ROBBERIES AND MURDER AT WOORAGEE.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about Half-past Seven in the evening of Tuesday the 15th of October instant the house of Dominick Mitchell, farmer, at Wooragee, Beechworth, was visited by two armed men, who took from the inmates the musket described below along with some ammunition: And whereas the same men then proceeded to the house of Henry

Gale, postmaster, Wooragee, where they obtained some ammunition and a few shillings: And whereas they next went to the hotel of John Watt, Wooragee, and on the door being opened by him they ordered him to hail up and come outside, but on his turning and running towards the kitchen one of the men fired at him, inflicting a wound of which he died on the 25th instant: And whereas John Kennedy was at the same time wounded in the arm, but not seriously: And whereas certain men are now in custody charged with the offences above described, and additional evidence is required to complete the identification of one of them: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the perpetrators of the offences above described.

PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

One of the offenders is described as aged 20 or 25, 5 feet 10 inches high, with fresh complexion and smart built. He wore an old dark sunburnt pilot-cloth coat with raised seam, torn on the back near the collar, very short dirty trousers (supposed to be moleskin) with a patch about six inches long on each knee, and an old dirty black hat.

The other offender is described as of an age not known, 5 feet 6 or 7 inches high, with awkward gait. He wore dark moleskin trousers and a dark wideawake.

The musket taken from the house of Dominick Mitchell is described as a long-barrelled german musket with a brass trigger and sight, iron stock-plate fixed on with two coarse screws, the small part of the stock encircled with small cord, wooden ramrod with copper ferrule at one end and fine screw at the other.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c.; &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of; and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

BEAUFORT, RAGLAN, CHARLTON, AND EGAMBEEN UNITED GOLDFIELD AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The Beaufort, Raglan, Charlton, and Egambeen United Goldfield and Farmers' Common, proclaimed on the 21st day of April 1870, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of the town of Raglan; thence by the existing common bearing N. 54° E. two hundred and eight chains, more or less, to the Waterloo Swamp; thence by the western margin of that swamp northerly to the Trawalla Creek; thence up that creek to a point on a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of the land licensed to James Craswellar; thence by that line and the said boundary of that land bearing west twenty-five chains ninety-four links; thence by the west boundary of that land bearing north thirty-nine chains twelve links; thence by a line bearing

S. 55° 50' W. sixty-seven chains ninety-two links to the north-east angle of the land licensed to David Troy; thence by that land and by the lands licensed to David Kerr, Jas. Robinson, and Alexr. Hutton, to the crest of the watershed which divides Duncan's Gully from Fiery Creek; thence by that crest southerly to the north boundary of the aforesaid town of Raglan; and thence by that boundary bearing east fifty-three chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, about 3100 acres.—(72.F.9043.)

PUBLIC STREETS IN THE BOROUGHS OF EAGLEHAWK AND SMYTHESDALE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are hereinafter described, but subject to all existing rights under *The Mining Statute* 1865, that is to say:—

Streets in the Borough of Eaglehawk, with the names, total widths, and limits thereof.

Murchison street, 66 feet, from Letheby's road to Lester street. Thomas street, 66 feet, from Tailings street to Upper California Gully road. As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.E.7928.)

Street in the Borough of Smythesdale, with the name, total width, and limits thereof.

Verdon street (extension), 99 feet, from Wills street to Bishop street; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.G.7410.)

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part

shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above recited Act has been extended amongst others to the Shire of Bairnsdale by a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December 1869: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the fourteenth day of October in the present year the said shire has been constituted two separate shires, designated respectively the Shire of Bairnsdale and the Shire of Omeo: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. of the recited Act to the Shire of Bairnsdale, as now constituted, and also to the new Shire of Omeo: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned, whereby Part II. of the recited Act was extended to the Shire of Bairnsdale, and do revoke so much of such Proclamation as extends Part II. aforesaid to the said shire; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the respective shires hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE,

THE SHIRE OF OMEO.

MAFFRA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

ALL charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

3. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form contained in schedule B, will be granted to the person applying on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges for interment will be remitted on evidence being produced satisfactory to the trustees that the relatives or friends of applicant are unable to pay. This has no reference to digging the grave.

5. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery between the hours of Seven o'clock a.m. and Seven o'clock p.m. of the day previous to interment; the instructions to be in the form set forth in schedule A.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or other graves will be required to construct them under the directions of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. When giving the order for interment a form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable, and entered in the interment book.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

9. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, iron, slate, or good blue or red gum planking.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the said Statute to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13. Wooden or other fences, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owners.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected.

16. That no interments take place on Sundays, excepting in cases where a medical certificate is obtained to show the necessity.

17. By the 35th section of the said Statute any person wilfully or wantonly destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, or erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanour, and liable, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, to a fine of Twenty pounds sterling or imprisonment for three months.

18. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make any alteration from time to time in the charges and regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton before Four o'clock p.m. on the previous day, if not an extra charge will be made.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for interments will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Five p.m., except on

Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

4. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

5. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying on payment of the proper charges.

6. All charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

8. That the managing sexton shall receive all fees which may from time to time accrue from interments or other sources, to be held by him in trust to be delivered to the trustees at their quarterly meetings.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked up and covered with a slab of stone, slate, iron, or brick, to the satisfaction of the trustees.

10. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences to be submitted to the trustees for approval; and any tomb, epitaph, or monument objected to will not be permitted to be erected.

11. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to any vault, monument, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, or otherwise infringing the Act of Council relating to the cemetery or the regulations for the protection of the same, will be proceeded against according to the provisions of the Statute.

12. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept and may be inspected.

14. The name, age, denomination, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

15. No bodies to be removed after interment under any pretence whatever without the sanction of at least three of the trustees.

16. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
