PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid. The Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of February in the present year, certain towns were proclaimed and the boundaries thereof were defined, and one of such towns was to be recognized by the name of Duffytown: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the name thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby alter the name of the town designated Duffytown in the said Proclamation, and do proclaim that the name by which such town shall be distinguished and recognized shall be as follows, that is to say,

THE TOWN OF GAVAN DUFFY.

CUTTING, ETC., OF CERTAIN TIMBER OR BARK WITHIN TWELVE MILES OF STAWELL' PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any timber which at the height of three feet from the ground is of less diameter than nine inches, on any Crown lands within a distance of twelve miles from the Town Hall site at Stawell, nor cut or remove bark from any standing timber on such Crown lands.

TIMBER RESERVE AT DANDENONG AND WORRI YALLOAK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue Licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor, and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the said section of the above-recited Act, the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:

DANDENONG AND WORRI YALLOAK STATE FOREST.—Twenty-six thousand five hundred acres, more or less, counties of Mornington and Evelyn: Commencing on the Fern-tree Gully Creek, in the parish of Scoresby, at the point where the Melbourne road abuts thereon; thence by a line bearing south-easterly fifteen chains, more or less, to a spur; thence by that spur bearing easterly fifty chains, more or less; thence by a spur bearing south-easterly thirty-four chains, more or less, to a dry-track; thence by a line bearing S. 74° E. fifty chains, more or less, to a dry-track on the range which divides the waters of the Ferny Creek from the waters of the Monbulk Creek; thence by that track bearing easterly, north-easterly, and south-easterly about one mile to a saddle on a spur of that range; thence by a line bearing east forty chains, more or less, to a dry-track on the range which divides the waters of the Monbulk Creek from the waters of the Muddy Creek; thence by that track bearing south-easterly forty chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing S. 84° E. one hundred and forty-four chains, more or less, to a hut on the range which divides the waters of Menzies' Creek from the waters of the Cardinia Creek; thence by that range bearing easterly, south-easterly, and easterly to the western boundary of the town of Emerald; thence by lines bearing respectively east fifty chains, and N. 9° 30' W. one hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to Menzies' Creek aforesaid; thence down that creek to its junction with the Worri Yalloak Creek; thence down that creek to a point distant in a direct line two hundred and seventeen chains, more or less, from the said junction; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 48° 30' W. sixty chains, S. 71° 30' W. forty-five chains, N. 58° 15' W. eighty chains, more or less, north sixteen chains, more or less, N. 45° E. twenty-four chains, more or less, N. 73° W. sixty-six chains, more or less, and S. 83° 30' W. seventy-five chains, to the Olinda or Running Creek; thence up that creek to a line running parallel with and four chains south-westerly from the south-western boundary of Isaac Jeeves' land in the parish of Mooroolbark; thence by that line bearing N. 47° 30' W. one hundred and twenty-nine chains sixty links to the south-eastern boundary of allotment 64 in that parish; thence by that allotment, by a line, and by allotment 37, bearing S. 40° W. one hundred and twenty-four chains two links to the south angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line bearing S. 16° E. one hundred and twenty-three chains, more or less, to the Dandenong Creek; thence by a line bearing S. 25° W. one hundred and sixty-five chains, more or less, to the summit of One-tree Hill; thence by a spur bearing south sixteen chains, more or less, S. 40° W. twenty-five chains more or less, S. 15° W. twenty-eight chains, more or less, west sixteen chains, more or less, S. 33° W. fourteen chains, more or less, S. 15° W. twenty-five chains, more or less, and westerly thirty-five chains, more or less, to the Melbourne road aforesaid; and thence by that road bearing easterly one mile, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.G.2712.)

PART OF THE YEA ROAD DISTRICT ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of February 1872.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of February One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine the Yea Road District was constituted: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the sixth day of February in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five the Shire of Seymour was divided into three separate ridings, the respective boundaries of which were therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Yea Road District therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Yea Road District from such district, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such district shall be attached to the Seymour Riding of the Shire of Seymour: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Yea Road District and of the Seymour Riding of the said Shire of Seymour in manner following, that is to say:—

THE YEA ROAD DISTRICT.—Beginning in the parish of Kinglake, in the centre of a road on the crest of the Dividing Range due south of the south-west angle of allotment 3 A, thence northerly to and along the western boundaries of allotments 3 A, 4, and 5, parish of Kinglake, and the King Parrot and Narrangarung Creeks to the Goulburn River; thence easterly by that river to a point due south of the south-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence north to and by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section and a straight line to meet a tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence by the course of the said tributary of Hughes' Creek to its intersection with the southern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section; thence easterly, northerly, and westerly by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of the northern boundary by the said tributary; thence northerly by that tributary to the southern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive right; thence westerly by the southern boundary, northerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section to the intersection of its northern boundary by the said tributary, and northerly by the said tributary to its junction with Hughes' Creek, being the Anglesey county boundary; thence easterly along the county boundary to a point due north of the mouth of the Home Creek; thence due south to the River Goulburn; thence by that river and south to the north-west boundary of the Wanregarwen run; thence south-easterly by the boundary of the Wanregarwen and Riversdale runs to the Acheron River; thence up that river to a point due west of the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Granton; thence N. 240° E. to a point on the crest of the Dividing Range at Mount Saint Leonard; thence westerly to the commencing point.

THE SEYMOUR RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.—Commencing at a point two miles west of the north-west angle of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive right; thence east to the said north-west angle, and further east by the northern boundary of the said section and a direct line to a point due south of the south-east angle of Jones' pre-emptive right; thence north to and by the eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive right to the southern boundary of the township of Avenel reserve; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said township reserve to Hughes' Creek; thence up that creek to its junction with a tributary north of the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section; thence southerly by that tributary to its intersection with the said northern boundary; thence westerly by the northern boundary, southerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the southern boundary to the intersection of the said southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to the northern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section; thence easterly by the northern boundary, southerly by the eastern boundary, and westerly by the southern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of its

southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to a point due north of the north-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line south to the said north-west angle, and further south by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section to the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly by the Goulburn River to the Sugarloaf Creek; thence by the said creek south-westerly to a point due south of the commencing point; and thence by a line north to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CONSTITUTION OF A SHIRE TO BE TWO SEPARATE SHIRES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of February 1872.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 20) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall have received a petition, signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names shall appear upon some voters' roll for a shire or any one or more ridings thereof, setting forth that by reason of the great extent of such shire or remoteness of the part wherein such petitioners reside from other parts thereof, and of the diversity of the industry and interests of such part from those of the remainder thereof (of the truth of which allegations and the grounds thereof the Governor alone shall judge), it is expedient to constitute the two parts of such shire so differently affected two separate shires, to constitute accordingly such parts with such boundaries and under such names as shall seem fit two separate shires to be deemed proclaimed shires under this Act, and all ridings of the shire so separated shall cease to exist: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the thirtieth day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the shire of Dundas was constituted: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventh day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the said shire of Dundas was subdivided into ridings: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names appears upon the voters' roll of the said Shire of Dundas, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the two parts, hereinafter described, of the area hitherto constituting the Shire of Dundas to be two separate shires, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the names and boundaries of such proclaimed shires in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.—Commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of the parish of Pendyk-pendyk and the county boundary of Dundas; thence south to the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence south by the road on the western margin of said parish and of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-east angle of allotment 5A of section 1 of the last said parish; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said allotment and the road on the northern margin of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-west angle of said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 2N of section 2 of the parish of Urangara; thence further south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence east by the southern boundary of said parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 2 and 3 of the parish of Joolang; thence southerly by the said road and the western boundary of allotment 4 of section 17 of the said parish to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said parish of Redruth to the River Wannon; thence westerly by the course of that river to the north-west angle of the parish of Muralda in the county of Normanby; thence south by the western boundary of that parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 3 and 4 in the said parish; thence westerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 17 of section 19 in the parish of Tahara; thence south by the western boundaries of said allotment 17 and of allotments 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23 of said section 19 to the road from Green Hills to Coleraine; thence south-easterly by that road to the south-west angle of section 19 in the parish of Muralda; thence easterly by the road on the north of the parish boundary of Braxholme, and by said parish boundary to the north-east angle of section 6 in the said parish; thence south by the parish boundary to the main road from Braxholme to Hamilton; thence north-easterly by that road to the intersection of a right line joining the south-west angle of section 4 in the parish of Yulecart and the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section in the parish of Byambynee;

thence southerly by that line to the north-west angle of the Lyne pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of the Weerangourt pre-emptive section; thence by the western boundary of said section to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a right line south-easterly to the north-west angle of section 4 of the parish of Macarthur; thence southerly by the western boundary of section 4 and the south-western boundary of section 2 of the said parish to the north-west angle of the township reserve of Macarthur; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the said township reserve to the western boundary of the county of Villiers; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said county to the eastern boundary of the county of Dundas; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of the county of Dundas to the commencing point, excepting the borough of Hamilton.

THE SHIRE OF WANNON.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence south by the road on the western margin of said parish and of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-east angle of allotment 5A of section 1 of the last said parish; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said allotment and the road on the northern margin of the parish of Gatung-gatum to the north-west angle of said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 2N of section 2 of the parish of Urangara; thence further south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence east by the southern boundary of said parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 2 and 3 of the parish of Joolang; thence southerly by the said road and the western boundary of allotment 4 of section 17 of the said parish to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said parish of Redruth to the River Wannon; thence north-westerly by the course of the River Wannon to the intersection of the main road from Green Hills to Harrow; thence northerly by the said main road to its intersection with the most northern branch of the Pigeon Ponds; thence westerly and northerly by the said branch and by the main channel of the Pigeon Ponds to the River Glenelg; thence by following upwards the course of the said river to the eastern boundary of the parish of Pendyk-pendyk; thence south by the said boundary to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Francis Longmore, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

INCORPORATION OF SWAN HILL DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled *An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any institution established for the cure of disease, or for the relief of diseased, aged, incurable, or destitute persons, and supported in whole or in part by the voluntary contributions of not less than fifty persons, each of whom shall have paid not less than One pound per annum or Twenty pounds in one donation, may be incorporated as thereinafter mentioned, and all persons who shall have paid as aforesaid shall be deemed contributors within the meaning of the said Act; and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, on receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five of the said persons praying that such institution may be incorporated, to cause the substance or prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of such persons, shall have been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication) the Governor in Council may declare the contributors for the time being to such institution to be, and they shall thereupon become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to an institution at Swan Hill, established for the purposes of a Public Hospital, praying that the contributors thereto may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council doth by this present Order declare the contributors to the said institution to be a

body politic and corporate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, in manner following, that is to say:—

The contributors for the time being to the institution provided for a Public Hospital at Swan Hill, in the Colony of Victoria, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Swan Hill District Hospital."

The contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum, situate at Geelong, in the county of Grant, are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum."

BYE-LAW No. 2.—REGULATING DRAINAGE IN THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT, 24th OCTOBER 1871.

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mechanics' Institute, Reefs, Stawell, in the said district, on the twenty-fourth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

Clause 1. In the interpretation of and for the purposes of this bye-law the following words and terms, if not inconsistent with the context, shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—The words "owners or occupiers" shall include the mortgagee in possession; the words "draining machinery" shall apply only to any appliance used or that may be used for the purposes of raising or lifting water from any claim, gold mining, or mineral lease by horse or steam power; the words "datum water-level" shall mean the approximate depth from the surface at which the water was first struck or met with in any area; and all words used in the singular number shall include the plural number.

2. The owners or occupiers of any machine which is employed drawing or raising water and thereby draining any

land on which any claims, gold mining or mineral leases, are situated shall be entitled to hold, subject to the provisions of this bye-law, a drainage area, which shall include the claims or leases so drained, and shall be defined at each corner and along the boundaries by posts painted white not less than three (3) inches in diameter, extending not less than three (3) feet above the surface, and not more than one hundred and fifty (150) yards apart: Provided that no such area shall exceed eight hundred (800) yards in length by eight hundred (800) yards in width.

3. When any claim or lease situated within any drainage area is being worked below the datum water-level of such area, the owner or occupier of such claim or lease shall, by the payment of a drainage rate, contribute to the working and maintenance expenses of the machinery draining such area.

4. The owner of any drainage area shall employ the mining surveyor of the mining division in which the area is situated to survey such area, and show by a plan thereof all claims or leases included within such area, together with the position of the draining machinery and datum water-level; and such holder shall also notify his occupation of such area to the clerk of the Ararat Mining Board, accompanied by a copy of such plan of survey, and a statement setting forth the extent of area held, the number of claims or leases contained therein, the names and addresses of the owners of the claims or leases from whom he claims drainage rates under this bye-law, together with a voucher of the monthly expenditure incurred in working and maintaining the draining machinery; and the said clerk shall thereupon serve or cause to be served upon the respective owners of the claims or leases within the drainage area a notice setting forth the amount of drainage rate, awarded on the principle hereinafter named, to be paid by them, and the rate as notified shall be the rate levied and claimed on account of the drainage of any such claim or lease, unless the same be varied or set aside on appeal as provided for in section 75 of *The Mining Statute 1865*.

5. The principle upon which drainage rates shall be computed and charged to the owners or occupiers of such claim or lease, situated within a drainage area, shall be by equitably proportioning (according to the area of each claim or lease in which the workings are below the datum water-level) the ascertained monthly expenditure incurred in working and maintaining the machinery draining such area.

6. The holder of any drainage area who is receiving drainage rates therefrom shall keep his drainage appliance continuously at work if necessary, and shall at all times maintain such in an efficient state, so as to prevent the water from rising in the works of the claims or leases in such area to such an extent as to impede the working of such claims or leases; but no drainor shall be held liable for any damage caused through the stoppage of his drainage appliance if it can be shown that such stoppage was caused by an accident to the machinery or for effecting necessary repairs, provided, however, that such repairs are made with the utmost despatch.

7. All rates imposed under this bye-law shall become due once a month and shall be paid to the clerk of the board at his office, Ararat, and shall forthwith be paid by him into the London Chartered Bank, Ararat, and shall be disbursed to the parties entitled to receive the same once in every month in the manner prescribed in the 76th section of the Mining Statute 1865, provided that there shall be deducted from such disbursements the cost of collecting and disbursing the same; but in default of payment of such drainage rates the amount may be recovered in a summary manner, as provided by the 79th section of the Mining Statute 1865.

8. Any holder of a drainage area who desires to relinquish such may do so, provided he obtains the written consent of the owners or legal representatives of each claim or lease within the said area; otherwise he shall give notice of his desire to the owners or legal representatives of each claim or lease within said area at least fourteen (14) days before stopping his drainage appliance, and any holders of a drainage area neglecting to give such notice may be proceeded against for all damages or injury that such claimholders or leaseholders may have sustained in consequence of such stoppage.

9. From and after the date at which this bye-law shall have the force of law all former bye-laws relating to the drainage of claims, gold mining or mineral leases, in the Ararat Mining District, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving as affects the obligations, liabilities, and rights obtained previous to and held at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

The undersigned members of the said Mining Board concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

REVISED RULES OF KILMORE HOSPITAL.

VI.—BOARD OF MANAGEMENT, POWERS AND DUTIES.

THE Board of Management shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the hospital (the same not to be repugnant to the Hospitals Act), present an annual report to the general meeting, and manage the affairs of the institution generally. They shall meet for general business on the second Tuesday in each month, and for special business when requisite, by direction of the president or four members of the board. The board at their first

meeting shall elect two sub-committees (six members to be on each committee), one to be designated the Finance Committee, who shall examine all accounts sent in for payment, and check them with the "Provision Consumption Account" previously; such accounts to be made up to the last day in each month, and to be sent into the board four clear days before the day of meeting. The other sub-committee to be named the Visiting or House Committee, who shall visit the hospital at least once a month, in order to examine the state of the stock, and report thereon to the general board. They shall recommend the purchase or repairs of any articles required for the use of patients, and order repairs of building, when essentially required, provided the expense does not exceed £2.

X.—HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

The annual general meeting shall elect not more than three consulting medical officers, who must be legally qualified medical practitioners. They shall have access to the hospital at all times, and in case of their observing any neglect or inattention to the patients, it shall be their duty to report the same to the Board of Management. They shall attend the hospital when required for consultation, and shall make such arrangements for ordinary visits as may be deemed advisable by them, in the interest of the institution.

XI.—ELECTION OF PRESIDENT OR VICE-PRESIDENTS—PRIVILEGES OF HONORARY OFFICERS.

The annual general meeting shall elect a president and two vice-presidents, who, together with the treasurer and honorary medical officers, shall be members of the board of management and of all sub-committees, by virtue of their office.

XIII.—VACANCIES.

Should vacancies occur in the offices of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, or consulting medical officers, or if any member of the board shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the board, or become insolvent, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings from the board, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the board may declare his office vacant, and at the next ordinary meeting temporarily elect thereto an annual subscriber or life member of the hospital until the next annual meeting for the election of the board, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, together with those who, by the provisions of the Act, are required to go out of office.

XIV.—PAYING PATIENTS.

Patients who are able to pay for medical aid shall be charged at the rate of Thirty shillings per week for maintenance, and the general rules and regulations of the institution shall be applicable to and observed by them while in the hospital.

XV.—DESTITUTE PATIENTS.

Patients in destitute circumstances shall be required to make a declaration to that effect before a Justice of the Peace prior to their admission into the hospital.

XIX.—VISITORS.

Visitors may be permitted to see patients two days each week (Thursday and Sunday), and can do so on special occasions by procuring permission from the paid or honorary medical officers.

XX.—ACCIDENTS.

Cases of severe accident shall be admitted immediately without certificates from subscribers, but should patients so admitted be able to pay, they shall be charged at the rate of Thirty shillings per week, as specified in rule xiv.

XXI.—PAID MEDICAL OFFICER.

The paid medical officer shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, and shall have the right of engaging in private practice. He shall have the charge of all patients in the hospital, and be responsible for their treatment, but in cases of difficulty or danger shall request the attendance of one or more of the honorary medical officers. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the house steward and dispenser, and the general control of the servants, and have power to suspend them for insubordination or neglect of duty until the next meeting of the board. He shall give all requisite information to the honorary medical officers on their visits to the hospital, and shall enter all prescriptions in a book to be kept for that purpose. He shall visit the hospital every morning at eleven o'clock (or oftener if required), and ascertain if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and on his visits to the wards examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation. He shall give notice to the honorary medical officers when an operation is to be performed, and shall attend at the hospital dispensary at the hour of noon on Monday and Thursday in each week for the purpose of administering relief to out-patients. He shall also, in conjunction with the honorary medical officers, decide on the fitness of patients to be received into or discharged from the hospital.

XXII.—DISPENSER AND HOUSE STEWARD.

1. The medicines, surgical instruments, and all stores belonging to the hospital, shall be under his charge, and he shall make up and dispense with due attention all medicines for the sick as prescribed by the medical officers.
2. He shall take care that every medicine dispensed shall have the name of the patient, and the time and manner of using it, written in a clear and legible hand, affixed to the paper, box, phial, &c., into which it is put, and that the label be renewed when so far defaced as not to be easily read.
3. He shall from time to time commit to paper the particulars of such medicines and other articles as may be required for the use of the hospital, and have the names examined and signed by one or more of the medical officers before ordering the required supplies. He shall prepare such quantities of the compound medicines as may be necessary for

the practice of the hospital, and insert in the "consumption account" the precise quantity of spirits used in making tinctures, &c.

4. He shall have the superintendence of the sick wards, and see that the meals of the patients are properly served according to the prescribed dietary, and that all the orders of the medical officers are duly carried into effect; the nurses, wardsmen, and other servants, being under him, subject also to the directions of the medical officers.

5. He shall live in the hospital, and shall not leave it, except on necessary occasions. He shall not be absent for more than two hours at any time in each day, such absence to be from nine o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m., nor more than three hours at any other time, and not after eleven o'clock at night, without the previous sanction of the Board of Management.

6. He shall keep a register of the cases treated in the hospital, and also for out-door patients, a periodical abstract of which he shall prepare to be laid before the board yearly, embracing the numbers, diseases, and results. That on the admission of patients into the hospital every week, he shall write the name, age, date of admission, &c., on a card to be suspended over the beds. He shall keep a book in which he shall insert the name of every patient for whom the medical officers shall prescribe either wine, spirits, ale, or stout, the name of the medical officer who has ordered the same, and the precise quantity ordered every day, which book shall be laid before the Board of Management at their stated meetings, together with a health report of the house.

7. He shall keep also such other medical books and papers as the medical officers may require for the use of their department, have charge of the key of the dead-house.

8. He shall visit the patients morning and evening, to ascertain that the treatment prescribed has been properly carried out, and especially to examine the condition of the wards in respect to their cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation, carefully observing if the nurses and the wardsmen have done their duty. And should any complaint be made, or any cause for such exist, in regard to the conduct of the nurses, wardsmen, other servants, or the patients themselves, it shall be his duty to report the same at the earliest opportunity to the medical officer.

9. He shall keep an exact inventory of all the goods belonging to and in the hospital, and shall examine both as to quantity and quality all supplies received, and enter an account thereof; and also post daily the "provision consumption account" according to the dietary scale of the Board of Management, and the orders of medical officers to sick inmates, so as to exhibit the individual and aggregate consumption of provisions and medical comforts; and also apportion the general expenditure under the different heads, as required by the Government, in the quarterly and yearly returns.

10. He shall keep an exact account of the admissions and discharges of patients, stating the cause of their discharge from the hospital. He shall, when required by the patients, procure any required clergyman.

XXIII.—DUTIES OF WARDSMAN.

To nurse the sick and keep them clean; to communicate with the medical officers and house steward respecting them. He shall strictly conform to the instructions of the medical officers with regard to the treatment and attendance of patients, and shall not absent himself from the premises without the permission of the paid medical officer or Board of Management.

XXIV.—DUTIES OF NURSE, COOK, LAUNDRESS, AND OTHER SERVANTS.

They shall perform such duties as may be required of them, and shall carry out the instructions of the medical staff and house steward, and shall not at any time absent themselves from the institution without the permission of the medical officer in charge.

BYE-LAWS OF THE ALEXANDRA COTTAGE HOSPITAL.

Incorporated under 27 Vict., No. 220.

ADOPTED and confirmed at a special meeting of contributors held at the Shire Hall, Alexandria, on Wednesday the 28th February 1872, at 8 p.m., duly convened for that purpose by advertisement, as required by Statute.

OBJECTS OF THE INSTITUTION.

1. That the objects of the institution be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, and casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid shall receive further than temporary assistance, provided also that, if there be room, patients capable of paying may be admitted on payment of £2 per week in advance.

CONSTITUTION.

2. The administration of the affairs of the hospital will be entrusted to a committee consisting of a president, vice-president, nine members, besides the treasurer and two honorary medical officers.

POWERS OF COMMITTEE.

3. The committee shall direct the general business of the hospital, frame rules for its internal regulation, the same not being repugnant to the bye-laws; enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the hospital, direct payment to be made for the same; and appoint and discharge all servants and paid officers of the institution. They shall meet at least once in every month, on such days

as they may appoint. They shall superintend and give all necessary directions for the admission, discharge, and dismissal of patients, in accordance with the terms and spirit of the bye-laws. The chairman of committee (who shall be the president if present, the vice-president in his absence, or some other member in their absence) shall have a casting vote in addition to a deliberative vote.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

4. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves at every second monthly meeting a visiting committee of three, who shall meet on such days and at such hour each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts, and, if necessary, engage or discharge servants, subject to the consent of the committee of management, and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

ORDINARY MEETINGS.

5. All ordinary meetings of the committee shall be summoned by circular by the secretary three days at least before the day of meeting; five members of committee to form a quorum.

NO PAID OFFICER ON COMMITTEE.

6. No person shall be a member of committee and a salaried officer of the hospital at the same time; nor shall any salaried officer be present at any committee meeting, except when specially requested to attend.

SPECIAL MEETING MAY BE SUMMONED.

7. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management, at which at least five members shall be present, or for nine or more governors, by a writing under their hands, to require the president to summon, at the expiration of not less than seven days, a special meeting of subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the president, and notice given in the local paper.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

8. The president and the vice-president shall be members ex officio of all committees.

9. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and deposited forthwith in such bank as the committee may determine.

10. The officers of the institution shall consist of a duly qualified medical practitioner, secretary and collector, dispenser, two auditors, and a matron.

11. All cheques shall be signed by the president or vice-president, the secretary and the honorary treasurer.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS, ETC.

12. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of governors and subscribers:—£20, in one sum, life governor; £15, in one sum, life subscriber; £25, corporate body, annual governor; £25, first executor under a will, governor for one year; £15, minister collecting in one year, governor for one year; £15, layman or corporate body collecting in one year, governor for one year; £2, yearly subscription, governor; £1, yearly subscription, subscriber; with power to recommend patients as follows:—Life governor, one in-patient and three out-patients always on the books; life subscriber, one in-patient and one out-patient always on the books; governor for one year, three in-patients and four out-patients annually; governor, two in-patients and two out-patients annually; subscriber, one in-patient and two out-patients annually.

13. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee, and shall be made by tickets only, to be issued by the secretary or collector. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and be available twelve months after issue.

14. The members of committee, honorary and medical officers, shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the committee or sub-committee.

15. Accidents, and cases deemed of decided emergency by the paid medical officer, may be admitted at any time. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient within the walls of the hospital under any circumstances.

16. That the medical officer be required to enter in a book kept for that purpose the date of each occasion on which, in accordance with the bye-laws, he admits or excludes visitors on appointed days, as also his reasons for thus admitting or excluding visitors.

17. Any patient guilty of gross misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any three of the committee, upon its being substantiated.

18. The committee or sub-committee shall have power to discharge any patient who is not in their opinion a proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

19. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current financial year, and no governor or subscriber will be entitled to any privileges until the subscription is paid.

20. The subscribers to the Alexandra Cottage Hospital shall be entitled to vote in proportion to their subscriptions, according to the following scale, viz.:—£1 and less than £3, one vote; £3 and less than £5, two votes; £5 and upwards, three votes.

PECUNIARY INTEREST.

21. Any contractor or tenderer to the hospital, being a member of the committee, shall absent himself from its sittings whilst any subject relating to his contract or tender is under consideration.

VACANCIES.

22. Whenever a vacancy shall occur in the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, or auditors, the secretary shall report the same at the next ordinary meeting of committee, who shall direct the secretary to summon a meeting of contributors for the election of a successor.

TREASURER.

23. Previous to making any payment the treasurer shall require a warrant of the committee of management authorizing such payment, which shall be signed by the president or chairman of committee and one of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

24. He shall, previous to each monthly meeting of the committee, examine the collector's book-book, and he shall lay before the contributors at the annual meeting a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past year, and shall see that the secretary keep proper accounts.

SURGEON.

25. The surgeon shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner. He shall be allowed private practice, but shall visit the hospital at least every alternate day, and oftener if necessary.

26. He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of each case, and decide on its fitness for admission, and shall discharge such patients as he considers fit to be discharged.

27. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and their treatment.

VISITORS.

28. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave from the surgeon or house committee.

MATRON AND NURSE.

29. The matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave it for any length of time without the consent of the general committee; she shall have immediate control of the establishment, shall visit each ward every day, and ascertain if it, and the beds, bedding, and clothes of the patients, be clean and neat, removing such of the beds, bedding, and clothes as require it to be replaced with others.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

30. He shall convene and attend all special, general, and committee meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceedings and transcribe them carefully into books kept for that purpose, and he shall carry out the directions of such meetings in the particulars incident to his department.

31. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the institution, under the direction of the committee.

32. He shall compile all reports that may be ordered by the committee, fill up all cheques, and perform the clerical duties connected with the office of treasurer, and shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall not affix the same to any document without authority.

33. He shall canvass the district to obtain donations and contributions. *He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt.* He shall hand over to the treasurer fortnightly all moneys received by him during the previous fortnight, and at the same time furnish the treasurer with a list of contributors and the respective sums paid by them; and he shall enter into a bond of £100 for the due fulfilment of his office.

PATIENTS.

34. Every person claiming the benefits of the hospital, whether as an in-door or out-door patient, must produce a recommendation from a contributor. Accidents, however, and such cases of decided emergency as, in the opinion of the medical officer, admit of no delay, may be attended to, and, if necessary, admitted at any time, whether recommended by a contributor or not.

35. In the absence of satisfactory reasons to the contrary being offered to the general committee, no person shall be allowed to remain in the hospital who, in the opinion of the medical staff, may receive equal benefit as an out-patient. Every person obtaining the benefits of the institution under a plea, expressed or implied, of destitution, who shall, in the estimation of the general committee, upon a representation being made to them of the fact, be able to pay for such benefits, shall be liable for the same after the rate £2 per week; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the hospital, and well able, in the estimation of the general committee, to pay for them, will also be required to pay for the same after the same rate.

36. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the medical officer and the nurse.

37. Patients considered by the medical officer sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution, may, at the discretion of the medical officer, be so employed.

AUDITORS.

38. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books, accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall certify to their correctness and report thereon to the annual general meeting.

39.
