IN accordance with the provisions of the Act 27 Victoria No. 220, intituled, An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions, the Governor in Council has, by Order made on the 3rd day of January 1872, directed to be published the substance or prayer of a petition to His Excellency, signed by sixty-three contributors to the Lower Murray District Hospital, situate at Swan Hill, praying for its incorporation.

No. 392. An Act to amend "The Lands Compensation Statute 1869." [Assented to 2nd August 1871.]

No. 393. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and thirty thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy one and two. [Assented to 2nd August 1871.]

WHEREAS by The Boroughs Statute (33 Vict. No. 359) it is for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way shall thereupon and thence-forth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: Provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided: And provided further that every and any such proclamation may be any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, do by th's notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act, but subject to all existing rights of miners, the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are shown by green tint on a plan of the said City of Sandhurst, attached to correspondence bearing the distinctive mark "71. D. 24791," and which was this day submitted for approval.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Henry Thomas Viscount Canterbury, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron Bottesford, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Pecrage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Justices of the Peace Statute 1865, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: And whereas by Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony bearing date the seventh day of December 1868, the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions shall have jurisdiction were defined: And whereas by other Proclamations bearing date the fourth day of January 1869, and the twenty-eighth day of December 1870, some of such districts were altered: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the Courts of General Sessions of the Peace having jurisdiction within the places or districts defined or altered as hereinbefore mentioned shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

4. No person, not being a member of the council, shall be allowed to address the council, without the consent of a majority of the councillors present.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council and any business which the president shall think fit to bring under consideration.
