PORTLAND LINE OF RAILWAY.

IN pursuance of the 102nd section of *The Land Act 1869*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has revoked an Order temporarily withholding for Twelve months, from the 1st December 1871, from sale, leasing, or licensing, the Crown-lands within the red lines on the plan annexed to the documents distinguished as No. 72E2008, comprising about 75,000 acres, pending application to the Legislature by the promoters of the Portland line of railway, with a view to endowment towards construction of the proposed railway. In lieu of the lands hereinbefore referred to, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the Crown lands in the county of Lowan, indicated by blue tint on the plan* above mentioned, comprising in the whole 163,392 acres, more or less, to be withheld as aforesaid for the object stated.

REGULATIONS FOR LUNACY WARDS IN PUBLIC HOSPITALS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the 26th day of February 1872.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him in and by the eighteenth section of *The Lunacy Statute*, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

1. *Registration of patients to be kept, and report to be made every three months.*—For the purpose of registration of lunatic patients the committee, or other body, or the persons in whose hands is vested the management of any public hospital to which wards for the reception of lunatic patients are attached, shall at the expiration of every three months make a report, in writing, to the Chief Secretary, stating the number of lunatic patients received into or detained in any such hospital during the period of three months next preceeding the making of such report, the duration of the treatment in each several case, and the result of such treatment.

2. *Treatment of patients to be under the direction of Medical Staff.*—The treatment of all lunatic patients, received into or detained in any public hospital to which wards for the temporary reception of lunatic patients are attached, shall be under the control and subject to the direction of the medical staff of such hospital.

3. *Dietary of patients.*—The dietary of each lunatic patient received into or detained in any such public hospital shall be according to the scale mentioned in the schedule to these regulations, subject, nevertheless, to such alterations and modifications as the medical staff of such hospital may from time to time consider necessary for the requirements of each particular case.

4. *Inspection of patients to be made by managing body of hospital.*—The committee, or other body, or the persons in whose hands is vested the management of any public hospital to which wards for the temporary reception of lunatic patients are attached, shall, on each occasion of their meeting for the transaction of business in connection with such hospital, make an inspection of each lunatic patient received into or detained in such hospital.

5. *Daily inspection by member of medical staff.*—One member at least of the medical staff of every such hospital shall on each and every day make an inspection of each lunatic patient received into or detained in any such hospital, and record such inspection in a book to be kept for that purpose.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS, VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.
INDORSEMENTS UPON ARTICLES.

With reference to Circular 439.

THE Board of Trade having had their attention drawn to a practice adopted in shipping offices abroad of employing a stamped impress for recording upon ships agreements the delivery and return of the documents referred to in section 279 of *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, have consulted their legal adviser upon the sufficiency of such a stamp, and are advised that it is not in accordance with the requirements of the Act. The section in question requires a certificate under the hand of the Officer indorsed on the agreement stating when such documents were respectively delivered and returned.

These documents are the agreement with the crew, and the indentures and assignments of apprenticeships, and are not sufficiently described in the certificate above referred to by the general term "papers" or "ship's papers." They should be described specifically as agreements, indentures, or assignments, as the case may be.

FIXED RED LIGHT AT WOLLONGONG.

On the 1st of March next, the temporary light at Wollongong will be substituted by a Fixed Red Light, situated on the extremity of the Breakwater at an elevation of 56 feet above high-water mark.

This light will be visible from a ship's deck, at a distance of ten miles when the entrance to the port is opened between the compass bearings of S.S.W. and W. by N. & N., but will be eclipsed over the Bellambi Reef and also over the lowland between Five Islands Point and Wollongong Head.

The entrance can therefore be approached if the light is in sight. When the port is neared and a vessel is rounding the Breakwater it will be lost sight of, and afterwards come into view as a guide for proceeding into the Basin.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined, shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

HAMILTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7 of section 2, parish of Greenhills, being a point on the eastern side of the road from Portland to Hamilton; thence east to Lake Condah Swamp; thence southerly by the eastern margin of that swamp to the creek which forms part of the eastern boundary of the Lake Condah pre-emptive section; thence by that creek to Lake Condah; thence by the western shore of that lake southerly to Darlot's Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the Fitzroy River; thence by that river upwards to the aforesaid road from Portland to Hamilton; and thence by that road north-easterly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. [Provided that the run known as Condah Hills Estate, now in the occupation of Mr. Andrew Hamilton, shall form no part of this Quarantine District.]

The boundaries above described include the Whittlebury and Ettrick runs and parts of the Lake Condah and Sinclair's East runs.

COLBINABBIN RUN.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the Burrumbout run; thence by the Burnewang East run bearing westerly one mile and three quarters, more or less; thence again by that run and by the Campaspe River run bearing southerly to the Mount Pleasant run; thence by that run bearing easterly and southerly to the Colbinabbin North run; thence by that run bearing easterly, northerly, easterly, and northerly to the Gobareep run; thence by that run bearing northerly to the Wannalla West run; thence by that run bearing north-westerly to Burrumbout run aforesaid; and thence by that run bearing southerly and westerly to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

STATE AID TO RELIGION ABOLITION ACT.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Howe Crescent Baptist Church, Emerald Hill, under the provisions of the *Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-sixth day of February 1872, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

DESCRIPTION OF LAND.

All that piece of land in the said colony containing one rood and thirty-one perches or thereabouts, situate in the county of Bourke, borough of Emerald Hill, being allotments eleven and twelve of section thirty-nine: Commencing at the east angle of allotment ten, being a point on the western side of Howe Crescent; bounded thence by that allotment bearing south thirty-eight degrees forty-five minutes and one half of a minute west two chains fifty links; thence by Martin street bearing south-easterly one chain forty-six links in an arc of a circle whose radius is five chains seventy-five links, and whose centre lies south-westerly of the said arc; thence by allotment thirteen bearing north fifty-three degrees twenty minutes and one half of a minute east two chains fifty links to Howe Crescent aforesaid, being north-westerly two chains ten links in an arc of a circle whose radius is eight chains twenty-five links, and whose centre lies south-westerly of that arc, and shown with the measurements, abutments thereof on the map drawn in the margin of these presents, and therein colored yellow.

To either lease, mortgage, or sell all or any portion of the said land, or to erect buildings thereon, provided always that all or any of such powers shall not be exercised without the written consent of the pastor for the time being of the said Howe Crescent Baptist Church, together with a resolution of the said church signed by the pastor thereof; subject to the exercise of the above powers, the pastor of the said church to be entitled to minister in church, and to have use and control of buildings. That all receipts for moneys by the trustees shall be a sufficient discharge to any purchasers, mortgagees, or lessees, who shall not be bound to see to the application of such moneys, neither shall they be entitled to evidence of consent as aforesaid, nor shall their title be affected by any want of consent as aforesaid in any way whatsoever.

PURPOSES TO WHICH PROCEEDS OF DISPOSITION ARE TO BE APPLIED.

The proceeds of any sale, or mortgage, or lease shall, in the first place, be applied to the liquidation of the existing debts on the church and manse, and thereafter, either for additions to or alterations of the present church and manse, or for the erection of either a new church or manse or both; or such proceeds shall be used for the general purposes of the church, as may from time to time be determined by the said church.

BYE-LAWS OF THE UPPER GOULBURN DISTRICT HOSPITAL, WOOD'S POINT.

READ and adopted at a Special Meeting of the Subscribers of the Upper Goulburn District Hospital, convened for the purpose, and held in the Board Room of the institution, on Thursday the seventeenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.

1. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to persons requiring it, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties, and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

2. The institution shall be governed by a committee of management consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, and nine members.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

3. Every benefactor of £10 or upwards shall be a life subscriber, and every contributor of £1 per annum shall be an annual subscriber, with the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings.

4. Every executor (first-named) under any will paying to the institution a bequest of £50 or upwards, and any person raising in any one year the sum of £20 or upwards, and every other person elected by the committee of management in consideration of special services rendered to the institution shall, be respectively honorary governors, with all the rights and privileges of life governors; the chairman of any public body voting the sum of £20 or upwards shall be an honorary governor, *ex officio*.

5. The medical officer of the institution shall be an *ex officio* member of the hospital committee, and shall have a seat and vote at any meeting of the committee, excepting as hereinafter provided.

6. The committee of management shall meet at such time and place as shall be decided on by the committee, such meetings to be at least monthly.

7. Officers and servants shall be appointed by the committee, who shall have full power to appoint, suspend, or dismiss the same, except in the case of the medical officer, and then the committee shall have power to suspend him and call a special meeting of subscribers to confirm or annul such suspension; such meeting to be within fourteen days from such suspension, and to be advertised in the *Argus* and in the local newspaper at least six days before such meeting.

8. No paid officer or member of committee shall attend or vote at any meeting at which any matter is discussed in which he is pecuniarily interested, or vote on any question in which he is personally interested.

9. The annual general meeting shall elect two auditors for the ensuing year.

TREASURER.

10. The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and shall lodge the same in such bank as the committee shall direct to the credit of the hospital.

11. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by cheques on the bank, which shall be signed by the president or vice-president, the treasurer, and by one of two members of committee appointed for that purpose. He shall keep accounts of all moneys received and paid, and report the same to each monthly meeting of the committee, and shall present a financial report to the annual general meeting.

SECRETARY.

12. The Secretary shall keep the minutes and records of the institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meetings, and bring all business before the same, and carry out the resolutions of the committee or general meetings.

13. He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the institution, and in all cases give receipts for such subscriptions, and pay over the same to the Treasurer, once in every fortnight, and render account of the amount by him received since the last payment.

SURGEON.

14. The Surgeon shall examine the nature of cases of all applicants for admission and decide on their fitness, either as indoor or outdoor patients, and he shall discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

15. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital, and of their treatment, but the committee of management shall at all times and in all cases have power to call in one or more medical men if they shall think fit.

16. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and make, or cause to be made, an inventory of the same, and keep, or cause to be kept, an account of the receipts and expenditure, or loss and breakage, of all such instruments, drugs, and chemicals.

17. He shall enter regularly, in a book to be kept for that purpose, the names of patients as they are admitted or discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment.

18. He shall visit each patient once at least every day and inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and if any cause of complaint exists immediately remove the same, or report it to the committee of management at its next sittings.

19. In the event of his requiring temporary leave of absence, the house committee, if satisfied of the necessity and that due arrangement has been made for the performance of his duties, may grant such leave and report the same to the committee of management at the next monthly meeting.

HOUSE STEWARD.

20. He shall live in the hospital and shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, and shall obey all orders given by the surgeon with regard to the treatment of patients.

21. He shall superintend and control all servants of the hospital, and in cases of neglect of duty or insubordination, report the same forthwith to the house committee, who shall have power to deal with the matter in their discretion. He shall also be responsible for the internal management of the institution.

22. He shall keep an account of all stores, linen, bedding, &c., and enter the same in a book to be kept for that purpose. He shall also satisfy himself that the articles supplied are of good quality, weigh and measure the same, and see that they are in accordance with the contract entered into.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

23. The committee of management shall appoint (as often as they shall think fit) a house committee of two or more, who shall supervise the internal management of the hospital, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts, and such other matters as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

24. Accidents and emergency cases shall be received at any time. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under four years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of the surgeon or house committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances, and the cause of the refusal of any patients so refused admittance shall be stated to the next meeting of the committee of management by the surgeon.

PATIENTS.

25. All patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the surgeon and house committee and house steward. They shall take only the medicines prescribed. They shall not receive anything from friends or visitors without the express leave of the surgeon or house steward. They shall not gamble or smoke in the hospital, nor spit on the floor, nor injure any part of the hospital, or use indecent or bad language.

26. Patients judged by the surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the hospital may at the discretion of the surgeon be so employed.

27. Patients misconducting themselves may be summarily discharged by the surgeon, who shall report the circumstance to the next meeting of the committee of management.

28. Any person being in a position to pay for medical aid may be admitted, with the sanction of the house committee, and he shall be charged Ten shillings per day, or such lesser sum as may be decided on by the house committee in each peculiar case; one week to be paid in advance. Any operation performed on such person shall be charged for, the amount to be decided by the house committee.

GENERAL MANAGEMENT.

29. Excepting articles required for immediate consumption no article shall be purchased for the use of the hospital or liability incurred until submitted to the house committee, who shall forthwith enter in the house committee report-book a list of all articles ordered and liabilities incurred by them.
