## DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the town hereinafter mentioned as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine, that is to say:—

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1863* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to or proclaim (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above recited Act, that is to say:—

LANGHI-GHIRAN FARMERS' COMMON.—The Langhi-Ghiran Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date the 21st May 1861, and the 1st February 1863, respectively, and diminished by Proclamation bearing date the 12th April 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the portion of land described hereinafter.—Seven hundred and twenty acres, county of Ripon, being the land comprised within the boundaries as follow: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 8 of section 23, parish of Langhi-Ghiran; thence by lines bearing respectively east eighty chains, north ninety chains, and west eighty chains, and thence by allotment 5 of section 22, by a line and by allotment 7 of section 23 aforesaid bearing south ninety chains to the commencing point.—(72.E.10885.)

WARRAWINGA COMMON.—The allotments and parts of allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of five thousand acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a common to be designated the "Warrawinga" Common, viz.: parish of South Warragaratta, allotment 7 of section 1, allotments 3 and 4 of section 2, allotment 1 of section 11, allotment 3 of section 29, and allotments 1, 2, 13b, 16, 17, 18, 20a, 23a, 24, 25, 26a, 27, 28, 29, 30, and parts of allotments 9 and 26b of section 31, parish of Glenrowen; allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 1; allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 2; and allotment 16 of section 12.—(72.G.5549.)

## SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

I mustered and counted over 2000 in each paddock; the dipping in both these cases had been done imperfectly, as I saw several undipped sheep in both lots.

I intend to prosecute in these cases this month.

I have issued no licenses and had no prosecutions this quarter.

#### 1ST BALLARAT RANGERS.

##### RULES.

1. A general meeting of the corps shall be held every six months, in the second week of January and the second week in July, for the purpose of electing a general committee, match committee, secretary, and two auditors.
2. The commanding officer may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and shall likewise do so on the written requisition of (25) twenty-five members, which requisition must specify the business to be dealt with, which must not be of a military nature. No such special meeting shall be held to be duly convened unless notice of it shall have been given at a parade of the corps, and advertised at least two clear days previous to the day of meeting.
3. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside.
4. The general committee shall consist of the commissioned officers of the corps and seven other members, who shall be elected by ballot at each half-yearly meeting. Five members of committee shall form a quorum. The committee shall meet once a month at such times as they may appoint; and if a

special committee meeting be necessary two clear days' notice thereof shall be given to each member, and at such special meeting no business shall be entertained except that which is specified in such notice. Absence from three consecutive meetings without sufficient excuse shall disqualify any elected member, and any vacancy caused by such disqualification or by resignation shall be filled up by the appointment of the member having the next highest number of votes at the last election of committee.

5. The duties of the committee shall be to decide upon any matter referred to them by the commanding officer, and generally to represent the corps. No vote or resolution of the committee shall be deemed to be of greater force or effect than a recommendation for the consideration of the commanding officer.

6. The match committee shall consist of three members of the corps, who shall be elected at the same time and in the same manner as the general committee, with the like power of filling up vacancies.

7. The duties of the match committee shall be to challenge and accept or decline challenges for matches, with the consent of the commanding officer, to make and carry out all necessary arrangements for such matches, to select members to compete therein, to take charge of and arrange as to competition for prizes, and generally to manage all matters connected with matches. The match committee will also act as representatives of the 1st Ballarat Rangers on the Butts' committee of the 1st and 3rd Ballarat Rangers: Provided always that the match committee shall have no power to incur any pecuniary liability whatever without the sanction of the commanding officer and general committee.

8. The duties of the secretary shall be to attend all meetings of the corps and committees, to keep clear and intelligible minutes of all proceedings at such meetings, to keep the accounts of the corps, to prepare half-yearly statements of receipts and expenditure, and post a fair copy thereof in the orderly room, to have the custody of all letters and papers connected with the corps entrusted to him by the commanding officer, and conduct all correspondence relating to the corps under the direction of the commanding officer.

9. All subaltern officers and non-commissioned officers shall be elected by ballot at a meeting of the corps, to be specially convened for that purpose by advertisement at least one week previous to such meeting, and the commanding officer shall forward the result of such ballot to the Commandant of Local Forces to be dealt with in accordance with clause 6 of the Volunteer Statute: Provided that there shall be no election unless there are three members of the corps qualified for the appointment as provided in the said Statute.

10. Every person desirous of being enrolled in the corps shall forward to the commanding officer an application in writing, supported by two members of the corps, containing the following particulars:—

Name in full,  
Age,  
Height,  
Occupation,  
Address,

which particulars shall be posted up in the orderly room for one week, and afterwards submitted to the general committee before the admission of the candidate.

11. The cost of the uniform issued to any member shall be deemed an advance of so much actual cash, which the recruit or member is to repay by making himself effective, as per Volunteer Regulations; any member failing to do so shall be liable, at the discretion of the commanding officer, to a fine of Forty shillings.

12. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of the arms, accoutrements, clothing, and other property of the corps issued to him, and if there be any damage done thereto beyond fair wear and tear, he shall be fined the amount of such damage, at the discretion of the commanding officer.

13. The clothing, arms, accoutrements, and other property issued to any member shall, under all circumstances of resignation or otherwise, remain the property of the commanding officer, and any member failing to produce them in the orderly rooms at the time appointed by the commanding officer shall be liable to a fine of Five shillings.

14. Any member changing his residence must give notice of the same to the commanding officer, in writing, within fourteen days of such change, and if he fail to do so he shall, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be fined Two shillings and sixpence.

15. Any member who shall leave his residence for a period of more than six weeks without giving notice, in writing, to the commanding officer, and without previously depositing his arms, uniform, and accoutrements in the orderly room, shall, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be fined a sum not exceeding Ten shillings.

16. A list of all fines imposed under the regulations in these rules shall be posted in the orderly room on the first day of the following month, fourteen days' notice having been previously given to members owing such fines, and all fines must be paid during the month in which they are posted.

17. Any member desirous of altering, rescinding, or adding to these rules must give fourteen days' notice of such intention to the commanding officer, who shall, on a requisition duly signed by twenty-five members, convene a special meeting of the corps to consider the same, and the proposed rules or alterations shall be posted in the orderly room at least seven days before such meeting.

18. Every member and every recruit, before being sworn in, shall be supplied with a copy of those rules, to which shall be attached a copy of clauses 70, 83, 84, 85, 86, 267, and 268 of the regulations under the Volunteer Statute, and also clause 9 of the Volunteer Statute.
