REGISTRATION OF LIENS UPON THE SECURITY OF LICENSES HELD UNDER SECTION 42 OF "THE AMENDING LAND ACT 1865."

IT is hereby notified, for the information of the public, that in future liens effected by licensees upon the security of their licenses held under section 42 of *The Amending Land Act 1865* will only be registered upon the following conditions, viz.:—That application by a licensee for registration of lien be accompanied by a statutory declaration that he has expended at least One pound (£1) per acre on improvements (with full particulars thereof) on the land, and that if he has not personally resided thereon, at least one-fifth portion of said land has been cultivated.

PERIODICAL INSPECTION OF SERVICE PIPES AND FITTINGS.

NOTICE.—It having been ascertained by a partial inspection of service pipes and fittings in tenements supplied with water by the Board of Land and Works that neglect on the part of consumers in maintaining them in a proper state of repair has resulted in great waste of water, thus materially reducing the general supply, and during the summer causing great inconvenience to the citizens, the board have considered it necessary to exercise the powers contained in clause 235 of the Public Works Statute, and have ordered a periodical inspection of all interior services and fittings between the hours of Nine a.m. and Four p.m., and in order that this may be effected rely with confidence upon the co-operation of consumers in enabling the persons employed on this duty to make the necessary examinations. They have been directed to produce their authority to any householder desiring to see it.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Court of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned place for the district of the Loddon to be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the day appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said court, that is to say:—

At Inglewood, on Wednesday the twenty-eighth day of August next ensuing, in lieu of the twenty-fourth day of the same month.

HORSHAM POLICE LOCK-UP GAOL DISCONTINUED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the city of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864*, 27 Victoria, No. 219, it is amongst other things enacted that the several Acts and parts of Acts mentioned in the schedule to the now reciting Act, to the extent to which the same are therein expressed to be repealed, shall be, and the same are thereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect any proclamation, sentence, rule, regulation, appointment, order, proceeding, warrant, direction, offence, or other thing theretofore passed, made, done, or committed, but any such proclamation, rule, regulation, appointment, order, or direction may be rescinded, altered, or otherwise dealt with as if the same had been made or passed under the now reciting Act: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twelfth day of September, in the year 1864, a certain building called and known as the Police Lock-up at Horsham, was proclaimed a gaol: And whereas it is expedient to discontinue the use of the said premises for the confinement of prisoners under sentence: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby rescind the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, whereby the said Police Lock-up at Horsham was constituted a Gaol.

2. Deposits of One sixpence or of any number of sixpences, or of pounds, shillings, and sixpences, will be received from any depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided the deposits made by such depositor do not exceed £100 within any period of fourteen days, without special permission in writing having first been obtained by such depositor from the Postmaster-General.

When the principal and interest together standing to the credit of any one depositor amount to the sum of £250, all interest will cease so long as the same funds continue to amount to the said sum of £250.

All deposits must be made in cash or in notes issued by Victorian banks.
This regulation to take effect on and after the 1st day of August 1872.
