## AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1872-3.

**A**PPPLICATION for a share in the sum of £2000 granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries will be received at this office until the 14th September next.

No grant to any library is to exceed £500, nor is any grant to be made to any institution in Melbourne.

N.B.—To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bona fide* a free library, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz.:—

1. The name of the institution, which should clearly indicate that it is a FREE LIBRARY.
2. The amount expended in the erection or purchase of the building, and the materials of which it is constructed, with particulars of any further proposed expenditure thereon.
3. The amount already contributed by the Government, specifying the years.
4. The amount locally subscribed, distinguishing between the sums subscribed before and since the last return.
5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1872 to 31st July.

## THE TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be called such town or city accordingly; provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid, and save where herein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of Ballarat East for the year ending the thirtieth day of September 1871 was not less than Ten thousand pounds: And whereas the boundaries of the said borough are amongst others described in the first schedule of the Act hereinbefore recited, and it is deemed expedient to proclaim the said borough to be a town: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by this notice proclaim the Borough of Ballarat East to be a Town, by the name in and by the Order in Council made in this behalf assigned thereto, that is to say—

TOWN OF BALLAARAT EAST.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and in the thirty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

FORM OF LEASE UNDER THE 45<sup>TH</sup> SECTION OF  
"THE LAND ACT 1869"

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the nineteenth day  
of August 1872.

PRESENT:  
His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS in the 45th and 110th sections of *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may grant leases of any Crown land not exceeding (except in the case of leases for guano or other manure) three acres for a term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date thereof, at a yearly rent of not less than five pounds for any of the purposes in the said Act specified; and it is also enacted that the Governor shall have power from time to time to make rules, regulations, and orders for the purposes thereinbefore mentioned, to alter or rescind such rules, regulations, and orders, or any rules, regulations, and orders theretofore made, for providing for all proceedings forms of grants, leases, licenses, and other instruments, and for the execution of all other matters and things arising under and consistent with the said Act, and not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act; and all such regulations shall be signed by the Minister, and upon being published in the *Government Gazette* shall be valid in law, as if the same were enacted in the said Act, and shall be judicially noticed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present order make the regulation that the subjoined Form of Lease shall be used for all Leaseholds under the forty-fifth section of the said Act, that is to say:—

THIS INDENTURE made the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy— Between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and

(hereinafter called the lessees) of the other part demised and in granting this lease under the powers contained in *The Land Act 1869* enabling him in this behalf the Governor of the Colony of Victoria by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof has thought fit that the lease thereof shall be subject to the covenants and conditions and to the payment of the rent hereinafter contained and reserved and these presents contain a covenant that if the lessees their executors administrators or licensed assigns shall at any time during the term fail to use the demised land *bonâ fide* for the purpose for which it is granted the lease shall be voidable

Now it is hereby witnessed that in consideration of the rents reservations covenants provisions and agreements hereinafter contained on the part of the said lessees their executors administrators and assigns to be paid observed and performed Her Majesty doth by these presents grant and demise unto the said lessees their executors administrators and licensed assigns All and singular the lands and hereditaments mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and shown with the measurements and abutments thereof in the map drawn in the margin of these presents and therein colored yellow together with the appurtenances thereto belonging Reserving and excepting nevertheless unto Her Majesty her heirs and successors all gold and other metals and all mines and minerals of every description and also all sand clay gravel and indigenous timber and all earth and stone and other materials the produce of the said land which may be required at any time or times hereafter for the construction or repair of any public ways bridges canals or railroads or any fences embankments dams sewers or drains necessary for the same Together with the right of searching digging for working taking and removing all such materials and also with the right of full and free ingress egress and regress into out of and upon the said land at all reasonable times for such purposes And also reserving and excepting the use of all such parts of the said land as shall be required for making railways canals water-courses reservoirs dams or sewers over in upon or through the same with full and free liberty of ingress egress and regress into out of and upon the said land at all reasonable times for such purposes but nevertheless so as not to do or occasion by the carrying out of any of such purposes any unnecessary damage to the land hereby demised or any buildings or works thereon and making compensation for such damage as may be done or occasioned by the carrying out of the same And also reserving and excepting unto our subjects and people in the said colony the public use of all such parts of the said land as shall from time to time be proclaimed as or otherwise become either a main or district road or other public highway or thoroughfare To have and to hold the said land and premises unto the said lessees their executors administrators and licensed assigns from the day of the date hereof for and during the full term of \_\_\_\_\_ years thence next ensuing and fully to be completed and ended to the intent that the same land and premises shall be used as \_\_\_\_\_ and for no other purpose whatsoever Yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year during the said term the yearly rent of \_\_\_\_\_ by equal quarterly payments of \_\_\_\_\_

in advance on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ and the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ in each year the first payment to be made on the day of the date hereof and all such payments to be made without any deduction or abatement whatsoever

And the said lessees for themselves their heirs executors administrators and assigns do hereby covenant with Her Majesty her heirs and successors in manner following that is to say That the said lessees their executors administrators or assigns shall and will well and truly pay or cause to be paid the yearly rent hereby reserved upon the days and times hereinbefore appointed for the payment of the same free and clear from all deductions and abatements whatsoever And shall and will during the same term bear pay and discharge all and all manner of taxes rates duties charges assessments and impositions whatsoever whether the same be payable by landlord or tenant or partly by each in respect of the land and premises hereby demised and shall and will use the said land and premises hereby demised for the purpose aforesaid and for no other purpose whatsoever And also shall and will furnish when required during the said term to the Governor of the said colony or the Registrar-General for the time being such returns particulars and statistics of the operations theretofore carried on or to be carried on upon the said land and the results thereof as such Governor or Registrar-General may from time to time in that behalf require accompanied by a statutory declaration of the truth and correctness thereof And also that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty her heirs successors and assigns or her or their servants and agents or the servants and officers of the Board of Land and Works of the Colony of Victoria at all proper and seasonable times during the said term without any interruption or disturbance from the said lessees their executors administrators or assigns agents workmen or servants to enter into and upon the said land works and premises hereby demised or any part thereof to view and examine the state and condition thereof And also shall and will make such arrangements for the prevention of nuisance and for the observance of decency and adopt such sanitary measures generally as the Governor in Council may from time to time approve of or require And also that if the said lessees their executors administrators or assigns shall fail at any time during the said term to use the said land and premises for the purpose aforesaid these presents shall be voidable and the said term may be determined as hereinafter provided And further that the said lessees their executors administrators or licensed assigns shall not nor will assign set over mortgage charge or otherwise part with or encumber this present Indenture of Lease or the premises hereby demised or any part or parts thereof unto any person or persons whomsoever without the consent in writing of the Governor of the said colony or other person or persons authorized for the time being to grant leases of Crown lands for the purpose for which the said land has been hereby demised under his or their hand or seal or hands and seals obtained And it is hereby declared that these presents are upon this express condition that the lessee his executors administrators or assigns shall not be entitled, to any valuation or compensation for any improvements effected on the said land and premises or to any renewal of this lease Provided also and it is hereby expressly declared and agreed and these presents are upon this express condition that if the said lessees their executors administrators or assigns shall at any time during the continuance of this demise fail to use the demised land and premises *bonâ fide* for the purpose aforesaid or shall use the same for any other purpose or if and whenever any part of the rent hereby reserved shall be in arrear for one week whether the same shall have been demanded or not or if and whenever there shall be a breach of any of the covenants conditions and provisions hereinbefore contained by the lessees their executors administrators or assigns then and in such case it shall thereupon be lawful for the Governor in Council to declare this lease to be forfeited and then Her Majesty her heirs and successors or assigns by her or their agents or officers authorized by the Governor in Council for that purpose or any bailiff of Crown lands may enter forthwith into and upon the said demised premises and repossess and enjoy the same as fully and effectually as if these presents had not been made and executed And it is hereby agreed and declared that in any such case it shall be lawful for Her Majesty her heirs successors or assigns and her or their agents or officers authorized as aforesaid and any bailiff of Crown lands without any demand whatsoever to enter upon the said land hereby demised and the said lessees and all persons claiming under them for ever to expel and remove therefrom without any legal process whatsoever and as effectually as any sheriff might do in case Her Majesty her heirs successors or assigns had obtained judgment in ejectment for recovery of possession thereof and a writ of *habere facias possessionem* or other process had issued on such judgment directed to such sheriff in due form of law and then in case of such entry and any action being brought or other proceedings taken for the same by any person whomsoever the defendants to such action may plead leave and license in bar thereof and these presents shall be conclusive evidence that all events had happened and all conditions were fulfilled and all times elapsed necessary to entitle the Governor in Council to declare this lease forfeited and that this lease had been declared forfeited as hereinbefore provided and of the leave and license of the said lessees their executors administrators or assigns and all persons claiming under them or any of them to Her Majesty her heirs successors and assigns and to such agent or officer so authorized as aforesaid and to any bailiff of Crown lands and all persons acting therein by her or their or any of their order for the entry or trespass or other matters to be complained of in such action or other proceeding.

In testimony whereof Her Majesty hath caused this grant to be sealed with the seal of the said colony and His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT

CANTERBURY Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said colony at Melbourne has heretofore set his hand and the said lessees have heretofore set their hands and seals the day and year first herein written.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights issued on or before the 1st day of September 1871 must obtain renewed Rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up on the 2nd\* day of September next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old Right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed Right will bear the same number, and will be in the form and tenor, as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the New Roll in October next.
