PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Henry Thomas Viscount Cantenbury, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron Bottlesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the Governorment Gazette, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as Reserves made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and subject to the conditions prefixed to the respective descriptions, viz.:—

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or unite one or more of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, unite, or increase (as the case may be) the Commons herein

after mentioned in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Barnawartha Farmers' Commons. — The Barnawartha Farmers' Common, described in three several Proclamatious bearing date respectively the 4th day of March 1861, the 4th day of December 1865, and the 11th November 1868, and the South Barnawartha Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 25th day of November 1861 and the 4th day of December 1865, are hereby united.—(71.A.22671.)

The deaths in April were fewer by 16 than those in March. They were also below the average of April in the previous ten years by 11; but, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of April by 76.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 781° on the 20th, and the lowest was 412° on the 23rd. The mean temperature of the month (559°) was 31° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (295°) took place on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 75° to a minimum of 455°. The least range (33°) was on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 60°3° to a minimum of 52°. The mean daily range was 177°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30°021 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Fifty-eight per cent. of the deaths were of males, and 42 per cent. were of females. Nearly 50 per cent. were of children under five years of age, against 49 per cent. in April 1871, 50 per cent. in April 1870, 47 per cent. in April 1869, 52 per cent. in April 1868, 66 per cent. in April 1867, 54 rec cent. in April 1868, 60 per cent. in April 1865, 62 per cent. in April 1864, 58 per cent. in April 1865, and 53 per cent. in April 1862.

Five persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male, aged 75, of heart disease; a male, aged 79, of dysentery; a female, aged 79, of dropsy; a female, aged 82, and a male, aged 85, of old age.

The following are the particulars:—A girl, aged 4, was killed by a cart-wheel passing over her; a carter, aged 40, died of injuries to the spine caused by a fall from a dray; a carter, aged 43, died of rupture of the urethra; a wardsman of the Alfred Hospital died of inplaing chloroform; three men, aged respectively 35, 55, and 64, were found drowned; and a male infant, aged 8 weeks, was suffocated by pressure of its mother.
