By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of previous proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth day of September and the eleventh day of December 1871, whereby amongst others the shire of Goulburn and the Kangerong road district were constituted districts within which Licensing Magistrates might grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which should be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

TOWN OF HADDON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria; provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to diminish or extend the area of any county or to alter the boundaries or name of any county, and to add the territory taken away from one county to any other adjacent county, and to divide any county into two or more counties and to give to each a distinguishing name: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish such Town by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

TOWN OF HADDON:

Commencing at the junction of the southern side of the road from Carngham to Ballarat with the north-western side of the road from Ballarat to Smythesdale; thence by the last-named road bearing south-westerly to the south angle of allotment 12 of section 32, parish of Smythesdale; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and thirty chains, more or less, to a line formed by the prolongation of the east side of the road which forms the west boundary of section 6, parish of Haddon; thence by that line and road bearing north three hundred and

twenty-eight chains, more or less, to the road which forms the southern boundary of the parish of Windermere; thence by that road and the prolongation thereof bearing north-easterly and east to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Cardigan; thence by sections 1, 2, and 8 bearing south one hundred and eighty-nine chains seventy-four links, east forty chains, south twenty-four chains fifty-two links, and east seven chains seventy links to the road from Ballarat to Smythesdale aforesaid; and thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.G.21186.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Town hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE TOWNSHIP OF BEVERIDGE.*

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or add to (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

KARABEL AGRICULTURAL AREA TEMPORARY COMMON.—The Karabel Agricultural Area Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of July 1868, is

hereby increased by adding thereto the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described: Commencing at the south-east angle of Mary Cox's licensed land, in the parish of Geerak; thence by that land, by Rosanna Cox's land, and by a line bearing north one hundred and ten chains seventy-six links to R. Ahearn's land; thence by that land and by that of R. Lawlor and T. A. C. Forbes bearing east six chains seventy-three links, north seventy-nine chains fifty links, west nine chains twenty-six links, and north sixty-four chains seventy-four links; thence by lines bearing respectively east one hundred and sixty-three chains ninety-eight links, and south two hundred and fifty-five chains; and thence by a road bearing west one hundred and sixty-one chains to the commencing point. Area, 4080 acres.—(72.E.13187.)

PETERBOROUGH COMMON.—The land comprised within the surveyed township reserve of Peterborough, exclusive of the town allotments, shall be and constitute a common, to be designated the Peterborough Common. Area, 950 acres, more or less.—(72.G.6380.)

WARRENBAYNE COMMON.—The allotments and parts of allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, together with the portion of land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter defined, shall be and constitute a Common, to be designated the Warrenbayne Common, viz.:—

Parish of Samaria, allotments 140, 148, 151, and the unselected part of allotment 152;

Parish of Warrenbayne, allotments 105, 106, and 107, and the unselected parts of allotments 64, 108, 109, 110, 113, 114, 118, 119, and 121; and

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 20) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall have received a petition, signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names shall appear upon some voters' roll for a shire or any one or more ridings thereof, setting forth that by reason of the great extent of such shire or remoteness of the part wherein such petitioners reside from other parts thereof, and of the diversity of the industry and interests of such part from those of the remainder thereof (of the truth of which allegations and the grounds thereof the Governor alone shall judge), it is expedient to constitute the two parts of such shire so differently affected two separate shires, to constitute accordingly such parts with such boundaries and under such names as shall seem fit two separate shires to be deemed proclaimed shires under the said Act, and all ridings of the shire so separated shall cease to exist: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the 15th day of April in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the shire of Bairnsdale was constituted: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the 28th day of September in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the said shire of Bairnsdale was subdivided into ridings: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by not less than twenty persons, each of whose names appears upon the voters' roll of the said Shire of Bairnsdale, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the said Act: Now therefore

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the two parts, hereinafter described, of the area hitherto constituting the Shire of Bairnsdale to be two separate shires, and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby set forth the names and boundaries of such proclaimed shires in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.—Starting at Lake Victoria, by a line up Toms Creek along the northern boundaries of the parishes of Meerleu, Yeering, and Stratford, and western and part of northern boundary of Sandy Creek run; by the western boundaries of Glenaladale and Tabberaberra runs; up the Mitchell River to the Dargo River; up the latter to a point west of Mount Birregan; to this point; up the eastern watershed of the Dargo to the Great Dividing Range; south-westerly along this range to the head of the Livingstone Creek; direct to Mount Baldhead; direct to the junction of the Tambo* River and the Back Creek; up the latter creek to its head; to Mount Bindi and up the eastern watershed of the Tambo River to the Great Dividing Range; along this range to Forest Hill; along the New South Wales boundary to the Snowy River; down this river to the Southern Ocean, and westward by the ocean and northern shore of Lakes King and Victoria to the commencing point.

7. 7.
