# NOTICE TO MASTERS, AGENTS, AND CONSIGNEES OF VESSELS.

FREQUENT instances having occurred recently of the neglect of masters of vessels to report fully particulars of the cargo on board their vessels respectively from various causes, the attention of Masters, Agents, and Consignees of vessels is invited to the following sections of the Customs Act 1857, viz.:-

40. The master of every ship must report his ship and particulars of cargo within twenty-four hours after arrival.
41. If master fails so to report, or makes a false report, he shall forfeit £100.
42. Goods not reported may be detained, and such goods may be restored on such terms as the Commissioner may think proper.
43. No goods shall be imported unless the master shall have a manifest of such goods, and if any goods shall be imported without such manifest the master shall forfeit £100.
47. Spirits, opium, and tobacco must be specially reported, otherwise the same shall be forfeited, unless the Commissioner shall permit them to be exported; and if the master wilfully fail to specify such goods he shall forfeit £100.

It is desired that particular care should be taken by masters of vessels to furnish themselves with such information as will enable them to act on the 40th, 43rd, and 47th sections.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Jika, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Jika into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

**THE NORTHERN RIDING.**—Commencing at the Merri Creek opposite the north-west corner of section 136, parish of Jika-jika; thence east by the northern boundaries of sections 186 and 137 to the Darebin Creek; thence southward by said creek to a point east of the north boundary of allotment 119 in the aforesaid parish; thence west to the north-west corner of allotment 113; thence south to the centre of Westgarth street; thence westward and southward by the southern and part of the western boundaries of the shire to the commencing point.

**THE PRESTON RIDING.**—Commencing at the centre of the Merri Creek opposite the north-west corner of section 13, parish of Keelbundora; thence east by the north boundary of sections 13 and 14 and to the Darebin Creek; thence south by the centre of that creek to opposite the south-east corner of section 14; thence west by the south boundary of said section and to the centre of the Epping road; thence south by the centre of this road to opposite the south-east corner of section 139, parish of Jika-jika; thence west by the south boundary of that section and on to the centre of the Merri Creek; thence northerly and westerly by the westward boundary of the shire to the commencing point.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Parliament of Victoria in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the law relating to the distillation, rectifying, and compounding of Spirits, to the granting a duty upon Spirits distilled in Victoria, and to regulate the brewing of Beer and the sale of fermented and Spirituous Liquors in certain cases*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any person except as thereafter excepted who shall carry on the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits, or who shall have in his possession or who shall make use of any still or other utensil for distilling or rectifying and compounding spirits, except in such place as the Governor in Council shall by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One hundred pounds, nor more than Five hundred pounds: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the undermentioned place as a place wherein the business of a distiller or rectifier and compounder of spirits may be carried on, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point bearing east three thousand nine hundred links from the corner of Anakies road at the west side of allotment 104, parish of Anakies; thence by a line bearing south two hundred links; thence by a line bearing east two hundred and fifty links; thence by a line bearing north two hundred links; thence by a line bearing west two hundred and fifty links to commencing point; containing two roads, and being part of allotment 105, parish of Anakies, county of Grant.
