# CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., WITHIN CERTAIN AREAS; PROHIBITED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall do the acts hereby prohibited on Crown lands comprised within the areas hereinafter referred to or described, that is to say:—

EAGLEHAWK (six miles circle).—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground, are of less diameter than six inches, nor remove bark from such trees, on or from any Crown lands lying within six miles of the Post Office in the borough of Eaglehawk.—(72.G.19687.)

SANDHURST (six miles circle).—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground, are of less diameter than six inches, nor remove bark from such trees, on or from any Crown Lands lying within six miles of the Post Office in the city of Sandhurst.—(72.F.17255.)

YAN YEAN WATERSHED AREA.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any live timber or bark on or from the portion of the watershed area of the Yan Yean reservoir lying between the crest of the range which forms the northern boundary of that area and a line running parallel with and two miles from that crest.—(72.F.20673.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made

for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

YEA COMMON.—Allotment 12, part of allotment 13, and allotment 51, in the parish of Yea, comprising an area of seven hundred and forty-two acres, more or less, shall be and constitute a common, to be designated the "Yea" Common.—(71.B.5831.)

# PROPOSED ATTACHMENT OF PART OF THE SHIRE OF GLENELG TO THE SHIRE OF WANNON.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Shires Statute 1869*, sections 22 and 29, that certain persons, stated to be a majority of the ratepayers of the part of the Shire of Glenelg hereinafter described, have by petition under their hands prayed the Governor that such part be severed from such shire and be attached to the Shire of Wannon.

The part is described by metes and bounds in the said petition as follows:—Commencing at the Tahara bridge, on the River Wannon; thence bounded by the present boundary of the Wannon shire to the north-west angle of the parish of Tarrayoukyan; then on the west by the western boundary line of the said parish of Tarrayoukyan; again on the west by a line bearing southerly through the parish of Dewrang from the south-west angle of the said parish of Tarrayoukyan to the south-west angle of allotment four of section fourteen of the said parish of Dewrang; then on the south by the southern boundary line of the said allotment to the south-east angle thereof; again on the west by the road leading southerly and south-easterly from the last-mentioned angle through the parish of Bruk-bruk to the southern boundary line of the said parish of Bruk-bruk; thence by the road bearing southerly and south-westerly from the last-mentioned point through the parish of Carapook to the main road from Melbourne to Adelaide; again on the south-west by the said main road to the most easterly angle of allotment B of section seven, parish of Carapook; again on the west and south-west by the road leading from the last-mentioned angle to the most easterly angle of allotment A of section eleven, parish of Carapook; then by the road running south-westerly to the River Wannon; and then by the River Wannon to the starting point at Tahara bridge.

## DRY DOCK OF FORT-DE-FRANCE.

## Informations.

The dock of Fort-de-France is constructed with freestone and shut by an iron gate. It is 129 meters long from the external groove of the gate to the wall forming the opposite extremity.

The flood-gate of entrance is 26 meters wide at the mean level of the sea.

The height of water above the apron is 8m60 at the mean level of the sea.

The dock can therefore hold vessels having a length of deck from 115 to 120 meters, and a breadth, out of the paddle-boxes, of 25 meters, and a draught of 8m50.

According to the tariffs existing at Martinico the duty for temporary anchorage, during three days only, in each harbor of the colony, and for calling at a port upon a forced put, whatever may be the duration of the stay, is fixed as follows:—

Per French or foreign vessel coming from France, French possessions, or foreign countries, 11 francs, to the exclusion of all other duties.

A ship coming to Fort-de-France solely to get repaired in the dock is assimilated to a ship calling at port upon a forced put, if the said ship makes no commercial transaction during her stay. The selling of goods damaged at sea is not considered as a commercial transaction involving the payment of duties of navigation and accessory taxes other than the duty of calling at port.

*Extracts of an Ordinance for regulating the service of the Dry Dock of Fort-de-France.*

Art. 2nd. The colony of Martinico, proprietor of the dock of Fort-de-France, undertakes no work to be done to ships; the administration let only the dock dried up to the consignees, captains, and shipbuilders, wishing to make use of it for repairing or visiting ships, at their own risks and perils.

Art. 3rd. The tariff of letting of the dock is fixed as follows for sailing vessels and steamers:—

1° Entry into the dock per ton, three francs and fifty centimes.

2° For each day of stay in the dock dried up per ton, ninety centimes.

Art. 4th. The real burden of ships shall be determined by the means of the gauge admitted by the French custom-house without deduction, in case of steamers, for the room occupied by the boilers, coal closets, and engines.

No ships shall pay for less than 200 tons whatever may be her burden.

In case several ships come at the same time into the dock they shall be considered as one ship only having a burden equal to the sum of their burdens.

Art. 5th. The ships may come into the dock, light or with cargo, without increase in the price for those that keep in or on board the whole or a part of their cargo.

Art. 10th. No ship can come into the dock or go out before sunrise or after sunset, unless in case of extreme urgency. The workings for entering or going out effected in the night shall be paid at a price double of this fixed by the tariff.

Art. 11th. Sundays and holidays shall not be paid for if work is not accomplished in the dock.

Art. 13th. The towings, when the ship enters the dock or when she goes out, shall be paid by the owner. The directions of the harbor-master shall be followed for the execution of these workings.

Art. 14th. Every ship coming into the dock must inform beforehand the harbor-master if she intends to apply to the direction of the dock for shoring her, or if she desires to accomplish this operation with her proper means. In such a case she must have at her disposal a sufficient number of carpenters for shoring her.

The apparatuses belonging to the dock can be let at a price fixed at fifteen centimes per ton.

The use of those apparatuses shall be made under the guard of the harbor-master. The inspection of the harbor-master shall be exercised only in relation to the preservation of the implement of shoring, and it shall never result responsibility for the colony.

In case they would have the shoring done by the service of the dock, the totality of the price of the letting of apparatuses and of the expense for materials and workmanship shall be paid at the rate of one franc and fifteen centimes per ton for each ship, whatever may be the duration of the stay in the dock.

At all events the colony shall never be responsible for damages caused by the operation of stranding on the blocks, or of shoring.

Art. 20th. The crew can remain on board the ship staying in the dock, but they shall be submitted to the police of the establishment.

Art. 24th. Every agent or consignee, as well as the ship, are responsible for the payment of the sums due.
