## GRANT FOR PURCHASE OF BOOKS FOR MECHANICS' INSTITUTES OR PUBLIC LIBRARIES, 1871-2.

THE Committees for the Management of Mechanics' Institutes or Public Libraries in country districts claiming to participate in the grant of £9000 for the purchase of Books are hereby requested to send in their applications before the 8th of March next.

The conditions attached to the item in the Appropriation Act are as follow:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to sum collected by private subscription or local rates during 1871.
2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

## AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1871-2.

APPLICATION for a share in the sum of £2000 granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries in the up-country districts will be received at this office until the 8th of March next.

No grant to any library is to exceed £500.

N.B.—To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bond fide* a free library, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz.:—

1. The name of the institution, which should clearly indicate that it is a FREE LIBRARY.
2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1871.

## PORTLAND LINE OF RAILWAY.

IN pursuance of the 102nd section of *The Land Act 1869*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has revoked an Order temporarily withholding for Twelve months, from the 1st December 1871, from sale, leasing, or licensing, the Crown lands within the red lines on the plan annexed to the documents distinguished as No. 72E.2008, comprising about 75,000 acres, pending application to the Legislature by the promoters of the Portland line of railway, with a view to endowment towards construction of the proposed railway. In lieu of the lands hereinbefore referred to, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the Crown lands in the county of Loran, indicated by blue tint on the plan above mentioned, comprising in the whole 163,392 acres, more or less, to be withheld as aforesaid for the object stated.

## GREAT NORTH-EAST CHANNEL, TORRES STRAITS.

A DANGEROUS sunken rock lying in the fairway of the Great North-East Channel, is reported by Mr. Jardine, the Police Magistrate at Somerset.

The rock is described as being about 20 yards in diameter, with six feet of water over it at low-water, and lying E. & S., 1½ miles from Saddle Island.

To avoid this danger, vessels after passing Bet Islet should haul well to the southward, giving Saddle Island a wide berth, before steering to pass Ninepin Rock, which is steep to and may be left on either hand.

## HYDROGRAPHIC NOTICE.—(No. 19).—SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

THE following account of a newly-discovered rock in the Friendly Islands Group has been received from Captain J. E. Montgomerie, H.M.S. *Blanche*.\*

### TONGA OR FRIENDLY ISLANDS.

H.M.S. *Blanche*, when on her passage from Vavau to Tonga, and about midway between Lettè and Kao Islands, saw a rock a few feet above water. Owing to the hazy state of the atmosphere at the time no land could be seen to verify by bearings the exact position of the ship; but, as the run from the last land seen had been made in four and a half hours, and Kao Island was seen one and a quarter hours after the discovery of the rock, the assigned position of lat. 19° 17' S. long. 174° 45' W. must be near the truth.

With reference to the above danger, it is stated on the authority of Captain Sir Everard Home, H.M.S. *Calliope*, who visited the Friendly Group in 1852, that a volcano, or the indications of one, had been perceived about half way between the islands of Kao and Lettè; and about twelve months previous smoke had been seen issuing from the surface of the sea. This was an object of search, and it was made, but without success.

From the foregoing account it is probable that the rock observed in H.M.S. *Blanche* is the same as those shoals marked on the Admiralty Chart, No. 2421, in doubtful positions, as the Home Shoal, St. Michael Shoal, and a reef, N. & W., 22 miles from Kao Island.

**TOWN OF DONALD**—County of Kara-kara, parish of Banyenong: Commencing on the right bank of the Richardson river, at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 7; bounded thence by that allotment bearing east thirty-two chains fifty links to the road from Swan Hill to St. Arnaud; thence by that road bearing S. 10° E. one hundred and eight chains, more or less, to the road which forms the north-western boundary of allotment 1 of section 11; thence by that road bearing S. 48° 50' W. thirty-one chains, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement.—(71.B.2277.)

The deaths in January 1872, exceeded those in December 1871, by 87. They also exceeded the average of the month in the previous ten years by 55. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of January by 25.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 103°3' on the 16th, and the lowest was 46°7' on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (69°1') was 3° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41°) took place on the 6th, viz.:—from a maximum of 96° to a minimum of 55°. The least range (25°) was on the 31st, viz.:—from a maximum of 64°5' to a minimum of 39°. The mean daily range was 21°4'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29°806 inches) was slightly below the average.

Fifty-four per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 46 per cent. were of females; 56 per cent. were of children under five years of age, against 57 per cent. in January 1871; 58 per cent. in January 1870; 58 per cent. in January 1869; 62 per cent. in January 1868; 75 per cent. in January 1867; 65½ per cent. in January 1866; 65 per cent. in January 1865; 64 per cent. in January 1864; 64 per cent. in January 1863, and 68 per cent. in January 1862.

Six persons of 75 years of age, and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male, aged 77, of dysentery; a female, aged 75, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 76, of hepatitis; and three females, aged respectively 75, 80 and 83, of old age.

Twenty-one violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A boy aged 5 was killed by a wheel passing over him, a plater aged 29 died from accidental injuries received on the North-Eastern railway line, an architect aged 53 died of an injury to the spine accidentally received, a girl aged 6 died of burns, and a boy aged 9 of scalds; a laborer aged 33 died of sunstroke, an engineer aged 28 died from the effects of an excessive dose of laudanum, a medical practitioner aged 58 was accidentally poisoned by blistering fluid, a boy aged 4½ was found drowned, a girl aged 11 and six males aged respectively 12, 15, 17, 18, 30, and 71 were accidentally drowned; a female infant was suffocated in bed, a male infant was purposely drowned by its mother, a male aged 65 died of injury to the head (verdict manslaughter), a woolsorter aged 49 died of a wound in the throat, self-inflicted whilst laboring under suicidal mania; and a laborer aged 50 poisoned himself with laudanum.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—44 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, and 3 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 264, of which 131, or nearly 50 per cent., were of males, and 133 were of females. Of those who died, 194 were under one year of age, 50 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 7 was between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 207, of which 125, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 82, or 40 per cent., were of females; 16 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 8 between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 6 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Melbourne and suburbs, during the month of January 1872:—

Most deaths were caused by local diseases, which is an unusual circumstance in the month of January. The most fatal complaints under this head were diseases of the nervous system which caused 65 deaths, and diseases of the digestive organs which caused 46 deaths. Under the head "Zymotic Diseases," diarrhoea and dysentery caused 86 deaths as against 64 deaths in December; under the head "Developmental Diseases," atrophy and debility caused 49 deaths as against 35 in December; and under the head "Constitutional Diseases," phthisis, combined with hæmoptysis, caused 40 deaths as against 38 in December.

## ADMISSION OF GOATS AND POULTRY INTO CERTAIN PARKS AND OTHER RESERVES PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of public reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, have made the following Regulations with reference to the entry of goats or poultry into the undermentioned reserves.

No goats or poultry shall, under any circumstances, be allowed to enter Albert Park, Fitz Roy Garden, Treasury Garden, Flagstaff Hill Garden, the plantation reserves at Parliament House, or Studley Park.

Owners of goats or poultry allowing the same to stray into any of the parks or reserves hereinbefore mentioned, shall be liable, on conviction thereof before any justice, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence.

## LICENSES FOR OCCUPATION OF LANDS FOR FISHERMEN'S RESIDENCES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, in pursuance of the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869*, altered the regulations, made on the 1st February 1870, relating to the issue of licenses for other than agricultural or pastoral purposes, under Part 3 of the said Act, so far as the same relate to the issue of licenses for the occupation of Crown lands for fishermen's residences, by substituting the fees and distances specified in the schedule herewith for and in lieu of the fees and distances prescribed in Schedule L to the said regulations, viz.:—

The fee for a license to occupy twenty (20) perches of Crown lands as a site for a fisherman's residence within a distance of one hundred (100) feet of highwater mark shall be Five shillings (5s.) per annum, payable in advance, when such site is not within any borough or township or within a distance of thirty (30) miles from Melbourne, and shall be Ten shillings (10s.) per annum, payable in advance, when such site is from seven (7) to thirty (30) miles distant from Melbourne but not within any borough or township.

The fee for a license to occupy Crown lands as a site for a fisherman's residence within a borough or town shall be One pound (£1) per annum, payable in advance, unless such site be within the borough of Sandridge or the borough of Saint Kilda, or within seven (7) miles of the General Post Office, Melbourne, in which case the fee shall be Three pounds (£3) per annum, payable quarterly in advance.—(71.D.25084.)

## BALLARAT MINING BOARD.

## BYE-LAW NO. X.

At a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said district, on the sixth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one: It is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Repealing clause.*—That the clauses numbered 1 to 14, 23, 24, 25, 27, and 56, and schedules i. and x. of the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the seventeenth day of August 1866, numbered iii.; the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the second day of November 1866, numbered iv.; the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the nineteenth day of May 1868, numbered v.; the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-third day of October 1868, numbered vi.; the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the eighteenth day of June 1869, numbered vii.; the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-ninth day of October 1869, numbered viii.; and the Bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, published in the *Government Gazette* on the second day of December 1870, numbered ix., shall be and the same are hereby repealed, always saving and excepting the rights of persons thereunder existing prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. *Interpretation clause.*—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, the provisions, clauses, and schedules hereinafter contained shall be deemed and taken as forming part of the bye-law aforesaid, numbered iii., and shall be read and construed in connection therewith, and in the construction of this bye-law and the bye-law aforesaid numbered iii. The words "single claim" shall mean and be interpreted to mean a claim for one person; the words "united claim" shall mean and be interpreted to mean a claim for two or more persons; the words "a sufficient miner's right" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the current or unexpired miner's right of the applicant or applicants for, or the holder or holders of any mining tenement, and by virtue of which such tenement has been applied for, or is for the time being held; the words "sufficient miners' rights" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the current or unexpired miners' rights of the applicants for, or the holder or holders of any mining tenement, and by virtue of which such tenement has been applied for, or is for the time being held; the words "in the form in the schedule hereto" shall mean and be interpreted to mean in the form or to the like effect as the schedule referred to, and no misdescription or defect in the heading of any such schedule shall be deemed to prejudicially affect or invalidate, or render informal any schedule form used or issued by any mining registrar; the words "a registered claim," or "a registered alluvial claim," or "a registered quartz claim," shall mean and be interpreted to mean an alluvial claim, or a quartz claim, as the case may be, which is to be, or which shall be registered. Except in the case of any act done by an agent in the office of a mining registrar under the authority of a company's deed of partnership or association, or under a general power-of-attorney duly registered in the office of the Registrar-General, the authority in writing under which any agent is authorized to do any act in the office of a mining registrar for any other person or persons, shall be lodged with and be retained by the mining registrar.

3. *Definition of claims.*—A claim shall be such a parcel of land as may, in accordance with the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be taken possession of by or for any holder of a miner's right, or by or for any number of persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, acting in conjunction, or any number of such parcels as shall be lawfully amalgamated, or any divided portion or subdivision of a claim which shall have been transferred from the claimholders to other persons; and for the purposes of fixing and defining the dimensions and boundaries thereof, and the position with respect to any reef or lead, claims shall be divided into two classes, namely, alluvial claims and quartz claims, and shall be subdivided into registered claims and unregistered claims.

4. *Mode of determining extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The extent of a registered alluvial claim shall depend upon and be determined by the depth of the lead below the surface of such claim and the number of persons by or for whom the claim is taken possession of and held, and for the purpose of determining the dimensions of a claim, the depth of the lead shall be ascertained or computed from the most reliable data obtainable; provided always that the extent of a claim shall not, after the boundaries thereof have been adjusted and registered, be varied by reason of the depth of the lead being subsequently found to be greater or less than was computed at the time of fixing the extent and boundaries of such claim.

5. *Extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The size of a registered alluvial claim shall be in accordance with the schedule hereto numbered 2, having regard to the depth of the lead within such claim and the number of persons holders of miners' rights by or for whom such claim shall have been taken possession of.

6. *Extent of registered quartz claims.*—The width of a registered quartz claim shall not exceed seven hundred and fifty (750) feet by such length along the course or supposed course of a quartz reef or lode as shall be equal to, or shall not exceed, one hundred (100) feet per man: that is to say, a quartz claim for one person, being the holder of a miner's right, shall not exceed 100 feet in length by 750 in width; a quartz claim for two persons, being each the holder of a miner's right, shall not exceed 200 feet in length by 750 feet in width,

and so on in the proportion of 100 feet or less in length along the course or supposed course of any quartz reef or lode for each and every of the persons who shall conjointly take possession thereof, by a width of 750 feet or less, shall be a quartz claim.

7. *Mode of taking possession of claims.*—Any person, being the holder of a miner's right, or any number of persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, and acting in conjunction, may take possession of a claim by fixing in the ground firmly at each corner, or at a point as nearly as practicable to each corner of the claim, a post projecting above the surface not less than three feet, and in all cases where any portion of the areas included within such posts shall, previous to the fixing thereof, have been exempted or excepted from occupation for mining purposes within the meaning of *The Mining Statute 1865*; or in case any such area shall be intersected by any land so exempted or excepted, the fixing of the posts as aforesaid shall, as far as respects the ground within (or intended to be included within) such area which shall not have been so exempted or excepted as aforesaid, be deemed as valid and sufficient, for all purposes of possession under this bye-law, as if the land so exempted or excepted had not been included within such area; and provided the person or persons taking possession of a claim as aforesaid shall, within forty-eight hours (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after taking possession, make application therefor, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 3, to the mining registrar, and produce to the registrar a miner's right in the name of the applicant, or in the names of each of the applicants, and thereafter proceed in the manner prescribed by the mining board bye-laws in force in this district to obtain survey and registration of such claim. Such possession as aforesaid shall be deemed a good, sufficient, and valid title to such claim, within the meaning of *The Mining Statute 1865*, except as against any person or persons previously and at the time in occupation of the whole or any portion of the land comprised in the claim so taken possession of, until such claim shall have been surveyed and registered, or until the mining registrar shall have refused, in accordance with any mining board bye-law in force in this district, to make registration thereof.

8. *Plurality of claims.*—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any bye-law of any mining board in force in this district, any one person, being the holder of a miner's right shall by himself alone, or in conjunction with other persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, subject to the provisions contained in any such bye-law as aforesaid relating to the mode of taking possession of claims and the mode of proceeding to obtain registration of such claims, be entitled to take possession of any number of claims not exceeding fifty (50).

9. *Time for fixing boundaries of registered claims.*—It shall not be necessary, at the time of taking possession of a registered claim, to mark or define the boundaries thereof accurately and completely, but at the time of making survey the boundaries shall be adjusted so as to include the land taken possession of, or intended to be taken possession of, and which shall have been applied for; and the boundaries of every claim shall, before registration thereof, be completely and accurately defined and delineated upon a plan.

10. *Time when work shall be commenced.*—Within fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted) from and after the date upon which the registration of any claim shall have been completed, the owners of such claim shall *bona fide* proceed to work, and shall, unless such claim be held under protection registration, as provided in the clause hereto numbered 16, continue to work upon such claim by themselves or their agents, tributors, or servants, according to the usual practice of efficient mining, and for the purposes of the bye-laws of the board aforesaid; efficient mining shall be the employment of such appliances and such a number of men as shall, taking into account all the circumstances of the mine, be necessary at the various stages of the work to explore and develop the mine with reasonable expedition: Provided always that working a claim or claims on a tribute system or percentage shall be deemed efficient mining under the bye-laws aforesaid: Provided also that in every and any case the minimum number of men employed shall be one man for and in respect of every eight or less single claims; and provided that in case of more than seventy-five single claims being united and held as one claim, a separate shaft or such other works as would be necessary to thoroughly develop the mine, shall be constructed within and in respect of every seventy-five or fractional part of seventy-five single claims, comprised in such united claim.

11. *Creation of shares.*—The person or persons who shall have taken possession of, and shall have applied for any claim shall, when registration is made of such claim, be registered as the holders thereof, and such person or persons may at any time thereafter create any number of shares or interests in such claim, and may appropriate such shares or any portion thereof, and for the purpose of registering the shares so created the registered holder or holders of any claim may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 4, notify the mining registrar of the creation and appropriation of shares therein, and the persons to whom the shares so created have been appropriated, may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 5, require the mining registrar to make registration of such shares in accordance with the terms of the notice of the creation and appropriation thereof.

12. *Transfers of claims or shares created in claims.*—The registered holder or holders of any claim or other mining tenement, or the registered holder of any lien upon any claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 6, and the holders of any share created in any claim or other mining tenement or any interest therein may, in the form in the schedule numbered 11 to the bye-law of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat numbered iii., assign or transfer such claim or other mining tenement,

share, interest or lien, or any portion thereof, or interest therein to any other person or persons being the holder of a miner's right or holders of miners' rights: Provided that every such transfer shall be signed by the parties thereto, in the presence of some person or persons who shall attest the signatures to such transfer, and upon the completion of such transfer and delivery to the registrar of the certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket, and miner's right or miners' rights under which such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest or lien shall have been held, the registrar shall record upon the register relating to the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest or lien so transferred the date on which such transfer shall have been made, and the name of the transferee, together with such other particulars relating to such transfer as to such registrar shall appear necessary, and shall issue to the transferee a duplicate of the transfer. The registrar shall retain and file the certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket delivered to him as aforesaid, and in the event of the transferor having transferred only an undivided interest in the share held by him under such certificate, transfer, or lien-ticket, the registrar shall issue to the transferor a certificate in the form in the schedule numbered 12 to the bye-law of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat numbered 111., describing accurately the interest retained by the said transferor: Provided always that if a sufficient number of miners' rights in force or a sufficient consolidated miner's right in force shall be held by or on behalf of the holders in respect of any claim or other mining tenement, the transferor or transferee of any lien upon or any share or interest created in such claim or other mining tenement shall not for the purposes of transfer be required to produce any miners' rights; and further provided that the miners' rights or consolidated miner's right under which the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest or lien had been held may, with the consent of all the parties interested, be transferred with such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest or lien to the transferee, and if required so to do, the registrar shall endorse such transfer upon such miner's right or consolidated miner's right.

13. *Transfer of subdivision of claims.*—In the event of a claim or other mining tenement being subdivided, and a divided portion or subdivision being transferred from the registered holders of such claim or other tenement to another or other persons, plans shall be produced to the registrar, showing respectively the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or mining tenement to be transferred, and the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement to be retained, and the plan of such first-mentioned portion or subdivision, shall be referred to in the tickets upon which such transfers are made; and when the transfers shall have been completed, the registrar shall make registration (under the date of the original registration) of the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or other mining tenement retained by the persons who were at the date of the subdivision the registered holders of the entire claim or other mining tenement, and shall make a separate registration of the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement which shall have been transferred, and upon the face of the register of the entire claim or other mining tenement, the registrar shall make a minute of such subdivision and transfer.

14. *Number of shares may be transferred on one ticket.*—Any person holding two or more undivided shares in any one claim or other mining tenement may transfer the whole of such shares upon one transfer-ticket.

15. *Lien.*—The holder or holders of any registered claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto, numbered 7, and the holder of any share or interest created in any claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto, numbered 8, grant a lien upon the same to any other person or persons as security for the due payment of any debt or liability, and upon production to the registrar of the transfer-ticket or certificate under which the intending lienor holds the claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest intended to be made the subject of a lien, and of the miner's right of the intending lienor, and upon the execution of a lien-ticket by the lienor and lienor in the form aforesaid, duly attested, the registrar shall register a lien upon the aforesaid claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, and after having made such registration, the registrar shall issue to the lienor a duplicate of the lien-ticket as aforesaid, and shall retain and file the transfer-ticket or certificate of the lienor until such lien shall have been satisfied and the subject thereof released; and every such lien granted and duly registered as aforesaid shall be a specific charge upon the claim or other mining tenement or interest which shall have been so made the subject of such lien until the debt or liability shall have been discharged in full, and registered liens shall take precedence according to the dates of their respective registration by the registrar; and every transfer of any claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest held under lien shall be made subject to every registered lien thereon. Whenever the sum secured under any lien shall have been paid, and all lawful demands in respect thereof satisfied, the lienor shall fill up and sign, in the presence of a witness who shall attest his signature thereto, the form of release at the back of the lien-ticket, and upon receipt by the registrar of the lien-ticket, with the form of release duly filled up and signed, he shall record such release in the register and return to the lienor the transfer-ticket or certificate retained and filed as aforesaid.

16. *Claims may be held in reserve.*—When by reason of any influx of water, or scarcity of water, or by reason of any other sufficient cause the works upon a claim cannot be prosecuted, or when the holder or holders of a claim require to suspend mining operations upon such claim for the purpose of procuring and erecting machinery thereon, or for the purpose of repairing the machinery upon such claim, the holder or holders of such claim or some person duly authorized on his or their behalf

shall make a statutory declaration in the form in the schedule numbered 8 of the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned, numbered 111., setting forth fully the reason or reasons for desiring to suspend or the cause of having suspended the works upon such claim, and stating the period (not exceeding three months) during which it will be requisite to suspend mining operations upon such claim, and shall deliver such declaration to the mining registrar, and the said registrar shall upon the receipt of such declaration register such claim to be held in reserve and unworked for any period named in the declaration not exceeding three months, and shall deliver to the person or holder or holders aforesaid a notice in the form in the schedule numbered 9 of the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned numbered 111., stating that the owners of such claim are protected from forfeiture of their title to such claim for a certain period to be named therein, and it shall be the duty of such person or holder or holders to cause such notice to be posted on some conspicuous part of the claim to which it relates during the term of protection, and at the expiration of such term such protection may be renewed for a further term of three months, the proceedings to be had in the case of renewal being in every respect similar to the proceedings to be had as aforesaid in obtaining protection in the first instance; and, provided the causes or reasons assigned in such declaration be good and sufficient, any claim or claims which shall have been registered as aforesaid shall during the time of such protection be exempt from fine or forfeiture for non-performance of work.

17. *Forfeiture for not proceeding to work.*—Any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area) upon or in connection with which work shall not *bona fide* be commenced within fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after the completion of the registration thereof shall be forfeitable; and unless at least forty-eight hours before the commencement of any proceedings taken in a competent court to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture, the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work and continue to work thereon, such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid may, by a competent court, be declared forfeited; provided always that such court may for the first offence inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

18. *Forfeiture for suspension of work.*—Any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area) upon which work having been commenced shall (except as provided in the clause hereof numbered 16) be suspended for a space of fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted), or any claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid which shall be held in reserve and unworked under protection registration (as provided in the clause hereof numbered 16), if it shall appear to a court of competent jurisdiction that the reasons assigned in the declaration under which such protection registration was obtained were insufficient, or that the declaration under which such protection registration was obtained was untrue, shall in any or either of the cases aforesaid be forfeitable; and unless at least forty-eight hours before the commencement of any proceedings taken in a competent court to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture, the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work and continue to work thereon, such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid may, by a competent court, be declared forfeited; provided always that such court may for the first offence inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

19. *Exemption from forfeiture.*—In the event of any forfeiture of any claim or other mining tenement having accrued by reason of the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement not having commenced to work thereon, or in connection therewith, in accordance with the provisions of the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned, numbered 111., or of this bye-law, or by reason of the owner or owners, as aforesaid, having suspended work contrary to the provisions aforesaid, if (at least forty-eight hours before any proceedings shall have been taken in a competent court to obtain an adjudication of such forfeiture) the owner or owners as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work, and continue work upon such claim, such last-mentioned works shall be and constitute an exemption from such forfeiture.

20. *Possession of a forfeited mining tenement or share therein.*—When under the clause numbered 26 of the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned, numbered 111., or under the clauses hereof numbered 17 and 18, any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area), or any share therein, shall be forfeitable, any person or persons being the holder or holders of sufficient miners' rights may take proceedings to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture, and to obtain possession of such forfeited claim or other mining tenement or share therein; and the person or persons who shall first take proceedings in that behalf shall (subject to any right of priority in any other person or persons in certain cases in the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned, numbered 111., provided) be first entitled to enforce such forfeiture or penalty.

21. *Taking possession and obtaining registration under warden's order.*—When any person or persons shall have taken proceedings in any competent court to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture or abandonment in respect of any mining tenement, and such court shall have adjudged such tenement forfeited or abandoned, and shall have decreed or ordered that the person or persons taking such proceedings as aforesaid are entitled to take possession of such tenement, or of any portion of it, the person or persons aforesaid shall, within seven days from and after the date of such decree or order, proceed, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf of the bye-laws of the mining board of the mining district of Ballarat, to take possession, and obtain registration of the tenement or portion or tenement of which, under the decree or order aforesaid, he or they are entitled to take possession.

22. *Registration may be cancelled on production of warden's order.*—At the expiration of fourteen days from and after the date on which any competent court shall have adjudged the title to any mining tenement forfeited or abandoned (unless an appeal, or notice of intention to appeal, shall have been lodged), on receipt by the mining registrar of a copy of the decree or order of such court, he shall note such decree or order on the face of the register of such tenement, and such note shall have the effect of cancelling the registration of title to such tenement.

23. *Claims or portions of claims may be abandoned.*—The holder or all the holders of any claim may at any time, provided such claim be not the subject of a lien duly registered in the books of the mining registrar, abandon such claim or any portion of such claim by lodging with the mining registrar a notice signed by all the registered holders of the claim, stating that they have abandoned such claim or such portion of the claim as shall be described and delineated upon a plan attached to such notice; and thenceforth the claim or the land comprised in the portion of the claim delineated upon such plan shall be deemed absolutely abandoned, and may at any time thereafter be taken possession of by the holder of a miner's right, or by the holders of miners' rights in the same manner as land which had not been previously held and occupied for mining purposes; and the abandonment of a portion of a claim shall not in any way prejudicially affect the title to the remaining portion of such claim.

24. *Claims may be held under consolidated miner's right.*—The holder or holders of any registered claim or claims who desire to hold such claim or claims under a consolidated miner's right may, on production to the mining registrar of a consolidated miner's right sufficient to hold such claim or claims, require the mining registrar to register such consolidated miner's right in respect of such claim or claims in lieu of the separate miners' rights under which such claim or claims had been held; and the mining registrar shall register such consolidated miner's right accordingly, and shall mark upon the face of such consolidated miner's right the number or name of such claim or of each such claim and the date of such registration: Provided always that for every single claim one miner's right, or for any number of single claims, a consolidated miner's right equal to one miner's right for each single claim shall be held and be in force, and for every united claim so many miners' rights or a consolidated miner's right equal to so many miners' rights as there are single claims in such united claim shall be held and be in force; and should more than one single claim be held under one miners' right, or a greater number of single claims than is hereinbefore provided be held under a consolidated miner's right, the claim so held in excess of the miners' rights or consolidated miner's right shall be forfeitable.

25. *Claims previously held may be registered.*—Any person or persons who shall previous to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation be in possession of a mining tenement may require the mining registrar to register such tenement under the provisions of the bye-law of this board numbered III. and of this bye-law. The mode of effecting such re-registration shall be in every respect the same as prescribed in the bye-law of this board numbered III., clauses 16 and 67, except that on production by the applicant or applicants to the registrar of a plan, description, and report made by the mining surveyor to the effect that the mining tenement shown on the plan has been and is still held by the applicant or applicants, the registrar shall make registration of such tenement without posting the notice as provided in the bye-law numbered III., clauses 16 and 67, of his intention to register: Provided always, that previous to making such registration the registrar shall require the applicant or applicants to produce such a consolidated miner's right in force, or such a number of miners' rights in force, as shall, under the provisions of the bye-law numbered III., be sufficient to entitle the applicant or applicants to hold such tenement.

26. *Claimholders entitled to gold.*—The person or persons being lawfully the registered holder or holders of any claim, shall during the continuance in force of any miner's right in the name of such person, or of each such person connected in the register with such claim, and subject to the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be deemed in law to be possessed (except as against Her Majesty only) of the parcel or parcels of land comprised in such claim; and the property therein, and every share or interest which may be created therein, shall be deemed a chattel interest, and during such continuance, and subject as aforesaid, all gold then being in and upon any such parcel or parcels of land shall (except as against Her Majesty) be the absolute property of the person or persons for the time being in lawful occupation of such parcel or parcels of land.

27. *Size of unregistered claims.*—The size of an unregistered claim shall depend solely upon the number of persons by or for whom possession thereof is taken.

28. *Size of unregistered alluvial claims.*—The maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of, and be held by one person as an unregistered alluvial claim, shall be 5000 superficial feet; the maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of, and be held as an unregistered claim by two persons, shall be 10,000 superficial feet; and so on in like proportion (that is to say in the proportion of 5000 superficial feet for each person) for any number of persons who shall take possession of and hold conjointly.

29. *Size of unregistered quartz claims.*—The size of an unregistered quartz claim for one person shall be any length not exceeding twenty-five feet by a width of two hundred feet, for two persons any length not exceeding fifty feet by a width of two hundred feet, and so on in like proportion for any greater number of persons.

30. *Boundaries of unregistered claim, when to be defined.*—The boundaries of an unregistered claim shall be completely and accurately defined at the time of taking possession thereof, and for the purpose of taking possession a post not less than

three inches in diameter and not less than three feet in height shall be fixed and a V trench not less than six inches deep and six feet long shall be cut at each corner or at each angle of the claim, and such posts and trenches shall be maintained by the holders of the claim during their occupancy. The person or persons who shall have so taken possession of an unregistered claim shall during the continuance in force of his miner's right or their respective miners' rights, subject to the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be entitled (except as against Her Majesty, and except as against any person or persons who shall have previously taken and be in possession of the ground comprised in such claim) to all gold in and upon such claim.

31. *Amalgamation of unregistered claims.*—Adjacent unregistered claims may, by consent of their respective owners, be amalgamated.

32. *Application for registration of residence or business area, and objections thereto.*—Upon receipt by the mining registrar of a notice of possession of and application for a residence or business area, in the form prescribed in the bye-law of this board, numbered III., schedule 14, he shall deliver to the applicant a duplicate of such notice, and the applicant shall post such duplicate notice upon the site applied for, and shall keep such notice posted upon the site for the space of seven days; and if within the said seven days the registrar shall receive no notice of objection, he shall, on being requested so to do, register the applicant as the holder of the site applied for; but if any person shall before the expiration of the said seven days deliver to the registrar a notice in the form of the schedule hereto, numbered I., objecting to the registration of the applicant, and stating the grounds of his objection, the registrar shall refrain from making registration of such applicant as the holder of the site applied for, until he shall be directed thereto by a judge of the court of mines, or by a warden, or until he shall be satisfied that the objector has failed to take proceedings as hereinafter provided, or has failed to obtain an order preventing registration of the applicant. Within seven days of the delivery of the notice of objection, the objector shall commence proceedings in the court of mines, or warden's court, to prevent the registration of the applicant for the site applied for; but should he fail to commence proceedings as aforesaid, within the said seven days, or fail to obtain an order preventing registration of the applicant, the registrar, on production of a certificate from the clerk of the court of mines or the clerk of the warden's court, to the effect that the objector has failed as aforesaid, shall, if required so to do, register the applicant as the holder of the site applied for.

33. *Quantity of water to be left in rivers or creeks.*—The holders of water-rights shall not be entitled to take water from any river or main creek or tributary creek, when by so doing they will reduce the quantity of water in a river bed or main creek to less than one sluice-head, or in a tributary creek to less than half of a sluice-head.

# BYE-LAWS OF THE BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

INCORPORATED UNDER 27 VICT. No. 220.

**A**DOPED and confirmed at a Special Meeting of Contributors held at Alfred Hall, on Thursday 22nd February 1872, at 8 p.m., duly convened for that purpose by advertisement, as required by Statute.

1. *Objects of the institution.*—The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties, and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

2. *Constitution.*—The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and contributors.

## QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

3. *Qualifications.—Privileges.*—The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of governors and contributors:—

with the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings of governors and subscribers, and with power to recommend patients, according to the undermentioned scale:—

Life governor—2 in-patients or 6 out-patients always on the books.

Life subscriber—1 in-patient or 3 out-patients always on the books.

Governor for one year—10 in-patients and 20 out-patients annually.

Governor—4 in-patients and 8 out-patients annually.

Contributor—2 in-patients and 4 out-patients annually.

\*N.B.—Nominations of governors and contributors must be made prior to 31st December of each year, and be subject to the approval of the committee of management. Firms subscribing may nominate one of their members as a governor or contributor, who shall be entitled to vote and hold office.

4. *Subscriptions payable in advance.*—Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance, for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

5. *Voting.*—Life, honorary, and annual governors, life and annual subscribers, all honorary officers and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of governors and contributors to the hospital.

6. *Limitation of Voting.*—No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital; nor any new governor or contributor unless his subscription shall have been paid one month previously.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

7. At all meetings of contributors, the president or one of the vice-presidents, or the treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

8. The annual meeting of the contributors to the hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year for the following purposes:—

1. The election of the president, vice-presidents, treasurer, medical and surgical officer, and auditor for the ensuing year.

2. The election of members of the committee of management.

3. The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of contributors, twelve shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

10. It shall be competent for the committee of management, or any twenty or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned: every such meeting shall be called by the secretary.

11. All elections where contested shall be by ballot.

## COMMON SEAL.

12. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in the iron chest at the hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president, and the other by the secretary.

On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.—27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 11.

15. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said Act, are required to go out of office.—27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 12.

The committee of management may suspend any honorary medical or surgical officer, or one or more of its own members, on any well-founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by the majority of the members present at the special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, to be confirmed at a special meeting of governors and contributors, to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee.

19. *Powers.*—The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

20. *Days of meeting.*—They shall meet on the second Wednesday in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint—five to form a quorum. The chairman of committee shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting, but no deliberative vote.

21. The general committee may depute two or more of their number, who, together with the resident surgeon, shall have full power to consider any applications, and discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for refusing any application, or ordering any discharge.

22. *Pecuniary interest.*—No member of the committee of management, nor officer of the hospital, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the committee of management be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

23. *Annual report and balance-sheet.*—The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and contributors, in January of each year, such balance-sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

24. *Ex-officio members.*—The president and vice-presidents shall be members *ex officio* of all committees, and the treasurer and honorary medical and surgical officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the committee of management.

## HOUSE COMMITTEE.

25. *Appointment.—Duties.*—The committee of management shall choose among themselves a house committee of six, four to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the house, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the collector's, dispenser's, and house steward's books, and such other matters (except the final acceptance of tenders) as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

26. *Members retiring in rotation.*—They shall retire in rotation, two at each monthly meeting of the general committee, and if not re-elected their places shall be filled by the appointment of other members of committee, the arrangements for rotation to be left to the house committee themselves.

27. *Meetings.—Honorary staff members pro tem.*—They shall meet once in each fortnight, or oftener, on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and the honorary medical and surgical officers for the week shall be members *ex officio* of the house committee; and if they are not able to attend the reception of out-patients they shall assign a reason for their absence.



28. *Checking collector.*—They shall appoint two or more of their number to be a finance committee, who shall, at least once in each month, compare the collector's books and receipt butts with the advertised lists of subscriptions and donations for the preceding four weeks, and shall see that the addition of the items is correct in each, entered in ink, and that the totals correspond with each other, as well as with the amounts acknowledged by the treasurer in the collector's acquittance book.

29. *Checking house-steward and dispenser.*—They shall also, once at least in each month, audit the house accounts, compare the balances in the secretary's ledger with the bank pass-book, and examine the books relating to provisions, wines and spirits, &c., kept by the house-steward and dispenser respectively.

30. *Watching expenditure.*—They shall watch the entire expenditure of the institution, and shall carefully scrutinize the monthly analysis of such expenditure, with a due regard to the number of patients in the house, reporting to the committee of management any matter of importance.

31. *Supervising receipt and distribution of stores, &c.*—*Verifying stock on hand.*—They shall depute two or more of their number to be present (without notice), once in each fortnight, at the receipt and distribution of stores, wines, and spirits, and twice in each year shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores, wines, and spirits with the house-steward's and dispenser's books.

32. *Verifying books and vouchers.*—In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by them, the signature of some member of the house committee shall be appended, with the date of examination, in token of the correctness of such books or vouchers to that date.

#### AUDITORS.

33. *Quarterly audit.*—The accounts of the charity shall be verified quarterly, in the months of January, April, July, and October, by two auditors appointed for the purpose by the governors and contributors.

34. *Yearly audit for governors.*—The January audit shall be the yearly audit, at which the accuracy of the whole accounts for the preceding year, and of the balance-sheet prepared, with list of subscriptions and donations, and statement of securities for the annual meeting, shall be certified for the satisfaction of the governors and contributors.

35. *Quarterly audit for committee.*—At the other quarterly audits, the auditors shall report, for the information of the committee of management, as to the accord of the collector's books and receipt-butts with the weekly advertised lists of subscriptions, the bank pass-book, and collector's acquittance book for the preceding three months; also as to all expenditure being for legitimate objects, and in accordance with the authority of the committee.

36. *Erasures and alterations.*—They shall specially call attention to erasures or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the subscribers or to the committee, on any matters connected with the book-keeping of the institution, or otherwise within their province.

37. *Appointment.*—They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of governors and contributors; one to retire by rotation at each annual meeting, but to be eligible for re-election.

38. *Suspension.*—It shall be competent for the committee of management to suspend any auditor for incapacity, misbehaviour, or neglect of duty, on the understanding that, within one week of the date of such suspension, they will proceed to convene a special meeting of contributors for the consideration of the case, and for the election (if necessary) of a successor to such auditor.

39. *Remuneration.*—The remuneration of the auditors shall be fixed at the annual meeting.

#### HONORARY PROFESSIONAL STAFF.

40. *Appointment.*—They shall consist of three legally qualified medical, and three legally qualified surgical, officers, who shall be elected and retire in the same way as members of committee.

41. *Rotation of duty.*—One of the honorary medical, and one of the honorary surgical, officers shall attend the hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by themselves.

42. *Access to institution.*—The honorary medical and surgical officers shall have access to the institution at all times.

43. *Capital operations—Consultations.*—The honorary surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the surgical staff, except in cases of emergency; and the honorary medical and surgical officers respectively shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or of protracted continuance in the house.

44. *Neglect of duty.*—Any honorary medical or surgical officer neglecting his duty for one month, without reasonable cause, shall, after receiving notice in writing, cease to hold office, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

45. *Daily report.*—The honorary medical officers shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

#### TREASURER.

46. *Receipt of monies.*—All monies received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and be deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

47. *Acquittance to collector.*—On receiving any monies from the collector, he shall sign the collector's acquittance book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

48. *Payment.*—All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president (or a vice-president), the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

49. *Authority for payments.*—Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

50. *Progress balance sheet.*—He shall cause to be prepared by the secretary, for submission to the committee, at the first meeting in each month, a progress balance sheet, in prescribed form, showing the actual position of the hospital funds on the previous Monday, with an estimate of the surplus or deficiency at the end of the financial year; such balance sheet to be signed by him, and to be laid on the table by the secretary, with the bank certificate or pass-book made up to the same date.

#### PATIENTS.

51. *Recommendation.*—Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee, and be made by tickets only (to be issued by the collector, who shall keep a proper record of the same); provided that, whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause, the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. Governors and contributors shall also have the privilege, at any time, on application to the collector, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*; one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to two out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; and shall not be valid beyond twelve months from the date of issue.

52. *Proper form.*—All recommendations must be properly filled up by the issuer, and signed by the applicant, in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution.

53. Members of committee and honorary professional staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the committee.

54. *Admission of in-patients.*—Accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the honorary medical or surgical officers, or the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a governor or subscriber, shall be restricted to between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., Sundays excepted.

55. In all cases where an application for admission to the hospital is refused by the resident surgeon, he shall endorse his reasons for such refusal on the back of the order presented, and every such case, together with the endorsement, shall be reported to the first meeting of the house committee.

56. *Persons not admissible.*—No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of one of the medical or surgical officers and resident surgeon, or of the committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

57. *Out-patients.*—Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either), but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients, on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a governor or subscriber; such recommendation to be in force for two months only from the date of issue.

58. *Paying patients.*—Any person wishing to be received into the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted, with the sanction of the house committee; he shall be charged 10s. per day (or a smaller sum if deemed expedient by the committee), and, in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the honorary staff, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas; paying patients shall pay one week in advance.

59. *Discharge of patients.*—No patient shall be discharged by the resident surgeon without a reference to the honorary medical officer in charge of the case.

60. *Voluntary departure.*—Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

61. *Impostors.*—In the event of any person, in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission, or, if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion on which he shall consult the resident surgeon; and the committee may order the removal of any such person from the hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.
