## TONNAGE OF AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN MERCHANT SHIPS.

THE accompanying Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, extending to Austro-Hungarian vessels the advantages held out by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* to ships of foreign countries adopting the rules for the measurement of tonnage which obtain in the British possessions, is published for general information.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, it is enacted that "whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships." And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, have been adopted by His Imperial and Royal Majesty the Emperor King of Austro-Hungary, and are in force in the Austro-Hungarian dominions:

Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the ships of Austro-Hungary, the certificates of Austro-Hungarian nationality and registry of which are dated on or after the first day of September, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Austro-Hungarian nationality and registry.

### SORRENTO CHANNEL.

PILOTS, masters of vessels, and others are hereby informed that the Sorrento Channel, which extends four (4) miles from Point King to the White Cliff, has been buoyed to afford facilities for vessels navigating in that locality.

The buoys are placed as follows:—

1. A white buoy (800-gallon cask), a cable and a half to the eastward of Point King, in 9 feet at low water, and marking the edge of the bank off the point.

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2. A black buoy (800-gallon cask), about half a mile to the S.E. of the preceding buoy, and midway between it and the end of the Sorrento Jetty. This buoy is in 11 feet at low water and marks the westernmost edge of a bank which fronts the coast from Point King to the White Cliff.

3. A white buoy, nearly a mile E. by S. of the end of the Sorrento Jetty, lying in 16 feet at low water and marking the northern edge of the bank off the Sisters.

4. A black buoy, a mile and a half S.E. by E. from the preceding buoy, and nearly midway between the White Cliff and the easternmost of the Two Sisters, is laid in 16 feet at low water, and marks the southernmost edge of the bank extending from Point King to the White Cliff.

The channel from Point King to Sorrento is three-quarters (¾) of a mile long, patchy and very narrow, and only navigable by vessels drawing not more than 9 feet of water. The soundings are very irregular, varying from 11 feet to 16 feet, and numerous knolls exist over which there is only 9 feet 6 inches of water.

The channel from the White Cliff to Sorrento is a little over three (3) miles in length, and is from a cable's length and a half to half a mile in width, with from four to eight fathoms of water.

Vessels bound to Sorrento from Queenscliffe or Portsea, and using the western entrance, should not approach the shore between the Quarantine Station and Point King nearer than two (2) cables' lengths. The hospital buildings at the Quarantine Station kept open of Portsea Point lead clear of shallow water to Point King. After rounding the white buoy off Point King steer for the mooring buoy and anchor in thirteen (13) feet water off the end of the jetty. The mooring buoy is laid in 16 feet water about 2½ cables from the end of the jetty. Vessels drawing not more than 12 feet water can go alongside the end of the jetty.

In approaching Sorrento Channel from the eastward, vessels, after rounding No. 15 buoy in the South Channel should steer for the White Cliff until the easternmost black buoy in Sorrento Channel bears west, when steer to pass to the southward of it, giving the buoy a berth of half a cable's length. After passing this buoy steer N.W. by W. for the white buoy off the Two Sisters; pass to the northward of it, giving it also a berth of half a cable's length, when steer W. by N. for Sorrento Jetty, and anchor two (2) cables to the eastward of it, in four fathoms of water.

### HARBOR LIGHT, ULLADULLA.

On and after the night of Tuesday the 10th of December 1872, a green fixed light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse on the Pier at Ulladulla; this light will be 43 feet above high-water mark and be visible between the bearings of S.W. by W. and W. by N. at a distance of from 7 to 9 miles.

Vessels bound to Ulladulla from the northward will site the green light in clear weather on a south-westerly bearing before losing sight of the Cape St. George Light; vessels from the southward will have to keep an offing till the light is opened

out clear of the land. To enter the port, steer about W.S.W. for the green light, keeping a good look out to avoid the Sullivan Reef, which generally breaks, and should be passed two cables distant on the port hand.

**DISTRICTS WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

THE BOROUGH OF WOOD'S POINT and  
THE JAMIESON SUBDIVISION OF THE HOWQUA UNITED ROAD DISTRICT

to be respectively districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 285), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such Proclamation; and upon any such Proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

**EXTENSION OF CLOSE SEASON FOR QUAIL.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and Baron BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the 31st year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to Protect Game* (31 Vict. No. 311), it is amongst other things enacted, that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned or included in the second schedule thereof shall be from and after the first day of August until the thirtieth day of November in each year, or such other period as the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* from time to time direct: And it is also enacted that if any person shall wilfully kill or destroy any native game within the period thereinbefore in the second section mentioned, or shall use any instrument whatever, not or any other means, within the period aforesaid for the purpose of destroying any native game, such person shall upon conviction forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding the sum of Two pounds, in addition to the sum of Five shillings for each bird or other animal so destroyed: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June 1868, all species of quail were named as additions to the birds mentioned in the second schedule to the said Act, and the provisions of the said Act were extended to the twentieth day of December in each year as regards all the birds and other animals mentioned or included in the said second schedule to the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to alter the period during which the said provisions are applicable to quail: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the dates specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Proclamation of the twenty-ninth day of June 1868, so far as the close season for Quail is concerned, and do direct that the period of the year during which the provisions of the said Act shall be in operation as regards ALL SPECIES OF QUAIL shall be as follows:—From the first day of August in every year until the thirty-first day of January in the year following, both days inclusively.

WHEREAS by An Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said Colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he shall, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas an Order, bearing even date herewith, has been by me made with the advice of the Executive Council, defining the places and times as hereinafter set forth at which Circuit Courts shall be holden in Victoria during the year 1873: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said Order defining and appointing the places and times at which the several Circuit Courts of Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three to be as follow, that is to say:—

## RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of December 1872.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or the said Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Mornington, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Mornington into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

**THE NORTH RIDING.**—Bounded by a line commencing at a point on Port Phillip Bay in continuation of the north boundary of allotments 1 and 4 of section VI. parish of Frankston; thence to and along said boundaries to the east boundary of said parish; southward and westward around the boundaries of said parish, and to allotment 19 parish of Moorooduc; southward, westward, and northward by the southward boundaries of allotments 19, 17, and 3 of same parish and the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

**THE EAST RIDING.**—Bounded by a line commencing at the north-west corner of the parish of Tyabb; eastward and southward around the boundaries of the parish, and to the south boundary of allotment 41 B parish of Bittern; by the south boundary of said allotment and to and around allotment 55 B same parish to the south boundary of parish of Moorooduc; westward by this boundary to the branch road on eastward side of Atkin's pre-emptive section; north-eastward by that road to the south boundary of parish of Frankton; eastward and northward around boundary of said parish to commencing point.

**THE WEST RIDING.**—Bounded by a line commencing on the south boundary of parish of Moorooduc at the south-east corner of Atkin's pre-emptive section westward to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; northward to the north corner of allotment 4, parish aforesaid; south-eastward by the southward boundary of allotments 3, 17, and 19 of same parish southward by the road to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
