#### NOTICE TO MASTERS, AGENTS, AND CONSIGNEES OF VESSELS.

THEQUENT instances having occurred recently of the neglect of masters of vessels to report fully particulars of the cargo on board their vessels respectively from various causes, the attention of Masters, Agents, and Consignees of vessels is invited to the following sections of the Customs Act 1857, viz. :-

- 40. The master of every ship must report his ship and particulars of cargo within twenty-four hours after arrival.
- 41. If master fails so to report, or makes a false report,

  42. Goods not reported may be detained, and such goods may be restored on such terms as the Commissioner may think proper.
