CUTTING OR REMOVING PINE TREES OF A CERTAIN DIAMETER AND WITHIN A SPECIFIED AREA PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license

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granted under the authority of this Part of this Act: And whereas by divers Proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, issued under *The Land Act 1862*, and the above-recited Act, the cutting or removing Murray Pine Trees on or from the Crown lands described in such Proclamations is prohibited; and it is expedient to modify the prohibition in manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamations above referred to, which bear date respectively the sixteenth day of November 1863, the twenty-seventh day of June 1870, and the eighth and twenty-second days of August 1870, prohibiting the cutting or removing Murray Pine Trees on or from the Crown lands specified in such Proclamations, so far as they affect or relate to trees which are not of less diameter than ten inches; and with the advice aforesaid I do declare that the cutting of such trees shall be restricted to holders of special licenses issued by the Board of Land and Works to cut the same, and that the Crown lands referred to in the above-mentioned Proclamations are comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say: Commencing at the junction of the Loddon River with the Murray River; thence up the Loddon River to a point on a line running parallel with and ten miles from the Murray River; thence by that line south-easterly and easterly to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the Broken River; thence up that river to the North-Eastern Railway; thence by that railway north-easterly to the Owens River; thence down that river to a point on a line running parallel with and ten miles from the Murray River; thence by that line easterly and south-easterly to the boundary line between Victoria and New South Wales; thence by that line north-westerly to the source of the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.F.21141.)

PART OF THE BROADFORD ROAD DISTRICT ATTACHED TO THE YEA ROAD DISTRICT AND TO THE SEYMOUR RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-eighth day of October 1872.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, of if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, the Broadford Road District was constituted: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the twenty-eighth day of February in the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two the boundaries of the Yea Road District and of the Seymour Riding of the Shire of Seymour were altered and redefined: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Broadford Road District therein described and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this present Order, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth sever a part of the Broadford Road District from such district, and doth hereby direct that the portion so severed from such district shall be attached as hereunder described to the Road District of Yea and the Seymour Riding of the Shire of Seymour: And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the altered boundaries of the said Broadford Road District and Yea Road District, and of the Seymour Riding of the said Shire of Seymour in manner following, that is to say:—

THE BROADFORD ROAD DISTRICT REDUCED.—Starting at the boundary of Bourke County true south of the south-east angle of Linton's pre-emptive right; thence direct to that angle and by Sunday Creek and the boundary of and including Broadford parish to the south-east angle of Lewry parish; thence true east to a point true south of the south-east angle of Wrough pre-emptive right; thence true north to the Yea and Tallarook road; thence by the Yea and Tallarook road south-easterly to its intersection with the Narrangeamong Creek; thence southerly up the Narrangeamong and Kingparrot creeks, excluding portions 58 to 77 Flowerdale parish, and by the boundaries of and excluding portions 5, 4, and 3, Kinglake parish, and by the boundaries of Evelyn and Bourke counties to the starting point.

THE YEA ROAD DISTRICT ENLARGED.—Beginning in the parish of Kinglake, in the centre of the road on the crest of the Dividing Range due south of the south-west angle of allotment 3A; thence northerly to and along the western boundaries of allotments 3A, 4 and 5, parish of Kinglake, and the Kingparrot and Narrangeamong creeks to the intersection of the Narrangeamong Creek by the road from Yea to Tallarook; thence by the centre of that road northerly and westerly one mile twenty-eight chains; thence due north to a point due south of the south-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence north to and by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section and a straight line to meet a tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence by the course of the said tributary of Hughes' Creek to its intersection with the southern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section; thence easterly, northerly, and westerly by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of the northern boundary by the said tributary; thence northerly by that tributary to the southern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive right; thence westerly by the southern boundary, northerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section to the intersection of its northern boundary by the said tributary, and northerly by the said tributary to its junction with Hughes' Creek, being the Anglesey county boundary; thence easterly along the county boundary to a point due north of the mouth of the Home Creek; thence due south to the River Goulburn; thence by that river and south to the north-west boundary of the Wanregarwen run; thence south-easterly by the boundary of the Wanregarwen and Riversdale runs to the Acheron River; thence up that river to a point

due west of the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Granton; thence N. 24° E. to a point on the crest of the Dividing Range at Mount Saint Leonard; thence westerly to the commencing point.

THE SEYMOUR RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR ENLARGED.—Commencing at a point two miles west of the north-west angle of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive right; thence east to the said north-west angle, and further east by the northern boundary of the said section and a direct line to a point due south of the south-east angle of Jones' pre-emptive right; thence north to and by the eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive right to the southern boundary of the township of Avenel reserve; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said township reserve to Hughes' Creek; thence up that creek to its junction with a tributary north of the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section; thence southerly by that tributary to its intersection with the said northern boundary; thence westerly by the northern boundary, southerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the southern boundary to the intersection of the said southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to the northern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section; thence easterly by the northern boundary, southerly by the eastern boundary, and westerly by the southern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of its southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to a point due north of the north-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line south to the said north-west angle, and further south by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section to the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly by the Goulburn River to a point about (1½) one and a half miles below the junction of the Narrangeamong Creek and north of a point one mile twenty-eight chains on the road from Yea to Tallarook west of its intersection with Narrangeamong Creek; thence due south to that road and north-westerly by the said road to a point due south of the eastern boundary of Wrough pre-emptive section; thence due north to the Goulburn River and by the Goulburn River north-westerly to the Sugarloaf Creek; thence by the said creek south-westerly to a point due south of the commencing point; and thence by a line north to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Engineer-in-Chief of Railways, or other officer authorized as aforesaid, may order that the galleries, drives, ways, passages, &c., be stowed if necessary, or may order that such masonry or other works of art be made and erected at the cost of the said John Dickinson and party as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface or as a precaution against any contingent damage to the railway; and thereupon the said John Dickinson and party shall cause the work so ordered to be well and truly done with all reasonable speed.

5. Previous to occupying any portion of the said land the said John Dickinson and party shall deposit in the hands of the Receiver and Paymaster at Castlemaine the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, as a guarantee that they will observe and fulfil these conditions, such deposit to be retained until the said persons shall relinquish the land described in the schedule and discontinue mining operations; and if the said conditions,

restrictions, and regulations shall then have been observed and fulfilled, the said deposit shall be returned to the depositors, but if any of them shall not then have been fulfilled, or observed, then the whole, or such part of the sum so deposited as aforesaid as the Governor in Council shall think fit, shall by an Order of the Governor in Council be declared forfeited, and shall thereupon become public money, and be applied accordingly.

6. In case any person or persons employed in the mining operations hereby authorized shall in any way violate any of the above conditions, it shall not be lawful for him or them any longer to mine under, upon, or within the said land, or to continue in any way to occupy the same; and the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge whether or not any condition has been violated.

7. The Commissioner of Railways and Roads, or any person authorized by him in writing, shall have at any time power to order the immediate discontinuance of any mining operations within or under any part of the said land, whether the above conditions shall have been observed or not, and the mining operations shall thereupon be immediately discontinued; and an order in writing served on, any one of the miners, or a written order posted on any part of the land described in the schedule, shall be sufficient notice.

8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke this Order.

SCHEDULE ABOVE REFERRED TO.

All those two pieces or parcels of land in the colony of Victoria, county of Talbot, township of Castlemaine, in the mining district of Castlemaine, and containing by admeasurement in the aggregate one acre and thirty perches, be the same more or less:

AVOCA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT AVOCA.

ALL charges must be paid to the secretary when the orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.

2. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. of the day previous to the interment, and certificate of registration produced.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

6. The charges will be reduced for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, subject to the approval of the trustees, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept and may be inspected.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Cemeteries Statute.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

19. No grave to be of a less depth than eight feet.
