## TOWN OF CORINELLA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a town the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, to be designated by the name prefixed to the description, viz. :-

TOWN OF CORINELLA.—Commencing on the eastern shore of Western Port Bay, at a point on a line formed by the prolongation of the north boundary of suburban allotment 71, parish of Corinella; thence N. 89° 33' E. thirty-three chains, more or less, to a point bearing S. 0° 27' E. from the south-west angle of suburban allotment 64; thence N. 0° 27' W. eighty-five chains, more or less, to the shore of Western Port Bay aforesaid; and thence by that shore bearing westerly and south-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.F.13384.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or add to (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

GLENPATRICK GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Glenpatrick Goldfield Common, proclaimed on the 28th day of January 1861, and increased by a Proclamation bearing date the 11th day of May 1863, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz. :-Commencing at the north-west angle of the existing common; thence S. 35° W. 135 chains, more or less, to the north boundary of allotment 8, of section K, parish of Eversley; thence by that allotment bearing east to the Glenpatrick Creek; thence up that creek to the west boundary of the existing common; and thence by that boundary bearing north to the point of commencement. Area available for commonage, about 300 acres.—(72.F.6545.)

HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.—The Horsham Town Common, proclaimed on the 10th day of November 1863, and increased by the several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 6th day of November 1865, the 22nd day of October 1866, and the 27th day of May 1867, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz. :-Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 4, parish of Horsham; thence south sixty-seven chains forty-two links; thence east seventy-three chains, to the north-west angle of allotment 26, parish of Bungalally; thence south forty chains, west forty-one chains, and south

one hundred chains; thence west forty-three chains, more or less, to the boundary between the South Brighton run and the Wonwondah run; thence by that boundary north-westerly fifty chains, more or less, to the boundary between the last-named run and the Walmer run; thence by that boundary south-westerly one hundred and four chains, more or less, to the Mackenzie River; thence down that river to a point bearing south from the south-west angle of allotment 2; thence north one hundred and fifty chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 3, parish of Horsham; and thence N. 89° 36' E. one hundred and fifty-nine chains ninety-seven links, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, about 3,300 acres.—(72.F.12333.)

MARYBOROUGH GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Maryborough Goldfield Common, proclaimed on the 6th day of April 1868, and increased by a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of January 1870, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz. :-Commencing on the south-eastern side of the road from Maryborough to Avoca at the point where it is intersected by the west boundary of the existing common; thence by that boundary bearing south two hundred and twenty-eight chains, more or less, to the north boundary of the Amherst Goldfield Common; thence by that common bearing west one hundred chains, more or less, and south fifty-three chains, more or less, to the road from Talbot to Bung Bong; thence by that road bearing north-westerly one hundred chains, more or less, to the Bung Bong Farmers' Common; thence by that common bearing north one hundred chains, more or less, to the first-mentioned road; and thence by that road bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. ## AUSTRALIA—QUEENSLAND—PORT CURTIS.

*Light on the Oyster Rock.*

THE Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice that a light, reflected from the shore, is exhibited from a beacon on Oyster Rock, off Gatcombe Head, entrance of Port Curtis.

The light appears as a fixed white light, visible from S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., by west, to N.W. by N., and almost continuous from N. by E. to E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.; it is elevated 18 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

The beacon is 21 feet high, and painted red.  
N.B.—When within a mile of the rock, the eye must be raised to the level of the light to obtain its full power.

The light kept open, bearing S.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., clears the rocks and buoy off Settlement Point, and when in one with Gatcombe Head light, bearing N. by E., clears the Junction buoy.

*Directions.*—To enter the port, steer W.S.W., as formerly for the red light on Gatcombe Head until the north-east shore of Facing Island is shut out by East Point. Then alter course and steer with the Oyster Rock light about a point on the starboard bow, and pass within a cable of the rock.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation  $8\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  Easterly in 1872.

## TORRES STRAIT—GREAT NORTH-EAST CHANNEL.

*Sunken Rock near Saddle Island.*

THE Colonial Government of Queensland has given notice of the discovery of a sunken rock near the fairway track in the Great North-east Channel, Torres Strait.

The rock is described as being about 20 yards in diameter, with 6 feet water over it at low water. It lies E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles from Saddle Island. Position, lat.  $10^{\circ} 10' 30''$  S., long.  $142^{\circ} 42' 30''$  E.

*Note.*—To avoid this danger, vessels, after passing Bet Island, should haul well to the southward, giving Saddle Island a wide berth before steering for Ninepin Rock, which latter is steep-to and may be passed on either hand.

## AUSTRALIA—VICTORIA—PORT PHILLIP.

*Green Light on Portarlington Jetty.*

THE Colonial Government of Victoria has given notice that, from the 1st March 1872, a green light, visible from W. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. round by south to S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., would be exhibited on Portarlington Jetty, elevated 22 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 5 miles.

*Note.*—The light in sight clears the north side of Prince George Bank to the east, and the buoy of Point Richards to the west.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation—Torres Strait  $5^{\circ}$ , Port Phillip  $8\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ —easterly in 1872.

## DESIGNS FOR LAYING OUT THE LANDS AROUND GOVERNMENT HOUSE.

DESIGNS are hereby invited, and will be received up to 30th September next, for laying out and improving the Crown Lands comprising the site of Government House, now in course of erection, and the adjoining Park lands.

Intending competitors will be supplied, on application at the Public Plan Room, Crown Lands Office, Melbourne, with a plan, drawn to scale, showing the position of contour lines on the land to be laid out and improved, and will be furnished with copy of the conditions subject to which designs will be received addressed as therein directed.

## CONDITIONS.

A premium of £50 will be awarded by the Government for the best design for laying out and improving the land comprising the site of the new Government House, now in course of erection, and the adjoining Park land, subject to the following conditions:—

1. Each intending competitor will be supplied with a map on a scale of 132 feet to one inch, showing the position of contour lines, five feet vertically equidistant, on the land to be laid out and improved, to which scale the design must be drawn.

2. In the design a portion of ground, about sixty acres in extent, to include the residence, court-yards, carriage stand, flower garden, orchard, kitchen garden, lawn, croquet and archery ground, site for one fountain, and site for one conservatory, must be laid out with a view to the private use by His Excellency the Governor and his household; to comprise also some park land, whereon any young trees, standing in clumps or alone, will have to be protected, so as to admit of such park land being used for the grazing thereon of horses and cows belonging to His Excellency's establishment.

3. The remainder of the land must be laid out with the object of admitting the general public thereto as park and pleasure ground during a portion of each day; and one of the most important features desired in the design will be the improvement of the swampy ground and old excavations between the Yarra and the foot of the hill, by the formation of a lake to contain islands, or by such or other means as competitors may deem expedient to adopt in their respective designs.

**SUTTON GRANGE CEMETERY.**

**R**ULES made by the Trustees of the Sutton Grange Cemetery.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is open.
- Any person making a vault, or erecting or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the consent of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever, from the date of such permission being given.
- Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees, and certificate, in the form of Schedule B, will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the proper charges.
- All charges will be remitted in the case of poor persons being buried in the cemetery, on the certificate of a justice of the peace, under section 9 of Act No. 310, that the relatives and friends of deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges, and in all such cases the grave shall be dug by or at the expense of such parties, under the supervision of the trustees.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or graves will be required to construct them under the directions of the trustees.
- Any person wishing to make an interment in any private grave or vault must obtain the consent, in writing, of the owner thereof, which must be submitted to the trustees on making the application for interment.
- All monuments, grave-stones, vaults, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- Every vault or brick grave containing any coffin or coffins to be securely covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, iron, or good sound red gum planking, or other durable material, approved of by the trustees.
- The plans of all monuments and fences to be submitted to the trustees, and any tomb, epiph, or monument objected to will not be permitted to be erected.
- A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application to the secretary.
- The procession to be at the cemetery at the time fixed for the funeral, which time must be punctually observed.
- All funerals must take place between the hours of 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- For adults all graves to be at least 7 feet deep, and for children under 12 years, 5 feet.
- The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations, or of adding new ones.
