PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED TO CERTAIN SHIRES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Botesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Shire of Dundas by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869: And whereas the said shire of Dundas has been since constituted two shires which are respectively designated the Shire of Dundas and the Shire of Wannon: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the hereinbefore mentioned Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869, and do revoke so much and such part thereof as extends Part II. of the recited Act to the Shire of Dundas; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Shire of Dundas,
The Shire of Wannon.

PUBLIC STREET IN THE BOROUGHS OF SANDRIDGE AND EMERALD HILL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Botesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act the land reserved or used for the street, highway, or thoroughfare which is hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Road in the Boroughs of Sandridge and Emerald Hill.
The total width one hundred and thirty-two feet.

The limits:—Commencing on the left bank of the River Yarra Yarra at the north-eastern end of the proposed ferry across that river near Williamstown; thence north-easterly through the borough of Sandridge into the borough of Emerald Hill to the intersection of the South Bank road by the prolongation of Ferrars street: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.G.5781.)

3. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at once; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.
