## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under my hand and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of July in the present year, I did, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Public Health Statute 1865* (28 Victoria No. 284), with the advice of the Executive Council, notify that the colony of New Zealand was infected with small-pox, and that it was probable such disease might be brought from any of the Ports of New Zealand to Victoria; And whereas it is expedient to revoke such Proclamation; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke my said Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of July in the present year, and do notify that vessels arriving in Victoria from any of the Ports of New Zealand, and persons and things on board thereof, shall no longer be liable to quarantine in pursuance of my said Proclamation.

## COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria,

with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**EVERSLEY FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Eversley Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of July 1872, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the west angle of the existing common, being a point on the eastern side of a two-chain road to Ararat; thence by the southern boundary of that common to the boundary between the Woodlands and the Decameron runs; thence by that boundary south-easterly to the Glenlogie run; thence by a line westerly one hundred chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of the land licensed to Charles Plant; thence by that line to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line westerly one hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to a point on the aforesaid road distant ninety chains south-westerly from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by the said road; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commonage, about 1000 acres.—(72.E.18291.)

**ROKEWOOD GOLDFIELD COMMON.**—The Rokewood Goldfield Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 28th day of January 1861, and increased by three other Proclamations dated respectively the 25th day of April 1864, the 17th day of October 1864, and the 24th day of December 1866, is hereby further increased by adding thereto 1000 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries, viz.: Commencing at the point where the north boundary of the existing common abuts on Mount Misery Creek; thence by that boundary bearing west two hundred and thirty-five chains, more or less, to a point on Illibarook Creek bearing east from the north boundary of allotment 16, parish of Mindai; thence by that creek upwards to a point east of the south boundary of Mindai pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing east about two hundred and fifty chains to the Mount Misery Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the commencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(71.A.23023.)

**ROKEWOOD UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.**—The United Town and Farmers' Common of Rokewood, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of July 1866, and increased by another Proclamation bearing date the 27th day of January 1868, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries and containing an area of 2900 acres, more or less, viz.:—Commencing at the point where the north boundary of the existing common abuts on Mount Misery Creek; thence by that boundary bearing east about three hundred and eighty chains to the west boundary of the parish of Warramine; thence by that boundary bearing north about sixty chains; thence by a line bearing west about three hundred and sixty chains to Mount Misery Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek downwards to the commencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.E.12211.)

**PUBLIC STREETS IN THE CITY OF SANDHURST  
AND BOROUGH OF SANDRRIDGE.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HILEAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the respective Councils of the City of Sandhurst and the Borough of Sandridge, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

*Street in the City of Sandhurst, with the total width and limits thereof.*

Footpath; 33 feet; from Mitchell street bearing S. 19° 20' W. to Olinda street, through the Railway reserve.—(72.E.17586.)

*Streets in the Borough of Sandridge, with the names, total widths, and limits thereof.*

Post Office place; 33 feet; from Beach street to Rouse street, west of allotments 1, 3, 4, and 5 of section 2 A.

Post Office place west; 33 feet; from Post Office place to Bay street north of allotment 8 of section 2 A.—(72.E.22589.)

**THE BOROUGH OF WALHALLA.**

**W**HILEAS by *The Boroughs Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that any part of Victoria not being wholly or in part comprised within the limits of the city of Melbourne or, save as therein provided, of the town of Geelong or any of the boroughs constituted by or under the said Act, which district shall not exceed in area nine square miles and shall have no one point in such area distant more than six miles from any other point therein, and shall contain a population of inhabitant householders not less than three hundred, may be constituted a borough in manner next hereinafter mentioned; and it is also enacted that if not less than one hundred and fifty of the inhabitant householders resident within any such last-mentioned district shall sign and cause to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him to constitute such district a borough under the said Act, and in such petition shall set forth accurately the boundaries of the district to which such petition shall refer, and if within one month of the publication as hereinafter mentioned of such petition an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district so described shall not have signed and caused to be presented to the Governor a petition praying him not to grant the prayer of such first-mentioned petition, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to constitute such district or any portion thereof a borough, by such name as in and by such Order in Council shall be assigned to the same; and it is also enacted that in every such Order in Council whereby any borough shall be constituted the name and boundaries of the borough shall be set forth, and upon the making of every such order the district therein named shall be and be deemed to be a borough within the meaning of the said Act; but no such borough shall be constituted so as to comprise any locality not included within the boundaries set forth in the petition for the

constitution thereof: And whereas notice of the petition praying the Governor to constitute a borough in the district known by the name of Walhalla has been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-third section of the said Act, and no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of inhabitant householders resident within such district, has been presented to the Governor praying His Excellency not to grant the prayer of the above-mentioned petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the part of the colony of Victoria wherein the petitioners are inhabitant householders to be a borough within the meaning of the said Act; and doth hereby set forth the name and the boundaries of such borough in manner following, that is to say:—

**THE BOROUGH OF WALHALLA.**—Commencing at a point twenty chains south of the south-west angle of allotment No. 12, section 1, township of Pearson (or Happy-go-Lucky); thence west ninety chains; thence north four miles; thence east two miles; thence south four miles; thence west seventy chains to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Goodall Francis, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HILEAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the seventh day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Shire of Lexton was divided into three ridings therein described: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the twenty-second day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Shire of Ripon was divided into three ridings therein described: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Lexton therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the part of the Shire of Lexton described in such petition from such shire, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the North Riding of the Shire of Ripon, and that the boundaries of the West and South Ridings of the said Shire of Lexton and of the North Riding of the said Shire of Ripon shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**THE WEST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF LEXTON.**—Commencing at the north-east corner of section 13, township of Lexton; thence along the Ballarat and Avoca road to the north-western corner of D. Nully's (late Hodgkinson's) pre-emptive right; thence by a line westerly to the south-west corner of the township of Crowlands; thence along the Wimmera River to the junction with the boundary of the county of Ripon; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said county to the intersection of the Beaufort and Lexton road; thence along that road to the point of commencement.

**THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF LEXTON.**—Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 10, section 12, township of Lexton; thence southerly by the Beaufort and Lexton road to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence easterly by the said county boundary to the source of the Sulky Gully Creek; thence southerly by that creek and the Irawalla Creek to the main road from Ballarat to Ararat; thence easterly by that road to the western boundary of the Shire of Ballarat; thence north by that shire's western boundary to the main Ballarat and Avoca road; thence by that road to the commencing point.

**THE NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF RIPON.**—Commencing at a point on the shore of Lake Burrumbeet due east of the north-east angle of the parish of Chepstowe; thence west to and by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Chepstowe, Lilleric, Yangerawill, Mawkwallak, and part of Mnaallaak, to a point in the northern boundary of the last-named parish due

north of the point of intersection of the telegraph line with the southern boundary of the same parish; thence due north to the Fiery Creek; thence easterly by the said creek to its junction with the Middle Creek; thence north-easterly by the Middle Creek to its intersection with the main road from Ballarat to Ararat; thence by a right line bearing north-west to the northern boundary of the county of Ripon; thence easterly by said county boundary to the source of the Suiky Gully Creek; thence southerly by that creek and the Irawalla Creek to the main road from Ballarat to Ararat; thence easterly by that road to a point north of the most northern part of Lake Burrumbeet; thence south to and southerly by the shore of said lake to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MERCHANT SHIPPING AND PASSENGER ACTS AMENDMENT.  
85 and 86 Vict., chapter 73.

An Act to amend the Merchant Shipping Acts and the Passenger Acts.—[10th August 1872.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Merchant Shipping Acts and the Passengers Acts:

Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

## PRELIMINARY.

1. *Short title.*—This Act may be cited as the Merchant Shipping Act 1872.

2. *Commencement of Act.*—This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

## MEASUREMENT OF SHIPS.

3. *Transfer to Board of Trade of duties of Commissioners of Customs with respect to measurement of ships.*—The twenty-third, twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth, and twenty-ninth sections of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854, the fourteenth section of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1855, and the fourth section of the Merchant Shipping Act 1871, shall be read and construed as if the Board of Trade were therein named instead of the Commissioners of Customs.

## REGISTRY.

4. *Transfer to Registrar-General of Seamen of duties of Commissioners of Customs with respect to registry of ships.*—The forty-sixth, fifty-fourth, ninety-second, and ninety-fourth sections of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854 shall be read and construed as if the Registrar-General of Seamen were therein named instead of the Commissioners of Customs, and the returns required to be transmitted by the said ninety-fourth section of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854 shall be transmitted to the Registrar-General of Seamen, and not to the Custom House in London, and the Registrar-General of Seamen shall be called the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen.

## PASSENGER SHIPS.

5. *Transfer to Board of Trade of powers and duties of Emigration Commissioners.*—The sixth and seventh sections of the Passengers Act 1855, except so much of the latter section as provides for the immunity of emigration officers, shall be repealed, and all powers and duties vested in or imposed on the Emigration Commissioners by the Passengers Act 1855, and the Passengers Act Amendment Act 1863, shall be transferred to and imposed on the Board of Trade.

In the construction and for the purposes of the said Acts the name of the Board of Trade shall be deemed to be substituted for the name of the Emigration Commissioners, and anything which might, if this Act had not passed, have been done by the Emigration Commissioners, whether acting independently or under the sanction or authority of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, may be done by the Board of Trade independently of such sanction or authority.

6. *Extension of penalties for offences connected with applications for assistance in emigration.*—The provisions contained in the eighty-third section of the Passengers Act 1855 shall extend to any forms of application or other papers issued by or under the authority of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, for the use of persons desirous of emigrating by his assistance, and to any certificate, document, or statement adduced in support of any application to such Secretary for such assistance.

7. *Transfer to Board of Trade of certain powers of Secretary of State under Passengers Act.*—The powers conferred by the thirteenth section of the Passengers Act Amendment Act 1863 on one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State shall be transferred to the Board of Trade.

## ANNUAL SURVEY OF PASSENGER STEAMERS.

8. *Passenger steamers to be surveyed once in every year, according to 17 & 18 Vict., c. 104.*—The three hundred and fourth section of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854 shall be repealed, and every passenger steamer shall be surveyed once at the least in every year in the manner mentioned in the fourth part of that Act. The fees to be charged for certificates issued in respect of such survey shall not exceed for a yearly certificate twice the sum named in the table marked T in the schedule to the said Act as chargeable for a six months' certificate.

## PILOTAGE.

9. *Trinity House may modify rule as to pilotage rates.*—Notwithstanding anything in the three hundred and fifty-eighth section of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854, the Trinity House may, by bye-law made with the sanction of Her Majesty in Council, repeal or relax the provisions of that section within the whole or any part of their district so far as to allow any pilot or class of pilots under their jurisdiction to demand or receive and any master to offer or pay any rate less than the rate for the time being demandable by law.

10. *Alteration of payments made to Trinity House Pilotage Fund by Cinque Port pilots.*—Whereas in pursuance of the Pilotage Law Amendment Act 1853, the several funds then belonging to the Cinque Ports pilots were merged into the common fund

called the Trinity House Pilotage Fund, and by the same Act power was given to the Trinity House of Deptford Strond, with the approval of the Board of Trade, from time to time to make regulations for altering and determining the payments and contributions to be made to the said pilotage fund by Cinque Ports pilots licensed before the said Act came into operation: And whereas by one of the regulations made under the authority of the said Act it was provided that each of the said Cinque Ports pilots should pay towards the said fund eleven shillings for each turn: And whereas it has proved that the turns have been more numerous than was expected, and that the sums paid to the Trinity House, and carried to the credit of the said fund, in respect of the said turns, have been larger than was assumed in making the calculations upon which the said regulation was based: And whereas it is expedient that in lieu of the said sum of eleven shillings per turn the fixed annual sum of thirteen pounds four shillings should for the future be paid by or in respect of each of the said pilots so long as he remains unsuperannuated, and that the excess of the sum heretofore paid in each year by each pilot over the sum of thirteen pounds four shillings should be returned: And whereas doubts have been entertained whether the purposes aforesaid can be effected without the authority of Parliament: Be it enacted that the Trinity House of Deptford Strond shall, out of the Trinity House Pilotage Fund, repay to each of the Cinque Ports pilots licensed before the Pilotage Law Amendment Act 1853 came into operation, or, if he be deceased, to his executors or administrators, the aggregate sum by which the sum of eleven shillings per turn heretofore paid by him exceeds the sum which he would have paid if he had paid thirteen pounds four shillings per annum; and that each of the said pilots shall, while he continues to act as a pilot, pay to the said Trinity House the sum of eleven shillings per turn as heretofore, from the first day of January in each year, until the sums contributed in the same year amount to an aggregate sum equal to the product of thirteen pounds four shillings multiplied by the number of pilots licensed as above who are then surviving and unsuperannuated, and that when such aggregate sum is made up no further contributions shall be required from the said pilots until after the thirty-first day of December in the same year; and if the said contributions during any one year fall short of the said aggregate sum, the said pilots then surviving and unsuperannuated shall, at such time and in such manner as the Trinity House may direct, make good such deficiency by payment of an additional contribution per man, to be calculated pro rata upon the number of turns which each may have carried during the said year; and any such pilot failing to pay such additional contribution shall, in default of such payment, become liable to immediate removal from active service and superannuation upon such proportion of the full pension payable to such pilot as the Trinity House may see fit.

11. *Pilotage authority may grant special sea licenses.*—Any pilotage authority may, if authorized in that behalf by Order in Council, grant special licenses qualifying the persons to whom they are granted to act as pilots for any part of the sea or channels beyond the limits of any pilotage authority, so however that no pilot so licensed be entitled to supersede an unlicensed pilot outside the limits of the authority by which he is licensed.

## CHAIN CABLES.

12. *Fees and expenses in relation to testing of chain cables and anchors by Trinity House to be paid to and charged on mercantile marine fund.*—In the event of a license for the testing of chain cables and anchors being granted to the Trinity House under the Chain Cable and Anchor Act 1871 all fees and other sums received by the Trinity House in respect of such testing shall be carried to the mercantile marine fund, and all expenses incurred by the Trinity House in respect of such testing shall be chargeable on the mercantile marine fund.

## GENERAL.

13. *Duties of surveyors.*—All duties in relation to the survey and measurement of ships under this Act or the Acts amended hereby shall be performed by the surveyors appointed under the fourth part of the Merchant Shipping Act 1854, in accordance with such regulations as may be from time to time made by the Board of Trade.

14. *Fees and salaries of surveyors and emigration officers.*—All fees payable in respect of the survey or measurement of ships under this Act or the Acts amended hereby, or in respect of any services performed by any person employed under the authority of the Passengers Act 1855, shall be paid to the superintendent of a mercantile marine office at such times and in such manner as the Board of Trade may from time to time direct, and shall be carried to the mercantile marine fund; and the salaries of surveyors, and other expenses connected with the survey and measurement of ships under this Act or the Acts amended hereby, and also so much of the salaries and expenses of persons employed under the authority of the Passengers Act 1855 as has heretofore been paid by fees, shall be paid out of the mercantile marine fund.

15. *Penalty on surveyor, &c. receiving gratuity, &c. for duties performed under this Act.*—If any surveyor, or any person employed under the authority of the Passengers Act 1855, demands or receives directly or indirectly, otherwise than by the direction of the Board of Trade, any fee, remuneration, or gratuity whatever in respect of any of the duties performed by him under this Act or the Acts amended hereby, he shall for every such offence incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

16. *Owner or agent of home trade ships may enter into time agreements which need not expire half-yearly.*—The owner of home trade ships or his agent may enter into time agreements, in forms to be sanctioned by the Board of Trade, with individual seamen to serve in any one or more ships belonging to him, which agreements need not expire on either the thirtieth day

of June or the thirty-first day of December, anything in the Merchant Shipping Act to the contrary notwithstanding: Provided always that a duplicate of each agreement entered into under the provisions of the section be forwarded to the Registrar-General of Shipping within forty-eight hours after it has been entered into.

17. *Her Majesty may accept offers of persons recommended by the Admiralty to serve as officers of the Royal Naval Reserve.*—It shall be lawful for Her Majesty to accept from time to time the offers of any person whom the Lord High Admiral or the Commissioners for executing his office may recommend, to serve as officers of reserve in the Royal Navy, upon such terms and conditions as to Her Majesty may from time to time seem fit, and the "Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve Act 1863" shall be read and construed as if this clause formed part of the said Act.

#### TORRES STRAITS.

Mr. CHAPMAN, master of the *Peveril*, cutter, reports the existence of a reef in the centre of Flinders' Passage, between Wednesday and Horn Islands. This reef, which he names "Chapman Reef," lies east and west, and is dry at low water. It is about 500 yards long and 40 broad, terminating at each end in sharp points, which are steep close to. The bearings of its extremities are as follow, viz.:—

*Eastern End*—South-east point of Wednesday Island, N.E. by E.; north-east point of Horn Island, S.E. by S.

*Western End*—West point of Wednesday Island, N.N.W.; Double Hill Horn Island, S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.

Mr. Chapman also reports having seen a small sunken reef, bearing S. by E., a short mile from East Strait Island. This is probably the reef discovered by Captain Edwards, in the *Melanite*, and by him placed somewhat to the south-westward of this position.

## RULES OF THE VICTORIAN ENGINEER CORPS.

1. The senior officer present at any meeting of the corps shall take the chair.
2. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and shall do so on receiving a requisition in writing, signed by at least fifteen members of the corps; provided also that the business for which such meeting is called be of a purely non-military character.
3. A special meeting of the corps shall not be held to have been duly convened, unless notice thereof shall have been given at parade or drill, and circular issued or posted to every member at least one day previously, stating the business for which the meeting is called; and no other business shall be entertained except that notified on the circular.
4. Business shall not be transacted at any meeting of the corps unless twenty-five members be present, and if twenty-five members be not present within a quarter of an hour from the time fixed for the meeting, it shall lapse or may be adjourned, at the discretion of the chairman.
5. All general meetings of the corps shall be notified previously by insertion in the card for the month; the first business thereof shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding general meeting for confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. The minutes, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman.
6. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded by at least ten members.
7. The name, address, and occupation of any person desiring to join the corps shall be posted for one week in the orderly room, and in the drill shed at depot. Any member objecting to a candidate shall communicate the same privately to the commanding officer, who may decide on the validity of such objection, or refer the matter to the corps for ballot, when one black ball in four shall exclude.
8. No person below the age of eighteen years and under five feet seven inches in height is to be enrolled without special authority.
9. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing; and any damage done thereto, except on duty, shall be made good by the person holding the same, or in default he may be fined by the officer commanding the cost of repairing such damage.
10. Any member appearing at a parade or drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty, from neglect, may be fined by the officer in charge a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.
11. Every member must produce his arms and accoutrements for inspection by the officer commanding, or other officer appointed for that purpose, whenever required, and must also return such arms and accoutrements to the officer commanding whenever directed by him so to do, or deposit the same in the orderly room or depot, under a penalty in either case of not more than Five shillings.
12. Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must, in conformity with regulation 89, Vol. Statute, forward arms, accoutrements, uniforms, or other property of the corps in his possession to the officer in command or to the person appointed by him to receive the same, or in default thereof he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. Any member changing his permanent address shall give notice thereof in writing to the commanding officer within seven days; failing to do so, he shall be fined the sum of Two shillings and sixpence.

14. Any member who shall leave his permanent residence for a period of more than thirty days without giving notice in writing to the commanding officer, and without previously depositing his arms, uniform, and accoutrements with the instructor at the depot, shall be fined Ten shillings.

15. A list of all fines imposed under the regulations and under these rules shall be posted in the orderly room on the first day of the following month, and must be paid during that month to the N. C. O. authorized by the commanding officer to receive the same.

16. Any member who may be fined shall be informed thereof at the earliest opportunity.

17. An account of all fines shall be posted in a book, and signed by the officer commanding; the said book shall be open to inspection in the orderly room.

18. If a member at any time desire to quit the corps under the provisions of the Volunteer Statute, or, being non-effective (except from illness or leave of absence), he shall be required to pay all expenses incurred by the corp on his behalf for the year then current; provided always that no such fine shall exceed £3, and that a portion or the whole may, at the discretion of the officer commanding, be remitted.

19. No alteration or addition whatsoever shall be made to these rules unless at a meeting of the corps convened for that purpose.

The foregoing nineteen rules were made at a special meeting of the Victorian Engineer Corps, duly convened for that purpose, and held in the orderly room on Wednesday the sixth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two.
