunteer Regulations, shall be liable to a fine of Forty shillings, but the commanding officer may at his discretion remit the whole or any part of such fine.

11. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of the arms, accoutrements, clothing, and other property of the corps issued to him, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him, fair wear and tear alone excepted.

12. The uniform, arms, accoutrements, or other property of the corps issued to any member shall, under all circumstances of resignation or otherwise, remain the property of the corps.

13. Any member failing to produce at the orderly room the arms, accoutrements, uniform, or other property issued to him, at the time appointed by the commanding officer, shall be liable to a fine of Five shillings.

14. Any member changing his residence must give notice of the same to the commanding officer in writing within fourteen days, and if he fail to do so shall, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be fined Two shillings and sixpence.

15. Any member who shall leave his residence for a period of more than thirty days without giving notice in writing to the commanding officer, and without previously depositing his arms, uniform, and accoutrements at the orderly room, shall, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be fined a sum not exceeding Ten shillings.

16. A list of all fines shall be signed by the commanding officer and posted in the orderly room, and such fines shall be paid to the secretary or other person appointed by the commanding officer to receive them, within fourteen days of such posting.

17. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding or adding to the above rules must give fourteen days' notice of such intention to the commanding officer, who shall, on a requisition duly signed by twelve members, convene a special meeting of the corps to consider the same, and the proposed rules or alterations of rules shall be posted in the orderly room at least seven days prior to such meeting.

18. Every member joining the corps shall be supplied with a copy of these rules.

EMERALD HILL VICTORIAN VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*. And whereas the preparation of the Roll of Rate-paying Electors for the Caramut division of the Western Province has been unavoidably impeded by reason of the non-receipt by the Electoral Registrar of the said division of the List within the time fixed by the Act No. 384 from the secretary of the shire of Minhamite, but such list has since been received by the Registrar aforesaid, and incorporated in the roll for the said division: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth hereby declare valid the Roll of Rate-paying Electors for the Caramut division of the Western Province containing the list so omitted to be sent as aforesaid.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application in writing of the respective councils of shires and road board of a road district mentioned in the first column of the annexed Schedule, do hereby proclaim the shires and road district, or parts thereof specified in the second column of such schedule, with the exceptions specially therein named, to be districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

Ballan, Shire of	The whole of the Shire of Ballan.
Barrabool, Shire of	The Ceres Riding of the Shire of Barrabool.
Broadford, Road District	The whole of the Broadford Road District.
Glenlyon, Shire of	The whole of the Shire of Glenlyon, with the exception of the Malmesbury to Daylesford main road, and within forty chains of each side of said road.
Korong, Shire of	The townships of Wedderburn, Kingover, and East Charlton, and the area comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of the borough of Inglewood.
Kyneton, Shire of	The Carlsruhe, Lauriston, and Edgcombe, and Tylden and Trentham ridings of the Shire of Kyneton.

Metcalfe, Shire of	That portion of the Shire of Metcalfe bounded on the east and west by lines parallel to and equidistant from the centre of the Mount Alexander main road, such distance being twenty chains on each side of the centre of said road, measured at right angles thereto; bounded on the north by a line at right angles to said road through the south-east angle of allotment 33, section 12, parish of Elphinstone, and terminated by the aforesaid parallel lines; and bounded on the south by a line at right angles to said main road and similarly terminated by the aforesaid parallel lines drawn through the intersection of the south boundary of the parish of Elphinstone with the said Mount Alexander main road; such area embracing the township of Taradale.

UNITED COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish, any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE UNITED MOLIAGUL, IKKERMAN, AND WATTLE FLAT GOLDMINE COMMONS which was described in a proclamation bearing date the 21st day of November 1864, and was diminished by a proclamation bearing date the 8th day of January 1866, and the Moliagul Agricultural Area Temporary Common which was described in a proclamation bearing date the 22nd day of October 1866.—(71.A.17275.)

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas an Order, bearing even date herewith, has been by me made with the advice of the Executive Council, defining the places and times as hereinafter set forth at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in Victoria during the year 1872: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said Order defining and appointing the places and times at which the several Circuit Courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two to be as follow, that is to say:—

At ARARAT, on—

Tuesday the twentieth day of February.
Friday the nineteenth day of July.

At BALLARAT, on—

Friday the twenty-third day of February.
Monday the twenty-second day of April.
Tuesday the twenty-third day of July.
Friday the fourth day of October.

At BEECHWORTH, on—

Tuesday the sixteenth day of April.
Wednesday the sixteenth day of October.

At BELFAST, on—

Thursday the fifteenth day of February.
Monday the fifteenth day of July.

At CASTLEMAINE, on—

Friday the sixteenth day of February.
Monday the twenty-second day of April.
Friday the nineteenth day of July.
Thursday the tenth day of October.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the city of Canterbury, in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford, in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend such of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute as are hereinafter mentioned to HIGH STREET, in the township of BRADWICK, that is to say:—

THE FIRST NINETEEN CLAUSES OF SECTION V, AND THE WHOLE OF SECTIONS IX., X., XI., AND XII.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of December, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

"MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1871."

CHAP. 110.

An Act to amend the *Merchant Shipping Acts*.

[21st August 1871.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the *Merchant Shipping Acts*:-

Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

PRELIMINARY.

1. *Short title*.—This Act may be cited as the *Merchant Shipping Act 1871*.

2. *Act to be construed with Merchant Shipping Acts*.—This Act shall be construed as one with the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the Acts amending the same, and the said Acts and this Act may be cited collectively as the *Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 to 1871*.

3. *Commencement of Act*.—This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

REGISTRY (PART II. OF MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1854).

4. *Particulars to be marked on ship before registry*.—Every British ship shall, before registry, be permanently and conspicuously marked to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs, as follows, that is to say:-

Her name shall be marked on each of her bows, and her name and the name of her port of registry shall be marked on her stern on a dark ground in white or yellow letters, of a length not less than four inches, and of proportionate breadth. Her official number and the number denoting her registered tonnage shall be marked on her main beam.

A scale of feet shall be marked on her stem and on her stern post in roman capital letters or in figures, six inches in length, the lower line of such letters or figures to coincide with the draught line denoted thereby.

The Board of Trade may however, exempt any class of ships from the requirements of this section or any of them.

If the said scale of feet is in any respect inaccurate, so as to be likely to mislead, the owner of the ship shall incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.

The marks required by this section shall be permanently continued, and no alteration shall be made therein, excepting the event of any of the particulars thereby denoted being altered in the manner provided by the *Merchant Shipping Acts 1854 to 1871*. Any owner or master of a ship who neglects to keep his ship marked as aforesaid, and any person who conceals, removes, alters, defaces, or obliterates, or suffers any person under his control to conceal, remove, alter, deface, or obliterate any of the said marks, except in the event aforesaid, or except for the purpose of escaping capture by an enemy, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds; and any principal officer of Customs may detain a ship which is insufficiently and inaccurately marked until the insufficiency or inaccuracy has been remedied; provided that no fishing vessel duly registered, lettered, and numbered in pursuance of the *Sea Fisheries Act 1868*, shall be required to have her name and port of registry marked under this section.

5. *Ship's draught of water to be recorded*.—The Board of Trade may in any case or class of cases in which they think it expedient so to do, direct any person appointed by them for the purpose to record, in such manner and with such particulars as the Board of Trade direct, the draught of water of any sea-going ship, as shown on the scale of feet on her stem and on her stern post, upon her leaving any dock, wharf, port, or harbor for the purpose of proceeding to sea; and such person shall thereupon keep such record, and shall from time to time forward the same, or a copy thereof, to the Board of Trade; and such record, or any copy thereof, if produced by or out of the custody of the Board of Trade, shall be admissible in evidence of the draught of water of the ship at the time specified in the record.

The master of every British sea-going ship shall, upon her leaving any dock, wharf, port, or harbor, for the purpose of proceeding to sea, record her draught of water in the official logbook (if any), and shall produce such record to any principal officer of customs whenever required by him so to do, or in default of such production shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

6. *Rules to be observed in naming of ships*.—With respect to the names of British ships, the following rules shall be observed:-

- (1.) A ship shall not be described by any name other than that by which she is for the time being registered.
- (2.) No change shall be made in the name of a ship without the previous permission of the Board of Trade signified in writing under their seal, or under the hand of one of their secretaries or assistant secretaries. Upon such permission being granted, the ship's name shall forthwith be altered in the register book, in the ship's certificate of registry, and on her bows and stern.
- (3.) If in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade that the name of any ship has been changed without such permission as aforesaid, they shall direct

that her name be altered into that which she bore before such change, and the name shall be altered in the register book, in the ship's certificate of registry, and on her bows and stern accordingly.

- (4.) Where a ship having once been registered has ceased to be so registered, no person, unless ignorant of such previous registry (proof whereof shall lie on him), shall apply to register, and no registrar shall knowingly register such ship except by the name by which she was previously registered, unless with the permission of the Board of Trade granted as aforesaid.

Every person who acts or suffers any person under his control to act in contravention of this section, or who omits to do, or suffers any person under his control to omit to do, anything required by this section, shall for each offence incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds, and any principal officer of customs may detain the ship until the provisions of this section are complied with.

Application for a change of name shall be made in writing to the Board of Trade. If the Board are of opinion that the application is made on reasonable grounds they may entertain the same, and shall thereupon require notice thereof to be published in such form and manner as they think fit.

MASTERS AND SEAMEN (PART III. OF MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT 1854).

7. *Survey of ships alleged by seamen to be unseaworthy*.—Whenever in any proceeding against any seaman or apprentice belonging to any ship for desertion, or for neglecting or refusing to join or to proceed to sea in his ship, or for being absent from or quitting the same without leave, it is alleged by one fourth of the seamen belonging to such ship, or, if the number of such seamen exceed twenty, by not less than five such seamen, that such ship is by reason of unseaworthiness, overloading, improper loading, defective equipment, or for any other reason, not in a fit condition to proceed to sea, or that the accommodation in such ship is insufficient, the court having cognizance of the case shall take such means as may be in their power to satisfy themselves concerning the truth or untruth of such allegation, and shall for that purpose receive the evidence of the person or persons making the same, and shall have power to summon any other witnesses whose evidence they may think it desirable to hear; the court shall thereupon, if satisfied that the allegation is groundless, proceed to adjudicate, but if not so satisfied shall cause such ship to be surveyed.

Provided that no seaman or apprentice charged with desertion, or with quitting his ship without leave, shall have any right to apply for a survey under this section unless previously to his quitting his ship he has complained to the master of the circumstances so alleged in justification.

For the purposes of this section, the court shall require any of the surveyors appointed by the Board of Trade, under the *Merchant Shipping Act, 1854*, or any person appointed for the purpose by the Board of Trade, or, if such surveyor or person cannot be obtained without unreasonable expense or delay, or is not, in the opinion of the court, competent to deal with the special circumstances of the case, then any other impartial surveyor appointed by the court, and having no interest in the ship, her freight, or cargo, to survey the ship, and to answer any question concerning her which the court may think fit to put. Such surveyor or other person shall survey the ship, and make his report in writing to the court, including an answer to every question put to him by the court. The court shall cause such report to be communicated to the parties, and unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the court that the opinions expressed in such report are erroneous, the court shall determine the questions before them in accordance with those opinions.

For the purposes of such survey, a surveyor shall have all the powers of an inspector appointed by the Board of Trade under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1854*.

The costs (if any) of the survey shall be determined by the Board of Trade according to a scale of fees to be fixed by them, and shall be paid in the first instance out of the *Mercantile Marine Fund*.

If it is proved to the satisfaction of the court that the ship is in a fit condition to proceed to sea, or, as the case may be, that the accommodation is sufficient, the costs of the survey shall be paid by the person or persons upon whose demand, or in consequence of whose allegation, the survey was made, and may be deducted by the master or owner out of the wages due or to become due to such person or persons, and shall be paid over to the Board of Trade.

If it is proved that the ship is not in a fit condition to proceed to sea, or, as the case may be, that the accommodation is insufficient, the costs of the survey shall be paid to the Board of Trade by the master or owner.

8. *Power for naval courts to direct survey of ships*.—Any naval court may, if they think fit, direct a survey of any ship which is the subject of an investigation held before them, and such survey shall be made in the same way, and the surveyor who makes the same shall have the same powers, as if the survey had been directed by a competent court in the course of proceedings against a seaman or apprentice for desertion or a kindred offence.

SAFETY (PART IV. OF MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1854).

9. *In cases of collision master to give name, &c., of vessel*.—In every case of collision between two vessels it shall be the duty of the master of each vessel to give to the master of the other vessel the name of his own vessel, and of her port of registry, or of the port or place to which she belongs, and also the names of the ports or places from which and to which she is bound.

Any failure to give such information, except under circumstances which render it impossible or unnecessary to do so (proof of which shall lie on the master failing to give it), shall

involve the same consequences as failure to render assistance to the other vessel, or to the master, crew, or passengers thereof.

In this section the term "vessel" includes any vessel used in navigation, however propelled.

10. *Power to Board of Trade to declare ship unseaworthy.*—If complaint is made to the Board of Trade that any British ship is, by reason of the defective condition of her hull or equipments, unfit to proceed to sea, the Board may cause such ship to be surveyed by one of the surveyors appointed by them, and if such surveyor report that the hull or equipments of such ship is or are in such a state that she could not proceed to sea without serious danger to human life, the Board may declare such ship to be unseaworthy, and thereupon any principal officer of Customs may detain such ship.

Every such complaint shall be in writing, and shall state the name and address of the complainant, and a copy of the complaint, including the name and address of the complainant, shall before or during such survey be given by the Board of Trade to the master or to an owner of the ship.

If, upon such survey, such ship is found to be seaworthy, the expenses of the survey shall be paid to the Board of Trade by the person making the complaint, without prejudice to any right of suit or action against him by any person aggrieved by the complaint.

If, upon such survey, such ship is found to be unseaworthy, the expenses of the survey shall be paid to the Board of Trade by the owner of the ship.

Any shipowner who is dissatisfied with the decision of a surveyor under this section may appeal to any of the courts mentioned in this section having jurisdiction in the place where such ship was surveyed, and such court may, if they think fit, appoint one or more competent persons to survey such ship anew, and any surveyor so appointed shall have the powers of a surveyor appointed by the Board of Trade. Upon any such appeal the court may make such order as to the detention or discharge of the ship, as to the payment of any costs and damages which may have been occasioned by her detention, and as to the payment of the expenses of the original survey and of the survey anew, as to the court seems just.

The courts to which appeal may be made shall be—

In England, any court having jurisdiction under the County Court Admiralty Jurisdiction, 1868:

In Ireland, any court having jurisdiction under the Court of Admiralty (Ireland) Act, 1867:

In Scotland, the court of the sheriff of the county.

11. *Sending unseaworthy ship to sea, a misdemeanor.*—Every person who, having authority as owner or otherwise to send a ship to sea, sends her to sea in an unseaworthy state so as to endanger the life of any person belonging to or on board the same, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, unless he proves that he used all reasonable means to make and keep the ship seaworthy, and was ignorant of such unseaworthiness, or that her going to sea in an unseaworthy state was, under the circumstances, reasonable and unavoidable, and for this purpose he may give evidence in the same manner as any other witness. A misdemeanor under this section shall not be punishable on summary conviction.

12. *Repeal of certain sections of 17 & 18 Vict. c. 104, and 18 & 19 Vict. c. 91.*—On and after the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, the twenty-fifth and thirty-fourth sections of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, and the thirteenth section of *The Merchant Shipping Act amendment Act 1855*, shall be repealed.

AUSTRALIA—VICTORIA—LADY BAY.

Alteration in lights in Warrnambool Harbor.

WITH reference to notice to mariners, No. 16, dated 27th February 1871, respecting an alteration in the lights at Warrnambool harbor, Lady Bay—

The Colonial Government at Melbourne has given notice that the following alteration in the lights has been made:—

The upper light is a *fixed white* light, visible from east round by north to north-west, elevated 109 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 14 miles.

The lower light is a *fixed red* light, visible between the bearings north $\frac{1}{2}$ east and north by west, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 5 miles.

A *fixed green* light is exhibited from the extremity of Warrnambool jetty, which jetty extends 230 yards from the shore.

Directions.—Vessels entering Warrnambool harbor from the westward or southward should first sight the red light (carefully avoiding the seventeen foot patch which lies S.S.E.

half a mile from Middle Island), and then bringing it in line with the white light, bearing north, steer in between the five fathom bank and the foul ground south-east of the breakwater rock until the green light on the jetty is opened, when steer in for it and anchor. From the eastward, either bring the marks above described on, or cross the bar to the south-eastward, taking care not to shut the white light in when standing towards the mouth of Hopkins River:

It is not safe to enter or leave the harbor in south-westerly or southerly gales. In bad weather, or with a heavy southerly swell, the sea breaks at the distance of a mile from the land.
