The following letter from the Government Resident, Northern Territory, is published for general information.

THOS. REYNOLDS, Commissioner.

The Residence, Palmerston, Port Darwin,
Northern Territory of South Australia, 7th March 1872.
THE following information is published for the use of the
commanders of vessels visiting Port Darwin, to enable them

to anchor clear of the telegraphic cable between Port Darwin and Java. Bearings magnetic var. $1^{\circ} 40'$ east.

Landing-place and direction of cable.

1. The shore end of the cable is landed on the mud flat below the Residence, on the east extreme of the table land on which the town stands.
2. From about a cable's length from the edge of the flat the cable takes a W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ northerly direction for $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles (one mile and two-thirds), when the north extreme of Point Emery bears N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., and the base of Fort Hill, on which the flag-staff stands, bears E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.
3. From that position the cable extends in a N. by W. direction, running parallel to the Point Emery shoal for three (3) miles, when the extreme of the cliff of Point Emery bears S.S.E., and East Point N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.
4. The cable then takes a W.N.W. direction for two and a-half ($2\frac{1}{2}$) miles, when the south extreme of East Point bears E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., and Tale Head S. by E.
5. From the above position the cable is laid in a N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ westerly direction for eleven (11) miles when its course is changed to W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. into the offing and in soundings beyond fourteen (14) fathoms.

With the foregoing particulars any commander of a ship can lay down the direction of the cable on his chart of the harbor.

Sailing directions.

1. Off the coast line between Fort Point and Point Emery, being in the vicinity of the ordinary anchorage off the town, to keep outside and clear of the cable, keep the extreme of the land of the West Point at high-water mark N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W., and Talk Head centre of summit, from W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. to S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.
2. Off the coast line between Point Emery and East Point, keeping to the westward of the cable, keep King's Table centre of summit S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. until East Point bears N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.
3. In the offing clear of the harbor to keep S. W. of line of cable in about twelve fathoms, keep south extreme of Point Emery S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. until the west extreme of the land about Point Charles bears S. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

Inside line of cable between Emery Point and East Point not recommended to navigate.

4. It is not recommended to navigate inside the line of cable between Emery Point and East Point, as that portion of the coast is much encumbered with shoals.
5. In the offing the navigation is safe on both sides of the cable.

Shore end of cable.

6. The shore end of the cable, which is carried out to the north of Point Charles, is very heavy, and could not be lifted by any small craft, though it might be injured, and subject the commander and owners of any ship fouling it negligently to heavy damages.

Tides.

7. The tides in the vicinity and in the harbor of Port Darwin are very rapid and somewhat irregular. It is high-water at Port Darwin at full and change, at five hours twenty-five minutes. Springs rise and fall from sixteen to twenty-four feet; neaps, two to twelve feet. The ebb stream makes forty minutes before high-water. The flood sets from the westward, and the ebb from the E.N.E., outside the harbor.

Caution as to anchoring near line of cable during strong tides or during north-west monsoon.

8. Great care should be taken in anchoring near the line of the cable during the strength of the tides, as the soundings being deep, ships sometimes drag before bringing up. This caution should be specially regarded during the north-west monsoon.

Anchorage.

9. The best anchorage is off the south side of the little valley between the table land and Fort Hill, not coming under seven (7) fathoms at low-water in a large vessel, or under six (6) in a small craft.

By keeping off the south side of the valley in which the Government depot and stores exist, or off the north side of Fort Hill, the line of cable will be completely avoided, as well as the mud flat which lies between the centre of the valley and the point to the northward of it.

Ships remaining for any time to moor.

10. All ships remaining for two or three days or more should moor with open hawse to the N.W.

Position of flagstaff, Port Darwin.

11. The flagstaff at Port Darwin is in lat. $12^{\circ} 28' 28''$ S., long. $130^{\circ} 52'$ E. The commercial code of signals is in use at this station.

Pilot.

12. Whenever a vessel heaves in sight the harbor master and pilot will board her and bring her into the anchorage.

Free port.

13. Port Darwin is a free port; neither customs duties nor harbor dues are imposed. A shipping master is appointed for the shipping and discharge of seamen under the Marine Board Act of South Australia. The Australian commanders of ships are, however, required to report and clear their ships in the usual way before the custom house officer, and a correct account in the form of entry must be given of all goods landed, although no import duties exist.

Magistrates and police.

A magistrate's court exists, and a body of mounted police are stationed in the territory.

EAST COAST OF MIDDLE ISLAND.—AHURIRI REEF.

THE following particulars from the survey of this reef made by Commander Edwin, R.N., of the Marine Department, are published for general information.

The Ahuriri reef lies in the position given by the following bearings, and extends from thence to the shore:—

Jones' Head, Waikouaiti Bay—S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

The second point south of Red Cliff—N.W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. 1 mile.

Masters of vessels are hereby cautioned that there are many patches of sunken rocks lying off the coast between Jones' Head and Vulcan Point, and they are recommended not to approach this part of the coast within two and a half miles distance.

Masters of vessels are requested to insert this danger on their charts.

DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city

or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of April in the present year, part of the Shire of St. Arnaud therein referred to was amongst other localities proclaimed under the said Act; and it is expedient to revoke such proclamation so far as it applies to the Shire of St. Arnaud: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamation, so far as it applies to the Shire of St. Arnaud; and, with the advice aforesaid, in compliance with the application in writing of the respective councils mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto annexed, I do hereby proclaim the shire and parts of shires mentioned in the last column of such Schedule to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in the said district, on the 14th day of May 1872, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

BYE-LAW No. 50.—RELINQUISHED AND ABANDONED CLAIMS.

When any claim or mining tenement on which mining operations have not been lawfully suspended or which is not otherwise exempted and protected from forfeiture pursuant to the provisions of these bye-laws shall have been left unoccupied by reason of the owner thereof having discontinued mining operations thereon, or in connection therewith for a period of six consecutive weeks, such claim or mining tenement and all lawful title thereto shall be deemed to have been relinquished and abandoned, and any person may take possession thereof for gold mining purposes in accordance with and subject to the provisions and conditions of these bye-laws, without giving any notice to the previous owner of such claim or mining tenement, or being liable to pay any compensation to him. Should any dispute arise between the person so taking possession of such relinquished and abandoned claim or mining tenement, and the previous owner thereof in consequence of such previous owner claiming to have a lawful prior title thereto, the latter shall in no way interfere with the mining operations of the person who shall have taken possession
