(Voor het Land.) Captain de Wit, of the Dutch barque *Wahelmina Fredrika*, reports—

a. The existence of a rock in the passage between the Basilan and Sulu group. The dangerous spot is not marked on the charts, and must be placed in

Lat. 6° 25' N. and
Long. 121° 22' E. fr. Gr.

A small part of the rock, covered with sand, was visible, but probably it will be awash at high tides. The danger is steep to, as at a short distance with thirty fathoms no bottom was found.

b. The position of Teomabal Island, belonging to the Pangutarang group (Sulu Sea), is not correct, it must be placed 7° N. by E. from its present position on the charts. The large reefs on the north side of this island extend 12 in. N.N.E. by direction.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in compliance with the application in writing of the respective councils mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto annexed, do hereby proclaim the portions of the shire and borough mentioned in the last column of such Schedule to be districts respectively within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

EVERSLEY FARMERS' COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described shall be and constitute a Farmers' Common at Eversley, county

of Kara-kara: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 9, parish of Eversley, being a point on the eastern side of a two-chain road to Ararat; thence by that road bearing south-westerly one hundred and ten chains; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of James Goff's land, being allotment C1; thence by that allotment and a line bearing east fifteen chains and south thirty chains; thence by lines bearing respectively east sixty chains, north fifty chains, and easterly ninety chains, more or less, to the Elmhurst Common; thence by the north-western boundary of that common to the road from Elmhurst to Crowlands; thence by that road bearing westerly and southerly to the north angle of allotment 7; and thence by that allotment and allotments 8 and 9 bearing south-easterly and westerly to the commencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.H.10102.)

EXTENSION OF PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" TO PART OF BATESFORD REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of August in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, all the provisions of Part I. of *The Police Offences Statute 1865* were extended to the town of Batesford: And whereas it is expedient to revoke such Proclamation so far as it relates to a portion of the said town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far as it relates to the portion of the town of Batesford which is situated within the boundaries of the Shire of Corio.

MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED ON RESERVED LAND AT BELVOIR.

On the discontinuance of mining operations hereby authorized each miner or party of miners shall fill in, to the satisfaction of any officer authorized in writing by the Minister of Mines, all shafts and excavations on the ground, and thereupon such officer shall give a certificate to that effect, and on the production of such certificate to the receiver and paymaster the deposit shall be payable to the holders thereof.
9. The Minister of Mines or any person authorized by him in writing shall have, at any time, power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within the reserve.
10. In case any of the above conditions be in any way violated the sum deposited by way of guarantee shall be forfeited, and it shall not be lawful for such miner or party of miners to mine upon or within the said lands.
