EXHIBITIONS.

Amended Rules for the Distribution of a Special Vote of Parliament for Exhibitions open to Pupils of Common Schools in Victoria.

In January of each year, the Board of Education will award exhibitions to eight scholars of Common Schools in Victoria, in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Until January 1875, exhibitors will be selected as directed in the rules bearing date September 1871. In January 1875, and subsequently, they will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of the preceding year. No competitor will be permitted to attend the examination who will have completed his fifteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall at the same date have been during the two years immediately preceding continuously on the rolls of and in attendance at any of the Common Schools of Victoria.

2. The subjects of examination shall be:—

Spelling from Dictation.

Composition.

Penmanship.

Arithmetic.

Grammar.

Geography.

Euclid.

Algebra.

Latin or French.

3. Each exhibition shall be of the annual value of £35, tenable for six years upon the following conditions:—

- (A.) That the exhibitor shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the exhibition, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools:—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne, or in the Church of England Grammar School of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may hereafter be approved of by the Board.
- (B.) The Board shall, after having learned the wish of the exhibitor's parents or guardians, determine as to which of the above schools he shall attend, and during the time he continues to attend such school, he shall obtain at the end of each year a favorable report from the authorities of the same. If an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Board shall be satisfied that the conduct of any exhibitor has been disorderly or immoral, they may terminate his tenure of the exhibition and of all the advantages connected therewith.
- (C.) That at the end of the second year of his tenure he shall pass the Matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne.
- (D.) That during the fourth, fifth, and sixth years of his tenure he shall be a Student of the Melbourne University, enrolled as attending lectures; and that he shall in each year have kept as many courses of

lectures as would have entitled him to admission to examination under 3rd clause, chapter XI, of the Regulations of the University.

(E.) That at the end of the fourth year of his tenure he shall pass the first B.A. degree examination at the University.

(F.) It will not be compulsory upon exhibitors to become boarders in the schools; but if they should elect to become so, they will be received at the rate of £17 10s. per annum, to be paid by the exhibitor, in addition to the £35 per annum payable by the Board. Should they attend as day-scholars only, residing with their friends, the Board will pay £10 per annum to the authorities of the school, and the balance of the annual value of the exhibition—namely, £25—to parents or guardians of the exhibitor.

(G.) In each case payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Board shall be conditional on moneys being placed at their disposal by the Legislature.

4. These rules shall take effect from the 1st February 1873.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Shires Statute* (83 Vict. No. 358, § 334), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the complaint of the Council of the Shire of Rosedale, and pursuant to an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, do hereby proclaim the portion of the Main Central road between the south boundary of the township of Longford and the Flooding Creek to be a Common-toll road of the said Shire of Rosedale and the Shire of Avon.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for departing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

DUNNEWORTHY AGRICULTURAL AREA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Dunneworthy Agricultural Area Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 21st day of December 1868, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 49, parish of Dunneworthy; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and twenty chains, more or less, to the summit of the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range northerly and south-easterly to the north boundary of allotment 50; thence by that allotment bearing west ten chains, more or less, to the north-west angle thereof; thence again by that allotment and by allotment 49 aforesaid bearing south two miles to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 2500 acres.—(72.G.15344.)
