## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 18th day of October 1871, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise Her power of disallowance with respect to the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the 35th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz.:—

No. 392. An Act to amend "The Lands Compensation Statute 1869." [Assented to 2nd August 1871.]

No. 393. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and thirty thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy one and two. [Assented to 2nd August 1871.]

## PUBLIC STREETS AT SANDHURST.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: Provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided: And provided further that every and any such proclamation may be any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor. Now therefore I the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, do by th's notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act, but subject to all existing rights of miners, the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are shown by green tint on a plan of the said City of Sandhurst, attached to correspondence bearing the distinctive mark "71. D. 24791," and which was this day submitted for approval.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and in the thirty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE GENERAL SESSIONS OF THE PEACE DURING THE YEAR 1872.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the seventh day of December 1868, the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions shall have jurisdiction were defined: And whereas by other Proclamations bearing date the fourth day of January 1869, and the twenty-eighth day of December 1870, some of such districts were altered: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace having jurisdiction within the places or districts defined or altered as hereinbefore mentioned shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

*Description of land.*—Firstly, all that piece or parcel of land, containing by admeasurement two acres one rood and twenty perches, be the same more or less, situated in the county of Bourke, parish of North Melbourne, and being part of section 15, city of Melbourne: Commencing at the north-east corner of allotment number four of the said section, and bounded on the north by Little Collins street, fifty links wide, bearing north sixty-two degrees east five hundred links; on the east by William street bearing south twenty-eight degrees east four hundred and seventy-five links; on the south by Collins street bearing south sixty-two degrees west five hundred links; and on the west, by allotment four aforesaid bearing north twenty-eight degrees west four hundred and seventy-five links. (Advertised as number 16 in the Government notice of 7th March 1850.) of moneys paid by them; and neither lessees, vendees, mortgagees, or exchangees to be entitled to demand evidence of consent by, nor are their titles to be affected by any want of consent on the part of any of the persons before mentioned to the exercise of any power by the trustees. Subject to the exercise of the above powers, incumbent or officiating minister for the time being of the ecclesiastical parish of St. James' to be entitled to minister in church and to have use and control of buildings.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—Three-fifths of the net rents of land leased to be paid to the minister for the time being of the ecclesiastical parish of St. James', Melbourne, so that the amount so paid do not in any one year exceed One thousand pounds. Surplus to be paid to the bishop or to the person duly authorized to administer the affairs of the diocese during the vacancy of the see, to be applied by him under advice as aforesaid to such purposes as may be deemed most beneficial for the religious denomination known as the United Church of England and Ireland in Victoria. Tenders will be opened in the presence of tenderers, and such tenderers as can conveniently attend are requested to do so. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Telegrams will not be entertained, and tenders should be upon the printed form. Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. The tender must show the particular kind of hay or straw offered.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small, will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained. The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenders failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the box at the Stores Tender Board Offices, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Stores Tender Board Offices, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be good, sound and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; maize to be sound and sweet.
2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate, will not, however, exceed during the whole 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.
8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.
9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.
11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1872; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

**SHIRE OF NEWHAM.**

**No. 1 BYE-LAW.**

*Bye-laws for providing for the due management of the affairs of the council, and regulating the conduct of their officers and servants.*

**B**E it ordered and directed by the council of the shire of Newham as follows (that is to say):—

1. At every ordinary meeting of the council, the first business thereof shall be the reading of, and putting for confirmation, the minutes of any preceding meeting; and no discussion shall be allowed thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the president or chairman of the meeting at which the proceedings took place, in accordance with the Act.

2. The order of the business shall be as follows:—

1. Reading of correspondence and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Orders of the day.
5. Motions, of which previous notice has been duly given.
6. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.
7. Reading notices of motions for future meetings.

3. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

4. No person, not being a member of the council, shall be allowed to address the council, without the consent of a majority of the councillors present.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud to the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every notice of motion shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

7. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called on; and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice-paper.

8. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

9. The mover of any motion which shall be referred to a committee shall for the occasion be a member of such committee.

10. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

11. The president's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice.

12. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a discussion thereon the votes shall be recorded if required by any councillor.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

14. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the

motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence; before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the motions then undiscussed shall have precedence at the next adjourned meeting of the council.

15. No councillor shall speak more than once on the same proposition, except by way of explanation or reply, or an original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of an amendment last proposed, and after the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

16. Every councillor when proposing a motion or amendment, or speaking on any matter, shall address the president, and shall not be interrupted, except called to order, whereupon he shall sit down until the question of order shall have been decided. The councillor in possession of the chair may then resume the subject.

17. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

25s. Any councillor may, with the consent of the president, require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being uttered.

18. Any councillor may record his protest against any resolution of the council on giving notice of his intention so to do on the adoption of a resolution, and on such councillor entering his protest and his reason for the same in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the council, and on his signing the same before the next meeting of the council, provided always that such protest may be expunged if decided by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth or not to be in terms respectful to the council.

19. No election to any office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' notice shall have been given in some local newspaper inviting applications for the same, nor unless the salary or allowance attaching to such office shall have been fixed before proceeding to such election.

20. All contracts under £100 shall be made by tender unless the council shall otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president and only opened at the time of their consideration by the council.

21. All payments shall be made by cheque and signed by the chairman and two other councillors and countersigned by the secretary, and no cheque shall be given unless the account for which it is payable shall have been passed at a meeting of the council, or by a committee duly empowered so to do.

22. The shire office shall be open every Thursday, except the days excepted by the Shires Statute, and the days proclaimed as holidays under the Civil Service Act, between the hours of Twelve and Five o'clock p.m., during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the ordinary business of the council; the surveyor shall attend during the hours of business at every meeting of the council, and at such committee meetings as he may be required.

23. The valuer or valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and after having valued such property shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, to the owner or occupier thereof (or if such owner or occupier cannot be found the same to be left on the premises) a notice setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, together with other particulars sufficient to describe such property, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer.

24. The secretary and surveyor and every other officer and servant shall, whenever called on to do so, furnish official reports to the council.
